Council business – Colsterworth and District Parish Council (lincolnshire.gov.uk)

Public Forum:

Below is a summary of the Public Forum, full details can be found on the Parish Council website under council Business.

Cllr C Hainsworth (Chair) welcomed everyone to the meeting and acknowledged the sixteen fifteen persons present at the Public Forum. A spokesperson for those present stated that they were all present to voice their concerns and object to the SKDC Planning Application S25/0203. Change of use from Use Class C3 (Dwellinghouse) to Use Class C2 (flexible use under Part 3, Class V of GPDO) as a children's care home. 9A School Lane, Colsterworth, Lincolnshire, NG33 5NW and presented their concerns.

Cllr C Hainsworth thanked Cllr M Childs for preparing a draft response to the Planning Application discussed above and offered to prepare a revised version in the light of representations made for Cllrs to consider further.

The Public Forum was extended to 8pm to allow all those present to speak.

CHAIR'S REMARKS:

Cllr C Hainsworth (Chair) explained that the Clerk Sue Grant was absent due to illness and thanked those who had covered during her recent annual leave.

Lincolnshire County Council and South Kesteven District Councillors Report.

County/District Councillor Report. LCC Cllr C Vernon Reported: -

Is running for re-election and had nothing to report. LCC is observing purdah due to the mayoral elections.

SKDC Cllr D Bellamy Reported: -

- Cllr Bellamy shared concerns about the extension to the guarry and landfill at Stainby which appears to have permissions granted in 2018. He will make further enquiries and share with Cllrs.
- Cllr Bellamy also reported on the A1 and the litter clean up being carried out by SKDC. Also the current phase of closing some crossings are less contentious and a positive first stage in the safety of the A1. He was aware of support for the closure of the residents in North Witham of the closure of the Bull Hill Junction. There will be further consultations with Parish Councils directly affected. Cllr Hainsworth requested that Colsterworth and District PC is involved in these consultations due to the impact on all our villages due to diversions etc.

SKDC Cllr B Green sent their apologies. They had circulated a report to the Clerk and Cllr C Hainsworth earlier that day including the following updates: -

FixMyStreet Implementation 1. South Kesteven District Council (SKDC) is now present on FixMyStreet, enabling residents to report community issues such as fly-tipping, graffiti, and dead wildlife. Reports are automatically

directed to the appropriate local authority, ensuring timely responses.

Proposed Council Merger

The Independent-led SKDC administration has voted in favour of a merger with North Kesteven, South Holland, and Rutland. Given Rutland's substantially higher council tax rates, this merger could result in an additional £64 per year for Band D properties.

It was resolved to release the £1,000 earmarked for the Newton Project to support a Grant application for £1,000 to the Colsterworth Parochial Church Council towards the cost of the Clock repair at St John the Baptist Church.

SKDC Legal Team are making further investigations into the original transfer of the Colster Way land to the Parish Council.

Finance - Accounts for payment were approved by Council.

Environment & Amenities Working Group Report.

Lectern for War Memorial Restoration. War Memorial Information Board - Clirs Russell, Hainsworth and Bouvie and Margaret Winn looked at possible placement for lectern. Position discussed and agreed. Clirs M Childs and C Rowland to liaise with the Clerk to collect the lectern for installation.

Colsterworth WI Meeting March 18th 2025

A sparkling day. The early rime had lifted leaving that clear pellucid blue sky which sometimes follows a frost. The ladies of Colsterworth WI made their way to the village hall for their monthly meeting. Being March, it was the Annual General Meeting, a lot of discussion, a lot of decisions and hopefully, consensus about the year ahead. The WI Federation issues guidelines advising how an AGM should be conducted and our ever efficient and super-organised Helen had emailed these to all the committee members previously for their perusal. Well prepared and ready for action, acting president Rachel Popham rang the bell at 2pm to open the meeting, welcoming the 20 members attending as well as one visitor and Louise Reid, present in her official capacity as Federation trustee and advisor.

