# 7. Set Precept 2018/19

The SKDC Local Council Tax Support Scheme is further reduced by £234 for 2018/19. An inflationary increase of 3%(R.P.I October) as been agreed. An increase in the Parish Precept Band "D" rate to compensate for these changes results an increase from £43.43 to £44.74 per household per year.

# APPENDIX 3: CONCERNS RELATING TO SAFETY ON THE A1 AND SURROUNDING VILLAGES

Support has been received from Nick Boles MP however, whilst major improvements such as applying motorway standards or more flyovers were unlikely there was a need for improvement to reduce casualties and disruption.

The A1 is the responsibility of Highways England, and as a Parish Council we have no influence, however, as the A1 passes through Lincolnshire it seems reasonable to expect LCC/SKDC to lobby Highways England on our behalf and all those villages/residents effected.

Traffic on the A1 has increased by 25% following the removal of the roundabouts on the Blythe/Stamford stretch. A1 crossing points are dangerous as we are all reminded almost on a weekly basis; this is a major safety issue - it needs the support of LCC and SKDC

LCC Highways asked questions regarding their "wish list" idea for improvements for the future:
