5. Traffic Calming Measures

Councillor Caroline Hainsworth highlighted the following concerns from her discussions with residents on Bourne Road: Speeding vehicles including HGV's; adequacy of existing calming measures (flashing speed signs); speed limit reduction. The clerk has requested the Road Safety Partnership to provide current statistics of traffic movements on the B676 in order to compare those taken in 2012. Councillor Hainsworth agreed to form a Road Traffic Group of interested parties.

6. Clerk's Report and items arising from the Minutes

- a) Nature Trail encroachment. Solicitors have written again to the homeowner.
- b) LCC Highways have attended to many of the outstanding pothole repair requests.
- c) Public footpath 19 "the jitty" (School Lane Old Post Lane). Hedges have been cut back and LCC have written to some homeowners to trim back overhanging trees.
- d) Dorman's Fun Fair had a reasonable turnout despite the changeable weather. A donation of £80 was received towards the Community Fund from Mr Dorman.
- e) Public footpath 7 (Chestnut Grove to Back Lane). The school has approached the parish council with regard to overhanging trees along the footpath. The clerk will follow up.
- f) B676 Stainby Road/Post Lane crossroads Colsterworth. Complaints have been received regarding poor visibility due to overgrown hedges at the crossroads. The clerk has contacted the farmer Jonathan Thompson requesting that they be cutback urgently.
- g) Notice boards at Stainby, Gunby and North Witham will be upgraded (discussed previous meeting).