Liz has also said she will continue to organise the Bring & Buy stall which boosts our coffers twice a year. With Liz stepping down and Vanessa's departure the committee was down to seven. Therefore, we were very pleased to welcome to the team Rosemary Haw and Christine Whittle.

Time for our Federation Trustee to step in. Paper and pencils were handed round for members to nominate a candidate from the committee to be president. Louise checked the papers and found several names had been put forward. She then passed another paper to each nominee to request whether they were willing to stand. Thankfully, our lovely Helen Scorror circled yes, she was willing to stand. Members were very pleased as all appreciate the vast amount of work Helen puts into the WI and realised we were in a safe pair of hands. Another decision made!

A bit of light relief now after all the serious stuff. It was time for the presentation of the trophies for the year 2024-2025. First of all the lovely new wooden Tazza which was commissioned last year in memory of our dear Dot Williams to replace the silver rose bowl which, being full of years, was showing its age. This trophy is presented to the member who has, over the year, accrued the most points in the 'Item of the Month' competition. Rachel announced the winner, it was Rosemarie who was thrilled to be the first recipient of this beautiful piece of craftsmanship. The next award was the presentation of what is fondly known to members as 'Mrs Stafford's Ginger Jar' for the member who has gained the

COLSTERWORTH WAR

In 2023 a partnership between the Parish Council and the Colsterworth Festival of Remembrance (CFoR) demonstrated the community's collective support for the restoration of the War Memorial.

FCC Communities Foundation provided a significant grant for the project and the fundraising embraced the vision to safeguard the Memorial and preserve its historical significance for future generations.



THEY SHALL GROW NOT OLD, AS WE THAT ARE LEFT GROW OLD:

AGE SHALL NOT WEARY THEM, NOR THE YEARS CONDEMN.

AT THE GOING DOWN OF THE SUN AND IN THE MORNING,

WE WILL REMEMBER THEM.

The Memorial is made up of a twenty feet (six metres) cross executed in Clipsham stone. The designer/architect of the Memorial is unknown.







1919 Memorial was erected

1949 War Memorial was refurbished, and the concrete posts and chain were installed

1984 Designated a grade II listed structure

2009 Concerns over the on-going structural stability of the Memorial

2010 Some restoration work was carried out

2019 Further accelerated deterioration of the stone at the base of the Memorial

2020 Due to the Covid Pandemic and lack of funding the project was delayed

2023 Funding was secured for the work and the project reinstated

2024 Restoration completed 12th September 2024



There are thirty four names on slate plaques gilded with inscriptions on the War Memorial; these names are representative of families still living in the Parish including the small hamlet of Woolsthorpe by Colsterworth, notable as the birthplace of Sir Isaac Newton.



MEMORIAL RESTORATION



In addition to the War Memorial there are other military memorials within the Parish Church of St John the Baptist further along the High

Street including a stained glass window dedicated to Captain Charles Bland (First World War). The Church is also the Custodian of the Rolls of Honour to those parishioners lost in WW1 and those who served and were lost in WW2 along with the Royal British Legion Standard. There are further Rolls of Honour to be found in three other villages in the Parish at North Witham, Gunby and Stainby.



Another connection close by and linked to the heritage of the War Memorial is Twyford Wood which was the site of the Second World War airfield, RAF North Witham, where the allied US Forces played a crucial role in the D-Day operations.



Although their names are not recorded in the village, this Memorial also allows us to remember those servicemen and servicewomen who have been involved in the many wars and

conflicts that have taken place both before and since the two World Wars.

Other commemorative items have been donated and placed on the small green surrounding the Memorial by CFoR and members of the community including a metal bench, planters and lone Tommy Statue including a tribute to Animals at War.

The War Memorial gardens are maintained by Volunteers.



The serving and veteran members of the Armed Forces are evident in the Parish with a Military Plaque Wall at the local White Lion Public House on the High Street, Colsterworth acknowledging our military history and Heritage.
