

Public Forum:

Cllr C Hainsworth (Vice Chair) opened the meeting and greeted three public attendees. Two were present to observe, with one considering applying for Co-option as a Parish Councillor for Colsterworth.

The third member of the public reported that the applicant of the refused SKDC Planning Application S25/0568 had submitted their appeal which had been validated that day. Interested parties had the next five weeks to submit their comments. They asked for the Parish Council to join with South Witham Parish Council and the Community Group 'Block Biogas Plant at Gunby' and apply for Rule '6' Status adding that the community group offered their time and support to the Parish Council. Cllr D Bellamy said they fully supported this request.

Cllr C Hainsworth (Vice Chair) said that this planning application was an agenda item to be discussed later in the meeting.

The public forum was extended to 8.47pm to allow those present to speak.

CHAIR'S REMARKS:

Cllr C Hainsworth (Vice Chair) welcomed everyone to the meeting saying that they had prior notice that they would be the Chair of that meeting but had not prepared for presiding over Sue's (The Clerk) retirement plans. They thanked Cllr E O'Neill (Chair) who had summed up the Parish Councils gratitude to Sue after eight years of outstanding and devoted service to the Council and Community. The Parish Council appreciates Sue's agreement to continue in post to offer considerable experience in supporting the transition and most importantly facilitate Sue's retirement plans as they would hope for.

Lincolnshire County Council and South Kesteven District Councillors Report.

SKDC Councillor B Green Reported: -

- 1. A reminder that residents will receive a letter in the post regarding the change to the bin date collections. The changes were due to streamlining the routes, which had knock-on consequences.
- 2. Pylon Issue The Save South Kesteven Sign SKRAP's Petition to Stop the 400 kV Pylons had been kicked off raising the concerns and worries of communities. The petition can be found https://tinyurl.com/skrappylons. Cllr D Bellamy added that this would include 44 grid connectors and urged residents to sign the petition.
- 3. Local Government re-organisation rolls on and they will look to avoid unnecessary expenditure of money.
- 4. They thanked Clr C Russell for completing the repainting of the bus shelter.
- 5. Progress is underway for a new permissive footpath at North Witham, but the County Council will not cover signage or

style costs. Expenses include 3 signs at £100 each, 2 styles at £200 each, with labour costs pending. Costs could be raised by fund raising.

6. Thanks were passed to the Clerk for their support to the Parish Council.

SKDC Cllr D Bellamy reported.

- 7. Thanking the Clerk for their support to the Parish Council adding that it was a busy Parish Council with active Cllrs.
- 8. Planning application S25/0455 for 3 houses on the paddock off Bourne Road was still undecided.
- 9. Grid Extension There is a similar sub-station at Navenby with already 3 x solar farms lined up on 8K acres/ 12 sq miles.

LCC Cllr C Vernon reported sent their apologies.

Grass Cutting - The quotations for the grass cutting contract for 2026, 2027 & 2028 were discussed, and it was unanimously agreed to award the existing contractor M S C Ground Care Services the 3-year contract.

Internal Audit - It was unanimously agreed to re-appoint Lincolnshire Association of Local Councils LALC) internal auditing service for a two-year period 2025/2026 and 2026/2027 at the same fee of £300 each year.

Colsterworth W I Meeting, Tuesday
August 19th 2025

What's this? Tuesday afternoon at Colsterworth Village Hall, all prepared for the monthly WI meeting and there are emergency vehicles in the car park! A car and a motor bike to be precise. Is it a raid? Has a tea hostess been caught putting an extra tea bag in the tea pot? No, all becomes clear... it is the visit of those heroes, volunteers one and all, of that unsung emergency service LEBBS, otherwise known as Lincolnshire Emergency Blood Bikes Service, more of which later. Inside the hall, all set up and looking as inviting as ever, Helen opened the meeting at 2pm. Welcoming the 22 members present, she presented birthday cards and good wishes to Rosemary and Peggy.

