Walking the Ward for Veterans

On the weekend of the longest day, I will be walking the full perimeter of Isaac Newton Ward – more than 30 miles through our villages, lanes and countryside – to raise money for The Royal British Legion.

As I make my way around the ward, I will pass through communities whose churchyards and war memorials still bear witness to the sacrifices of previous generations. In Colsterworth, Great Ponton, Skillington, South Witham and elsewhere, the names of local men who never returned remain carved in stone.



Our area also played its part in the nation's story. RAF North Witham formed part of the vast wartime effort that helped secure the liberation of Europe, while many local families endured the anxiety and heartbreak that war brought to rural Lincolnshire.

Yet this is not simply a matter of history. Around 7% of South Kesteven residents have served in the Armed Forces. Veterans remain an important part of our communities today – as neighbours, volunteers, parish councillors and friends.

The Royal British Legion continues to provide vital support to veterans, serving personnel and their families, particularly those facing loneliness, ill health or the lasting effects of service.

As we approach the longest day of the year, I hope readers might consider sponsoring the walk. Every donation, however small, will help support those who have served our country.

Your headlines from the Parish Council (PC) Meeting 2nd June 2026

Public Forum

One member of the public attended to query responsibility for the hedgerow along Old Post Lane on the left-hand side towards Melton Road. They stated that the hedgerow is overgrown and encroaching into the road by nearly a foot in places. They sustained scratches to their car trying to avoid traffic coming in the other direction. Cllr. Hainsworth advised that the hedge is most likely the responsibility of the landowner, Colsterworth Trust Estates. It was requested that the clerk report to Fix My Street and contact Colsterworth Trust Estates.

Chair's Remarks

Cllr E. O'Neill (Chair) thanked everyone for coming and noted that there was quite an important agenda item coming up in relation to cover for a period of leave for the Clerk but otherwise anticipated a relatively straight-forward meeting.

Lincolnshire County Council and South Kesteven District Councillors Report

SKDC Cllr D. Bellamy reported: -

- A resident on School Lane contacted the Cllr regarding a potential Conservation Area in case it was a district issue. Cllr advised the resident that it is the responsibility of the Parish Council to request the creation of a Conservation Area but as the Local Plan is not yet approved, it is not possible to request one at this time.
- Further to the Local Plan, the Cllr reported that the timetable seems to be falling behind which is causing some issues with the five-year housing supply.
- A potential National Scheme of Delegation aimed at speeding up the planning process may cause issues with the local planning system. Cllr gave the example that SKDC receive over 2000 planning applications a year with only around 200 going to committee with the vast majority being approved or refused within the set timetable. As such, the Cllr doesn't feel a National Scheme of Delegation would help to speed up proceedings.
- Confirmation that the Bourne Road development has been called into committee.
- Confirmation that the faulty streetlights on Steeles Lane have been repaired.
- It is looking likely that the AD Plant enquiry held by the Planning Inspectorate will go ahead on the 14th July 2026.

LCC Cllr C. Vernon and SKDC Cllr B. Green sent their apologies.

Defibrillator (AED) Provision for Gunby and Stainby

It was resolved and unanimously agreed to approve the ongoing maintenance costs of £440 ex VAT per annum of defibrillators (AEDs) for Gunby and Stainby (based on the average yearly cost from the past five years).

Updates for Council Administration

Upcoming leave for the clerk was approved, and the appointment of a temporary replacement was confirmed.

Cllr T. O'Regan reported that some large trees in Back Lane by the Rectory are just about touching the power cables on the far side. Cllr advised that he had phoned the National Grid to report.

Colsterworth WI Meeting Tuesday, 19th May 2026

It promised to be a busy meeting. May is always a busy meeting because it is Resolutions month and the committee is keen to provide entertainment as well as erudition. Behind the scenes from 1.30 onwards was the usual bustle as the welcome, competition and the all-important tea and refreshment tables were set up, not forgetting the tables and chairs for the members.

