Public Forum:

There were five members of the public in attendance. A brief summary of the issues discussed is below. Full details can be found on the Colsterworth and District Parish Council website detailed above.

Cllr C Hainsworth (Chair) welcomed everyone to the meeting and acknowledged the five persons present at the Public Forum.

The first member of the public said they were there to speak in objection about the proposed building development of the paddock behind 22 Bourne Road, Colsterworth and would like it to remain as a green space. Cllr C Hainsworth said this was an agenda item for later in the meeting at agenda item 2024.89.2 and a response had been drafted for Cllrs to consider.

A short discussion took place on the recent letters received by some residents from Hereward Homes and the timing of the SKDC planning notification signs.

The second member of the public to speak also spoke in objection to the same planning application listing but not limited to the following reasons: -

- They would be impacted by loss of privacy.
- The access road is not wide enough for vehicles to pass.
- The developer needs to provide a footpath because pedestrians will be sharing the access road with construction vehicles.
- The drive space from number 18 Bourne Road has been used as the highways entrance for vision splay for access.
- The drive of 18 Bourne Road will be obstructed.
- The refuse collection area for 20 refuse bins is too close to the boundary of 18 Bourne Road.

Cllr C Hainsworth extended the Public Forum until 7.48pm to allow the members of the public to speak. Full details of the public forum can be found on the website above.

CHAIR'S REMARKS:

Cllr C Hainsworth (Chair) had no remarks but thanked everyone for attending on such a wet evening.

Lincolnshire County Council and South Kesteven District Councillors Report.

SKDC Cllr D Bellamy Reported: -

- 1. The Lawful Development Certificate for the proposed North Witham Children's Home did not pass. Work has been completed on the car park and they expect there will be another application submitted.
- 2. They had spoken to the residents on Honey Pot Lane to address their concerns on the S24/1425 planning application for the construction of two nearby dwellings.
- 3. They acknowledged the proposed development behind 18 & 22 Bourne Road, Colsterworth had already been discussed at the Public Forum.

- 4. The Anaerobic Digester Plant application for Sewstern would now be going to SKDC Planning Committee in December 2024.
- 5. The National Planning Policy Framework (NPPF) consultation had finished but they do not expect the numbers to change.

SKDC Cllr B Green sent their apologies.

LCC CIIr C Vernon was not present for the meeting.

War Memorial Project update (S Grant – Clerk)

War Memorial Project update. Report circulated (S Grant – Clerk)

The Clerk gave a brief update on the completion of the War Memorial Restoration and the FCC Communities Grant reclaim process now that the final invoice had been received.

- 2. It was resolved for the Parish Council as Licensee to accept the compliance and conditions set by Lincolnshire County Council for the consent for the installing of a community asset, a Lectern Style Information Board on the War Memorial Gardens, High Street, Colsterworth.
- 3. It was resolved to use the SK 2200 Grant received of up to £1,700 to purchase a Lectern Frame interpretation panel.

 Cllrs C Rowland and C Russell volunteered to accompany the Clerk on the inspections Allotment Inspections. Date to be arranged.

Nature Trail

The recent book sale held at the White Lion Pub made £110 towards the shortfall £84.28 to purchase a bench to replace the one known as 'Jane's' bench on the Nature Trail at a cost of £764.28 excl VAT. £680 had already been raised made up from a £300 anonymous donation, £130 raised from the Quiz night and the £250 Rotary Club Grant received in 2023. The monies over will be held in the Nature Trail Parish Council ledger.

Colsterworth WI meeting, September 17th 2024

The weather gods continued to smile their approval on the new venue. For the second month in succession, the ladies of Colsterworth WI gathered at the Village Hall in bright sunshine and pleasantly warm temperatures. The furniture Oompa -Loompas completed their work in double quick time, the room was arranged, the competition items displayed and the tea things laid out temptingly.

At 2 o'clock Vanessa, our President, rang the bell and opened the meeting. As well as the 23 members present, she also welcomed Sue Sang, one of our Federation Trustees who had come for a visit. Birthday greetings and cards were presented to Rosemary Haw, Peggy Taylor and Audrey Wheatley who has recently celebrated a rather special birthday.

Vanessa the introduced our quest speaker, Magician Mr Paul Vickers. Paul opened his set by explaining that magic never changes. The only thing that has changed is the setting. With the demise of Variety, circus and travelling shows Magic is now more often performed as Street Theatre, at corporate events or private celebrations. As well as being a Magician, Paul was clearly a natural performer with a definite 'gift of the gab'! He was never still. Wandering up and down the hall with an uninterrupted flow of small talk, he kept his audience entertained with tricks and illusions. Paul presented as a showman after the style of Paul Daniels, mixed with the self-effacing manner of Tommy Cooper. He referenced

both of these famous Magicians during his act and is obviously a fan of each.

He said the success of most tricks is based on getting into the minds of the audience, reading the faces and body language of his chosen volunteers. He illustrated this by asking four different ladies to pick a stone out of a bag. Explaining that there were three white stones and one black stone. He correctly chose the picker of the black stone and said he was able to do this because as he was moving and chatting, he was watching the faces of his volunteers very carefully and could tell which member had the black stone. Paul performed tricks with playing cards, dice, balloons and a cup and ball which he said was the oldest magic trick in the book with many different variations. After each trick, he asked if members wanted to know how it worked. He then repeated the trick making it more intricate and complicated each time which only led to more confusion! After a very entertaining set, Paul was thanked by Vanessa - who had been chosen as a volunteer more times than anybody else!

Members were ready for a cup of tea and some of the delicious cakes, biscuits and fruit served by hostesses, Sandra Quinsee, Sue Taylor and Margaret Samways. During the tea interval the competitions were viewed. Trustee Sue Sang judged the 'Item of the Month' competition and members voted as ever on the 'Flower of the Month competition' by placing a coin next to their favourite. The coins are then collected up and added to the Pennies for Friendship charity tin.


Vanessa thanked members for attending, wished a good afternoon to everyone and closed the meeting at 3.50pm.