With no more ado Helen then introduced the guest speakers, Neville Wright and Rob Hastings from LEBBS- as already mentioned- the Lincolnshire Emergency Blood Bikes Service. In a fascinating and inspirational talk, Neville explained that LEBBS was formed in 2012 by a group of enthusiastic volunteers. Blood Bike groups have been operating in other parts of the country for many years. The first being set up by Margaret Ryerson and her husband in Surrey in 1962. Members were shown archive BBC footage of one journey, beginning with Mrs Ryerson answering her telephone in the hallway of her house, following the journey of the motorcyclist- complete with white peaked cap helmet- to the delivery of much needed blood on what looked like a small, not very powerful bike. Bungee clips seemed be an essential piece of equipment for fixing the supplies to the back of the bike!

Things have moved on. There are now, nationally, 35 groups with 4810 volunteers. LEBBS has a committee of 12, 156 riders and drivers, 22 controllers plus a team of eight supporters. There is a pool of 11 motorbikes and 7 cars available for use. Drivers and riders do not use their own vehicles. LEBBS provides an out of hours courier service transporting not only urgently needed blood, but pathology specimens, medical notes, pharmaceutical products, medical equipment and donor breast milk. Operating mostly across Lincolnshire, the service can be called upon to travel anywhere. Neville explained that a sample taken in Edinburgh might need to be tested in London or Norwich. A chain of blood bikes would be co-ordinated to facilitate the journey. These are known as relay runs. LEBBS travelled 199,590 operational miles last year with 2391 daylight runs and 476 after dark runs. LEBBS works closely with the local air ambulance service. Every night, a motor bike courier leaves County Hospital in Lincoln with 'O negative' blood and plasma to be delivered to the air ambulance stationed at RAF Waddington. 'O negative' is the universal blood group which can be accepted by most people.

The LEBBS riders and drivers cover a huge area including Boston Pilgrim, Grantham, Lincoln County, Grimsby, Scunthorpe and Goole. The service is certainly one of the unsung heroes of the NHS, which acknowledges it couldn't work as effectively and efficiently without their support. LEBBS does not charge the NHS for the service it provides nor does it receive any government funding. It is 100% funded by donors and sponsors. Neville mentioned the sponsorship the service receives from organisations such as the Masons, Rotary Clubs and the National Lottery. He explained that the role of the eight supporters was raise funds through events such as appearances at local shopping centres, Bike Nights, the Lincolnshire Show, Open Days including East Kirkby and talks to groups such as WIs. The fee for the talk today was going directly to LEBBS. Neville ended his enthralling introduction to this vital, but largely unknown service by saying that anybody could become a volunteer rider or driver. People over the age of 25 with no more than 6 penalty points on their licence can apply. The over 25 bit covered every member present and nobody owned up to having more than 6 points on their licence but there didn't seem to be a rush to sign up. However, when Rob invited members to have their photo taken sitting on the bike outside, that was another matter!

After a lovely vote of thanks given by Gill it was time for tea. During the interval Rob and Neville judged the 'Item of the Month' competition, something red. Tea hostesses Rachel, Sandra (and Gillian standing In for Lynne) provided a range of delectable cakes, biscuits and fruit along with the usual and welcome cups of tea. Members judged the 'Flower of the Month' competition. A difficult job this month, being high summer the table was packed with lovely blooms from members' gardens.

Helen called us back together for the business section. She went quickly through the correspondence received. Details of most were on the noticeboard. The November Christmas Shopping trip to Ely Cathedral proved popular but the offer to raise funds for the WI by providing teas for Sleaford Rugby Club fell on very deaf ears. Most members saying their days of providing teas for the various

sports teams of family members were long over!

Helen than gave a brief report on the VJ Day lunch held on 15th August. This event was very well received. Members sat at two long, beautifully decorated tables and chose food from a vast array on offer. Music from the era played in the background. It was a relaxing and pleasant few hours, chatting to friends and learning a bit about their relatives who had served. A few members could remember the end of the war, the lasting memory seemed to be that of the endless dark.