Magically by 2pm, when president Helen opened the meeting, all was calm and ready. The May meeting is always a game of two halves and Helen outlined the agenda as she welcomed 20 members including new member Vicky and two visitors. Business first, she explained, then refreshments and social activities second. Dealing first with the correspondence received, Helen reminded members of the recently issued Chairman's Challenge- to create and produce a design that best sums up Colsterworth WI. Nobody volunteered themselves but Sue and Liz P were volunteered by other members. Both were smiling as their names were put forward so maybe they are not averse to the suggestion...watch this space!

Helen and Rosemarie reported on the recent visit to Mrs Smith's cottage at Navenby. Helen particularly recommended the Pheasantries café at Leadenham Polo Club where lunch was enjoyed. Christine told of the latest outing of the walking group to Burton-le-Coggles and afterwards at Jade's Farm Shop where the lovely Jade had warm sausage rolls ready for the intrepid hikers. A bit of a foodie theme running through the reports. Members were reminded of the forthcoming event to be held at Peterborough Cathedral in July 'Longest Yarn 2'. This cleverly named exhibition consists entirely of knitted items telling the story of life on the homefront during World War Two.

On to the main business of the day. It has been previously reported that the WI is not just jam and Jerusalem, cake and a cup of tea, laughter and chatter. It is a democratic, non-party political campaigning organisation

with a long and proud history of raising awareness and driving change on a number of issues of national importance. The resolutions are very much at the heart of the matter. This year, unusually, two resolutions are to go forward to the NFWI's annual meeting to be held in early June. The first resolution which was discussed was (condensed) 'The NFWI echoes the calls of homelessness charities and urges all levels of government to take action to reduce women's homelessness, to reduce the number of women at risk of becoming homeless and to improve the quality of temporary accommodation.' Helen conducted the debate on this issue beginning with a quiz. One surprising fact to emerge from this was that existing statistics on rough sleeping underestimate the number of women experiencing homelessness by 90%. It is thought the reason for this is 'hidden homelessness'. Women are more likely to hide their homelessness by sofa-surfing, riding overnight buses, sleeping in woodland or hiding in hospitals or fast food restaurants rather than sleeping on the streets. Some discussion followed with the overwhelming mood was in favour of the motion. A vote was taken.

The second resolution was (again condensed) 'This resolution is a call for accessible, clean, free public toilets which are fundamental to inclusion and wellbeing, especially for women, older people, disabled individuals, parents and carers' Pamela lead the debate on this resolution. The quiz threw up some more surprising facts. For example, there are 3,300 public toilets in the UK and 67% of women interviewed admitted to regularly dehydrating themselves as they can't trust there will be a toilet if they need one. The debate on this resolution was lively and at times entertaining. The motion was supported but it was felt the word free should be omitted due to constraints on national and local budgets.

Helen is our delegate for this year's annual meeting representing Colsterworth, Stamford and Carby WIs. She will report the result of the Colsterworth votes on June 4th.

Resolution business over, it was time for tea. Refreshment hostesses this month were Margaret L, Liz P, and Sonia. As Sonia, over the weekend, had done her best impression of Alice in Wonderland by trying

to disappear down a rabbit hole, leaving her with an injured ankle and shoulder, Shirley stepped in to take her place. During the break, while sampling the delicious cakes, fruit and biscuits, members voted again. This time for the 'Flower of the Month' and 'Item of the Month' competitions. The theme for this was a butterfly.

Helen called the ladies back together and handed proceedings over to Pamela, who had agreed to run the beetle Drive in Rachel's absence. The last time a Beetle Drive took place it appeared to be organised chaos with each table, if not each member, playing to their own rules. This time the ever-organised Rachel had prepared a set of rules for each table which Pamela went through before the game started. No wriggle room there at all. Members listened obediently and the players were off. The sound of die being shaken, dropped, picked up again accompanied by laughter and chat echoed round the room. The cry of 'Beetle' was heard and the first game ended.

