the WI INSPIRING WOMEN

Colsterworth WI Meeting, October 21st 2025

Colsterworth Village Hall looked and smelt like a flower market as the ladies of the WI made their way in for their October meeting. The stage front was resplendent with buckets of foliage and greenery, the floor was covered with flower-filled containers and on the display table there were several pumpkins of various shapes and sizes. The room was set up as ever with tables and chairs, Liz was in her usual place ready to greet members and visitors and the competition tables were prepared. A lot of entries for the 'Flower of the Month' competition, not so many for the 'Item of the Month' competition. This month, to tie in with the speaker's subject, the theme was 'A Buttonhole'

At 2pm Helen, our President, opened the meeting welcoming 24 members and 3 visitors (who by the end of the afternoon had all become members). After presenting Eileen Smith with a birthday card and good wishes, Helen straight away introduced this month's speaker: Jane Hawksworth. As many know, Jane is a busy local flower arranger who, among other things, organises Christmas wreath making workshops at North Witham Village Hall as well as their monthly lunches and breakfasts.

Jane's subject was 'An Autumn Floral Demonstration'. The members warmed to Jane immediately, her relaxed and smiley style of chatting as she demonstrated, made the skill of flower arranging look deceptively easy! She explained that she had decided to produce something fun and lighthearted. Jane had already scooped out a large pumpkin and filled it with florist's foam to which she had added plant food. As Jane worked, she spun the pumpkin round on her turntable ensuring members could view the display from all angles. Reminding the ladies of the florist's golden rule: always work in odd numbers, she ruminated aloud on why some bunches of flowers are sold in 4s or 6s!

Jane had conditioned the flowers she was using by trimming the ends and soaking the stalks in water. She explained that the structure of the arrangement had to be addressed first: height and then width. As Jane worked she mentioned tips and hacks about floral art such as: if stems are cut at an angle they take up water more efficiently, it also helps to stabilise the stalk in the oasis. As she added what she called her key flower she explained that she was thinking 'triangle' The first flower upright, the second at an angle and the next making the third point. The flowers she was using were beautiful orange protea blooms, native of South Africa. As she added more flowers she suggested building up the rear with greenery. Chatting away to members who were absorbed in her demonstration- she paused, spun it round and, pronouncing it complete, showed her audience a stunning arrangement of autumn coloured flowers and foliage sitting proudly in a large pumpkin. It was beautiful.

For her next arrangement Jane chose a smaller scooped out pumpkin to which she had added a yoghurt pot and put clear Sellotape across the top. Chatting as she worked, Jane fixed the lid back on with cocktail sticks and proceeded to fill the pot with chrysanthemums cut down to just a few centimetres. She added roses and greenery to provide contrast and in no time at all another display was complete and spinning gently on the turntable as members applauded appreciatively. Jane answered questions from the ladies and generously donated the two arrangements to this month's raffle. Rosemary Haw gave the vote of thanks and members converged on the table to have a closer look at the displays.

Tea hostesses this month were Christine, Jenny and Heather. As usual, a delectable looking spread awaited the members who enjoyed the cakes, fruit and biscuits along with a cup of tea or coffee.

Jane judged the Item of the Month competition and members put a coin against their favourite bloom in the Flower of the Month competition. After the tea break Helen called the ladies back together for the business section of

the meeting. Dealing guickly with the correspondence received, Helen mentioned that four members were joining the trip to the National Arboretum at the end of October. As expected, the Ely Christmas Market trip also organised by the South Lincs Federation was vastly over-subscribed and only three Colsterworth members had been successful in the ensuing ballot. Mention was made of other forthcoming events, a fund-raising fashion show at Pinchbeck, a wreath making session at Frampton, an exhibition of 'Strictly Come Dancing' costumes at Stamford and a lunch at Belton Golf Club. Such a wide variety of activities on offer, something for every member.

A report on the recent, most enjoyable, visit to Cranwell Aviation Museum was given by Rosemarie Everitt. Members were reminded about the upcoming coffee morning raising funds to be divided between Colsterworth WI and Lincolnshire Bloodbikes. This event will be held at the White Lion pub by kind permission of Phil and Bob. Mention was also made of the 108th Anniversary Lunch which takes place at the same venue on 27th November. Because of this lunch engagement there will be no general meeting in November. The December meeting will be a held on Tuesday 16th at 2pm and will be a Social afternoon with entertainment by the InVoice Choir.

The results of the competition were announced. The Item of the Month- a buttonhole was won by Rosemary H with Rosemarie E as runner up and Liz won the Flower of the Month with Shirley and Brenda in second place as they received the same number of votes.

The eagerly awaited raffle was called with Pamela and Heather as the lucky winners of the beautiful arrangements so generously donated by the lovely Jane. There were seven other winners. After a most entertaining and instructive meeting, Helen wished members a good afternoon and closed the meeting at 4pm


