## Editorial

Festive felicitations to all.... so, it's been a number of years since I've had a good rant and I feel that now is the time so, rant mode on

The following is unashamedly political, using the dictionary definition of the word which is bringing about change using words, not party political, as what follows would apply no matter what flavour administration has it's nose in the trough in Downing Street. The cut to state pensioner's winter fuel allowance is what has brought this about. The government say that they have targeted the poorest pensioners by restricting it to those in receipt of the guarantee element of the ill conceived Pension Credit. But if you look a little closer, these people are not the poorest pensioners. For example, single pensioner A has worked all their life and has enough contributions to claim the full new state pension of £221.20 per week. On the subject of poor judgement, was appointing someone, who, on a combined household income in excess of £250,000 then says, and I quote "What makes me wince is when I look at my bank statement and I find that the money coming in is increasingly short of the money going out" really the best person to be in charge of the nation's finances?