Winners and losers changes tables and it all started again. After four games time was getting short and Pamela called for a grand adding up of scores. The winner was Jenny who was awarded an adult colouring book on insects. The booby prize went to Dee who won a pair of socks decorated with ladybirds. All agreed it had been an entertaining interlude much needed after the serious business of the resolutions. After thanking Pamela for her MC skills and complementing Rachel on her organising ability, Helen announced the competition results. New member, Vicky won the 'Item of the Month' with a beautiful framed example of a lace butterfly. The 'Flower of the Month' was won by Shirley. The raffle was called. Natural History

Bulletin

July 2026

Over the eleven years, to October 2025, of the Natural History Bulletin, there were regular reports of warm Springs following either floods or drought. Concerns began to be expressed of climate change. This year a drought was followed by highest temperatures recorded at end of May. June saw fields of shining yellow rape with roots in the dust and few pollinators to provide an oil seed crop.

Mature trees probe deep for water. A warm day at the end of May saw a sudden change. The angle of skeletal branches disappeared beneath the rounded shapes of uncurling leaves and opening flowers – Horse Chestnut candles, lime green Norway maple, bridal white Hawthorn and Pink Cherry.



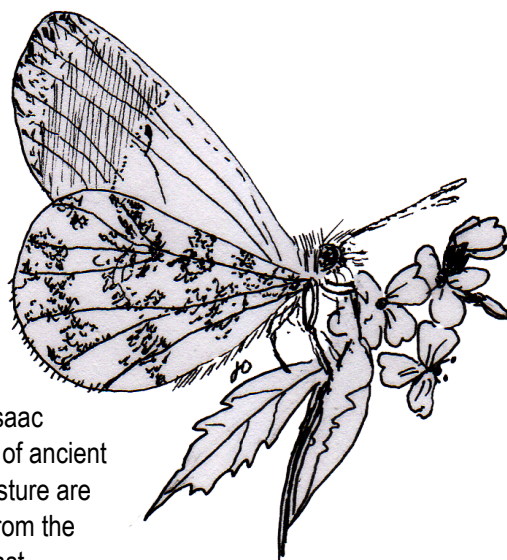

(Fledgling Blackbird)

In the garden a Robin changed his perch back from the watering can, to the spade. A fledgling from her first brood fended for itself nearby. A Bluetit paused on the washing line, a fat caterpillar in its beak. The Wood Pigeons hardly paused in their courtship, neglecting their last pair of young whose sparse feather cover hardly supported fledging. Butterflies enhanced the liveliness. Small Tortoiseshell, a single Painted Lady, Holly Blues, a male Orange Tip, and the longest lived of our Butterflies – the Brimstone first seen in February.

Because of its proximity to Isaac Newton's birthplace an area of ancient houses and fragments of pasture are protected in Parish Plans. From the gardens, plants valued by past generations have survived and spilt onto stone walls and grass verges. Medicinals, like English Comfrey affective as a poultice over fractures, nicknamed Knitbone, Lavender folded into clean washing, Soapwort the roots of which produce a mild cleaner, Fennel for flavouring.

A mutually helpful association called symbiosis. I have a plant near the conservatory door – it is anchored to the step – I am on the lookout for an ant!

One great survivor is a plant with a tale or two to tell. Ivy-leaved Toadflax was possibly an overlooked weed. On the old stone walls it planted itself, its shoots turning to the shade where at the nodes fine roots anchored it into a crack. Its seeds have a sweet covering which attract in ants which may disperse seed. The ants rid the plant of small pests.

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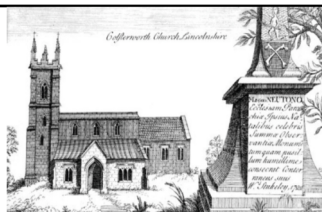
