Council business – Colsterworth and District Parish Council (lincolnshire.gov.uk)

Public Forum:

There were no persons present at the Public Forum.

CHAIR'S REMARKS:

Cllr C Hainsworth (Chair) welcomed everyone back after the summer break.

Lincolnshire County Council and South Kesteven District Councillors Report.

SKDC Clirs B Green report: -

- 1. <u>SKDC</u> They were delighted to say that the kerb side battery collection is set to operate from Monday 16th September, householders will provide their own see-through bag on top of any regular bin day, whether it's recycling or black bin week.
- 2. Update on St Mary's Church, North Witham They recently held an uplifting meeting with a good level of interest showing there is a strong willing community to support the Church. They suggested that the Parish Council make an application to the SKUK Prosperity Fund for funds for a temporary roof. The Clerk agreed to investigate this.

Cllr D Bellamy report: -

- 1. A Planning Application for a children's home at North Witham is expected to be received.
- 2. Another Planning Application for 2 dwellings on Twyford Farm, Honey Pot Lane had been received that day reference SK1425.
- 3. A planning Application for the land rear of 14 22 Bourne Road, Colsterworth is expected to be received by SKSC Planning Department..
- The SKDC Local Plan Review is ongoing, and the new government have set a target of building 1.5 million dwellings during this parliament or the next five years. To facilitate this, they are currently consulting local planning authorities (SKDC) on changes to the National Planning Policy Framework (NPPF). Part of this consultation has required most but not all councils to be allocated new build targets and SKDCs target has risen from 690 units to 912 per annum which is about 20% increase. The downside of this is that the local plan review consultation on the new allocations would not fulfil this new target. So should these new targets and NPPF changes be adopted by the government this will require SKDC to consult on further allocations to make up the 20% shortfall. The original call for sites which the proposed allocations came from did bring forward enough land to make up the difference, but these extra sites would have to go out to consultation. This would also require the local plan review timetable to be extended for which it is anticipated the government would make allowances.
- 5. The proposed Anaerobic Digester Plant application in Gunby will be going to the Planning Committee in October 2024.

The Clerk requested that Highway's review Water Lane & Hall Lane, Stainby under the Parish Grass Cutting Agreement due to the damaged grass verges not being re-instated.

War Memorial Project update (S Grant – Clerk)
Restoration work on the War Memorial and is coming to the final stages.

It was resolved to hold a joint invitation only official opening ceremony of the War Memorial Restoration with Colsterworth Festival of Remembrance at the War Memorial followed by refreshments at St John The Baptist Church, where the Restoration and Remembrance exhibition will be on display. It was resolved to investigate LCC Highways permissions and costs for a request for an alternative lectern style Commemorative board sited on the War Memorial gardens. Including revised content, artwork and additional quotes already obtained and approval from SKDC that this will meet the terms of the SK2200 grant already secured.

Nature Trail

The Volunteers enjoyed the annual Summer BBQ gathering on Saturday 10th August kindly hosted by volunteers Pat and Jackie in their garden.

Work continues to clear the tree left following the tree felling kindly undertaken by KWR at no cost to the Parish Council. It was agreed for the Parish Council to make up the shortfall of up to £84.28 to purchase a bench to replace the one known as 'Jane's' bench on the Nature Trail at a cost of £764.28 excl VAT. £680 has to date been raised made up from a £300 anonymous donation, £130 raised from the Quiz night and the £250 Rotary Club Grant received in 2023. A book sale is to be held at the White Lion Pub to reduce the shortfall required.

Colsterworth War Memorial Restoration Project

The Restoration was completed on 12th September 2024

The newly restored Colsterworth War Memorial is now complete and open. There will be an official launch on 1st November 2024 at the War Memorial on the High Street, Colsterworth.

Colsterworth and District Parish Council and Colsterworth Festival of Remembrance (CFoR) will be celebrating the opening of restored Colsterworth War Memorial followed by a launch party attended by Cllr Caroline Hainsworth, Chairperson of Colsterworth and District Parish Council, Captain David Heath French, Chairperson of Colsterworth Festival of Remembrance and several other guests at the Colsterworth War Memorial, High Street, Colsterworth on Friday 1st November 2024.

The restoration project was funded by a £29,026.48 grant from FCC Communities Foundation.

Cllr Caroline Hainsworth (Chair to Colsterworth and District Parish Council) is delighted that the project is now finished and open to the public.