Rosemarie gave a report on the 'Christmas in July' workshop that she, Lynne and Helen had attended at Cranwell Village Hall on Saturday, July 19th. A bit like the old "Show and Tell" days at school, Rosemarie held up the willow stars that she and Lynne had made and showed the fabric bauble they each created. Although Lynne was absent she sent in a note saying how enjoyable the day was. There were six crafts on offer so a great opportunity to learn something new. All attendees said they would go again but Rosemarie did comment that she wouldn't wear a lace top next she attempted willow weaving as she seemed to spend more time wearing the 7 ft whips.

The date of this year's Coffee Morning at the White Lion pub, courtesy of Bob and Phil, was given to members as Thursday, 30th October from 10am until 12 midday. Helen asked for suggestions for a charity. It was no surprise to learn members were unanimous in supporting the Blood Bikes charity. She then gave another date for the diary. The 108th Birthday lunch is to be held on Thursday, November 27th again at the White Lion pub.

The competition results were announced. The 'Item of the month' -something red (no bags of blood in evidence) was won by Pamela with a hand- made red bag with Rosemary in second place with a pretty red perfume bottle. The Flower of the Month competition was won by Rosemary with Liz C in second place. The raffle was called. After a lively session with much to listen to and learn, Helen announced our next meeting would be on Tuesday October 21st a flora demonstration by Jayne Hawksworth. She thanked members for attending and, wishing everyone a safe journey home, closed the meeting at 4pm.

Frederick Ingle Charity Update 2025

Frederick's legacy has helped residents of our Parish since 1914 and is still functioning today!

In September this year we supported the Colsterworth Scout Group towards a camping trip, the Methodist Chapel heating fund, and the Lincolnshire Emergency Blood Bikes Service.

Frederick grew up in Colsterworth. He died on 30th May 1912 aged 73 years, ending a life of architecture, science, and philanthropy. His grave is in Old Post Lane Cemetery.

In his Will some tenants were gifted their homes; he left money to cousins worldwide and donated to charities in London, Nottingham, Bourne, Grantham, and Stamford. For the people of Colsterworth Parish he left a sum of money to be invested. The Charities were set up by his executors in 1914 – originally in three parts, the Benevolent Charity, the Nursing Charity, and the Pension Fund. The first list of beneficiaries was taken from Frederick's own Christmas list of villagers he regularly supported.

To benefit from the Charity, you had to be Sick, Poor and a Resident of the Parish for five years. Originally, to apply for a grant, you had to go for an interview at Middlefield House, Frederick's family home in School Lane, then, if approved, go to the Doctor's house on Stamford Road to collect your payment!

In 2001, with the help of the Charity Commissioners, the three parts were united under one heading 'The Frederick Ingle Charity', with the number of Trustees reduced from 9 to 5. The administration of the Charity is overseen by the Parish Council and the Charity Commissioners. The Trustees meet twice a year to consider grants.

It is much more difficult nowadays to know who is deserving of personal grants, so we try to support other local charities and organisations, which any of our residents could benefit from. We always try to make our decisions based on the remit of the original charity constitution and we ask the question - 'would Frederick approve?'

In a lovely email of thanks, the Lincolnshire Emergency Blood Bikes Service Treasurer explains how our donation will be used:

"I have just opened my post and was delighted to receive your letter and generous donation on behalf of the Frederick Ingle Charity, as someone who did so much to save lives. I believe he would approve of our work.

To put your donation into context, I have just paid out for two new tyres for one of our bikes, which after VAT reclaim was roughly the amount of your donation. Those tyres will go on to do roughly 8000 miles so you can see how much help to NHS patients that will enable us to provide. Roughly speaking every pound donated to us goes on to save the NHS between £5 & £6, although I like to think of it as help provided to the sick and ill rather than a monetary value.

Once again many thanks."
