Prior to the meeting Debbie Nicholls (SKDC) updated the council on the initiative to commemorate South Lincolnshire's vital role during the 2nd World War. In particular North Witham Airfield (Twyford Wood). The parish council confirmed it fully supports this initiative.

4. Minutes of the previous meeting

Please note the minutes are distributed in note form each month to all Parish Councillors so that they may make comments and alterations via the Parish Clerk thus saving valuable time at the Parish Council's next meeting when approving the minutes. These were agreed.

5. Clerk's Report and items arising from the Minutes

a) Defibrillators. The new defibrillator at the Colsterworth Village Hall has been installed and activated. The defibrillator for the Youth Club/Littlelegs building has been ordered.

b) Stainby speed signs. Lincolnshire Road Safety Partnership surveyed traffic flow and speeds in Stainby for five days commencing 5th August. A total of 9800 vehicles travelled through the survey area with a fairly even flow in each direction. Analysis of the speed data showed evidence that vehicles were exceeding the speed limit. The vast majority of vehicles that were exceeding the speed limit were not travelling at a speed high enough for the police to be able to take actions against the driver. Highways engineers within the Road Safety Partnership have assessed the area and confirmed that no engineering casualty reduction measures were identified. Councillors agreed to defer any decision on installation of permanent Visually Activated Signs. However the Visually Activated Sign currently located at North Witham will be moved to Stainby when it becomes available.

c) School Lane street lighting. EON have agreed to check/upgrade the wiring on the light on the west side of the River Witham bridge. SKDC have been requested to ensure that the foliage that is impairing the effectiveness of the street light adjacent to number 8 is cut back.

d) North Witham. The parish council has been informed that LCC Highways has approved speed limits on Post Lane at North Witham. Date for installation is awaited.

e) Grit Bin requests. LCC Highways have approved a grit bin at the Newton Way/Woolsthorpe Road junction. Apple Tree Close however was refused as is not "public highway".

f) Co-Option for parish council casual vacancy Colsterworth Parish. Notice has been placed on notice boards.g) Street light 89 Water Lane, Woolsthorpe by Colsterworth. Damaged by air gun pellet. Police notified.

h) Cycle Track project. Suspended due to shortage of funding.

i) Winter gritting. Local farmer Bill Scorror will order in salt supplies. A larger capacity towable gritting machine would be an advantage. Clerk will investigate opportunities.

j) Allotment inspections were carried out on 25 October.

Neighbourhood Development Plan Progress Report:

October 2015

- 1. The grant application to My Community has been approved and the full sum of £3691 has been received by the Parish Clerk. As a result, the steering group have agreed to use Bob Keith for expert guidance, as per the grant application.
- 2. A meeting has been arranged for the work group to meet with Bob Keith on 16 November. It had been hoped to reach this stage by the end of October, but due to holiday commitments, this is the earliest date available.

The work group have drafted the aims and policies for the themes of:

- Housing,
- Rural Economy including Transport, and
- Community, Health and Well-being.

These will be the main topic for the meeting with Bob. He has been asked to provide guidance which will enable us to finalise the drafting phase for these themes.

The work group members are slightly behind schedule with the Natural and Historic Landscape theme but hope to have something to include on the meeting agenda.

The work under this heading is fairly involved as it includes an assessment of the landscape. Hence, it is taking more time to reach the first drafting stage.

- 3. An index of evidence continues to be compiled. Again, we shall use Bob Keith to provide expertise and advice to ensure this work is robust and complete.
- 4. A consultation meeting was held at North Witham Village Hall on 6 October aimed at engaging with the residents of North Witham, Stainby, Gunby and Lobthorpe. The input received at the meeting helped with drafting the work relating to the smaller villages.