She says: "The restoration project safeguards the War Memorial and preserves its historical significance for future generations. We are extremely grateful to FCC Communities Foundation for providing funding as we would not have been able to go ahead without its support."

the WI INSPIRING WOMEN

A new month, a new venue. The ladies of the Colsterworth WI are nothing if not adaptable. The very first meeting convened way back in April 1917 was held at the Institute, locally known as the Men's Institute. Sometime later a move was made to the Village Hall on School Lane. Next came the new Village Hall. A long stay there. In 1984, the Village Hall was rebuilt and renamed the Isaac Newton Hall. We moved to the Sports and Social Club in January 2012 but are now back at the Village Hall, known locally as Colsterworth Village Hall even though it is in Woolsthorpe!

On a bright, sunny August afternoon we settled into our new surroundings. The President, Mrs Vanessa Howley rang the bell at 2pm to open proceedings. After a brief welcome and a mention of the new arrangements, birthday greetings and a card were offered to Dee Hodge. Vanessa then introduced our speaker, Mrs Rosemary Pike, whom we had already seen setting up a splendid display illustrating her talk 'The Magic of Glass'. An expert in her field, Rosemary spoke with the passion and knowledge of a true enthusiast. It is thought, she explained, that when glass was first made in ancient times it was an accidental invention. Pliny wrote about glass at the time of the eruption of Vesuvius in 79AD. A crew of stranded sailors took shelter and made a fire to keep themselves warm. They surrounded the fire with some rocks they were carrying as cargo. To their amazement the rocks melted and ran into pools of opaque liquid which when cool, solidified. Rosemary explained that the rocks could have been lumps of obsidian which is thrown up in a volcanic eruption and is known as 'Nature's Glass'. She passed round some examples of this beautiful black rock saying it was as popular as jet in Victorian mourning jewellery.

Rosemary showed photographs of beautiful pieces of ancient jewellery describing how each was coloured: cobalt makes blue glass, silver makes yellow, copper makes green and gold is needed for red colouring which explains why glassware such as Cranberry glass is so prized. We saw an image of Tutankhamun's headrest discovered when his tomb was excavated in 1924 and learned that it was not made of stone but of glass. Glass making spread to Europe and by medieval times France was an important centre. Venice had many small manufactories but the inhabitants were so afraid of fire that a law was passed requiring all glass makers to move to nearby island of Murano, thus beginning the tradition of skilled glass making associated with that name which endures to this day.

In England much of the medieval glass so expertly created was destroyed when Cromwell's armies sacked cathedrals and churches and later when Henry V111 dissolved the monasteries. Rosemary told the story of Tiffany glass. Set up in New York by Louis Tiffany in 1878, Tiffany Studios quickly gained a reputation for stunning examples of glass panels using the natural world as their inspiration. In 1900, Tiffany glass was on show at the Paris Exhibition. It was a huge hit and became extremely popular. The Tiffany lamp in particular caught the public's imagination and became a best seller- if you could afford it! Original Tiffany lamps remain highly sought after today, an example sold a few years ago for \$268,000. Sadly, after the 1st World War tastes changed and Tiffany Studios went bankrupt. An enterprising young English employee called Joseph Briggs wisely bought three crates of stock and sent them back to England, where they can be seen today on display at the Howarth Gallery in Accrington, Briggs' hometown.

Rosemary concluded her fascinating and knowledgeable talk by showing us pieces of her own work. She undertakes commissions and has produced superb

door panels, windows and a set of overaltar panels for South Wigston Parish Church. A true artist, whose love and enjoyment of her graft was clear to behold and generously shared. Rosemary was thanked by June Jessop and applauded by all.

After a superb tea of various cakes, fruit and biscuits provided by hostesses Liz Clark, Rachel Popham and Heather Platts-Kilburn we resumed our places for the second half of the meeting. Helen Scorror bought along the new Dot Williams Trophy for us all to admire. A most beautiful light oak tazza bowl engraved with the words 'The Dot Williams Trophy'. It was passed around and all agreed it looked special and felt smooth and mellow. A fitting tribute to our much missed Dot. Vanessa asked members to pass on, by email, any comments or suggestions about the new venue. She reminded members to peruse the noticeboard for details of the many upcoming outings, courses, workshops, lunches and other activities that are organised by our very busy South Lincs Federation. One such workshop to be held on November 16th will be led by our very own and very talented Sandra Quinsee on creating your own Christmas cards. Our next meeting is on October 15th - the Speaker is Horace Liberty, "Lincoln Then and Now" with Audience Participation, the competition - Old Colsterworth.

