

# NATURAL HISTORY BULLETIN

Perhaps no one knows our parish highways and byways better than the person responsible for their tidiness. His findings have included young hedgehogs, grass snakes, whitethroat, goldcrests, spotted flycatcher and, this September, a dead buzzard. On September 6th a bird so unusual as to seem incredible, was a nightjar. He found it dead on the western end of the Woolsthorpe Road. Details and photographs were sent to the County Recorder for Birds. This rare bird of heathland may have been migrating south for the winter. As its name suggests it flies at night, hunting for insects with its wide mouth agape.




Swallows have now left at least two sites where they have bred this summer. In one case one of two attempts failed . In the other, two broods were successfully reared. Neither have attempted a late brood, probably because of a cold spell in late summer. Also unexpected was an Oak Bush Cricket which turned up drowned in a bath. A search revealed more of its kind amongst the apple trees in the garden. Another "adventive" (turning up in unexpected places) was a

Common Green Grasshopper, landing on a book being read near the open door of a conservatory. Both species mark the gardens with a seal of wildlife approval. Vapourer Moths may be "ubiquitous" (found everywhere) but they have fascinating lifestyles. The black, white and red caterpillar has not only warning colours but tufts of irritant hairs as protection from predators. It was found away from plants, searching for a place to spin its cocoon. A fortnight later, in another garden, several adult males with their distinctive cream wing spots were flying over flowers of marjoram. The female is wingless and seldom flies far from the cocoon from which she has emerged. Small Whites were the most frequent butterflies in the garden. Speckled Woods more frequent on the shaded areas of the Nature Trail. Small Tortoiseshells. Red Admirals and Peacock Butterflies all gathered to sip juice from a stewing of Crab Apples in an open compost bin.

Wasps, rising like a swarm of bees were disturbed on fallen plums. On cold days Buff Tailed Bumble Bees were immobile, spread out on Knapweeds in the early morning. A Cuckoo Bee was identified from a photograph which clearly showed the lack of pollen baskets on the hind legs. Seven Spot Ladybirds seem abundant as both larvae and adults. Thankfully no Harlequin Ladybirds have been reported.

A plant, thought to be a Himalayan Balsam was identified as another garden escape. It was found growing from rubbish dumped on a layby. Himalayan Balsam is an attractive plant with explosive seeds which, if scattered on a waterway will develop into a continuous line of tall plants, excluding all others.



Another garden escape, even more damaging is Japanese Knotweed, growing like bamboo and almost impossible to eradicate once established.

To Look For In October If there are any Harlequin ladybirds about they will be looking to hibernate in buildings. They are aliens and damaging, especially to our native ladybirds. With so much to report, Fungi have been left till next month. By that time you may have many more to tell us about. Dragonflies may still be about, as may the Humming Bird Hawk Moth (more great photos sent in this month). 