After a highly successful first meeting in our new venue, Vanessa bid us 'Good afternoon' and closed the meeting at 3:50pm.

Dot Williams 1936-2024

The August meeting of Colsterworth WI was the first meeting since the news reached us that our dear Dot had died. Dorothy Grace Williams died in the County Hospital Lincoln on August 15th, aged 88.

Dot was an Institution at Colsterworth WI, but she was much more than that. From the time she and her husband Bev along with their daughter, Dee, moved to the village in 1977 she was a pivotal part of the community. Sociable, interested in people and a born organiser, she was involved in so many aspects of village affairs during her long and active life.



Dot worked at the Co-op on the High Street. In her spare hours she was a member of the Parish Council, she and her husband ran the weekly Red Cross Tea Club at Newton Court on Back Lane, they were also keen members of the Bowls Club as well as being lifelong supporters of the Royal National Lifeboats Institute. Dot had many hobbies and interests, which

included her two great passions the WI and Handbells. A keen crafter, she was a skilled bobbin lace maker and enjoyed stitching samplers. She was no stranger to fancy dress. Always ready to entertain, one year for a village gala she posed as a Greek goddess on the WI float, another time with her Co-op colleagues, on a milk float-turned hen coop, dressed as a chicken & of course the unforgettable abseiling down the tower of St John the Baptist church, dressed as a Victorian lady. She was our Village Correspondent for the Grantham Journal for many years. This gave her the ideal platform to exercise one of her great loves, that of writing. Dot was an extremely talented writer with an instinctive way with words. She had the gift of bringing her readers into her tales effortlessly capturing the moment with humour and wit. Whilst reading her pieces be they short stories, sketches, poems or copy for the In Touch, one could imagine the twinkle in her eye as she wrote. Dot was a member of Colsterworth WI for over 40 years (she joined to get to know people) and secretary for most of them, only retiring when ill health necessitated a move to Maple Leaf Care Home, Grantham.

She was familiar with every rule and regulation, every protocol and procedure in the WI manual and ensured each meeting was properly conducted. She always wrote the minutes up in her beautiful long hand script, no computer generated writing for Dot! Dot kept up her links with the Parish Council, it was she who attended the annual Village Meetings on behalf of the WI, thus raising the profile of the organisation. She loved being part of the WI and was honoured to be invited to to a Buckingham Palace Garden Party, for a milestone WI anniversary. Dot enjoyed quizzes, both compiling and answering the questions. She was a fiercely competitive member of the onetime Scrabble team. Her annual chocolate tombola was legendary, so much easier to run the stall in the church during the winter than at the village fete on a hot summer's afternoon! At the church she also enjoyed supervising the decoration of the WI Christmas tree and ensuring its position in a prominent place. Dot loved a raffle. So much so that at Easter she was instrumental in getting one organised at Maple Leaf Care Home, with the staff generously donating the proceeds to the Colsterworth WI. Dot found fun, laughter and enjoyment in so many things.

Her presence is much missed but her legacy lives on. A lively and vibrant Colsterworth WI of which Dot was proud to play such an active part for so long.

On Friday 01 November 2024 at 15:30hrs there will be a small private gathering at the Colsterworth War Memorial for some of the organisations and individuals who supported the Colsterworth War Memorial Restoration Project. Captain David Heath-French will lead a short acknowledgement of the restoration project. This will be followed by light refreshment in St John the Baptist Church provided by Peter Wheatley the Church Warden. Guest spaces are limited for the Ceremony, but the Parish Council and Colsterworth Festival of Remembrance wish to thank all those involved in the restoration project.

In 2023, due to the support from the Colsterworth and District Parish Council to restore the Memorial, the substantial work required was finally approved thanks to the collaboration with FCC Communities Foundation who provided a significant grant for the Project. The partnership between the Parish Council and the Colsterworth Festival of Remembrance (CFoR) demonstrated the community's collective support and the fundraising efforts (including the Co-Op Local Community Fund nomination for 2024) embracing the vision to safeguard the Memorial and preserve its historical significance for future generations. The restoration was completed in September 2024.


