#### **Public Forum**

There were two members of the public present: -

The first spoke in support of his application to become a Parish Councillor for Colsterworth and District Parish Council. Agenda item 2020.89

The second was a representative of Hereward Homes Limited who asked that in addition to the 5 houses which have already received consent to be built on the land to the rear of 11 to 17 Stamford Road, Colsterworth NG33 5JD, consideration be given to one more house being built with a horse paddock for the rest of the land. The total number of dwellings would be 6. The representative then answered questions from the Parish Councillors. Any comments from the Parish Council would be through the official South Kesteven District Council Planning process.

**Chairperson Remarks** 

Chair to the Council Caroline Hainsworth welcomed everyone to the meeting and acknowledged that some members occasionally encountered technology connectivity issues and for clarity she would be calling a roll call for items to be voted on. Caroline then went on to say that the Colsterworth Resilience Forum (CRF) was again mobilizing volunteers to identify vulnerable people and thanked the CRF Co-Ordinator Helen Bill for all the work she does.

#### **County/District Councillor Report**

#### **District Councillor Dave Bellamy reported: -**

- The 'White Paper' on planning was causing concern with possible limitations being placed on Planning Committees.
- Working from home where possible was to continue for District and County staff. There is concern for the welfare of staff who may feel isolated.

#### County Councillor Bob Adams reported: -

- Permission has been granted for a new warehouse store at Witham Specialist Vehicles on Honey Pot Lane.
- There was no new information on the Concrete Block Manufacturing Facility on the A1 planning application was pulled out by the applicant at the last minute from SKDC Planning.

#### <u>Updates for Council Finance & Administration</u>

- 1. Ellis O'Neill was unanimously Co-Opted as Councillor for Colsterworth.
- 2. Draft budget and draft Precept setting agreed.
- 3. Unanimously Agreed for Councillor Clark to be Coopted to the Finance & Administration Committee.
- 4. Accounts for payment were approved by Council.
- 5. Complaints Policy Review November 2020 adopted.
- 54. Scheme of Delegation Planning decisions and communication review November 2020 adopted.

The start of 2020 saw the Coronavirus Pandemic change our lives in a way that we never imagined. The Pandemic has been a particularly tough year for Maddie and Dave, but they have continued to provide take away food throughout lockdown and their weekly Thursday night quiz by Zoom is enjoyed by many. The COVID-19 safe measures implemented when the White Lion re-opened provided a safe and pleasant experience with customers and trade picking up only to be dashed again with the new restrictions from 5th November. The White Lion is the hub of the village, let us support Maddie and Dave and their staff while they offer their take-away service until they can re-open again. Thank you to Maddie and Dave and their staff for continuing to be the hub of the village despite what has been thrown at them in 2020

IN TOUCH. This was also affected by the pandemic, several of the volunteers were advised by the government to shield or were in the vulnerable group and advised to stay at home. As a result, it was not possible to distribute the In Touch in the months of April and May and was missed by many of you. From June some volunteers were able to return and new ones recruited and the In Touch Parish magazine has continued to be delivered through your doors. As another year is almost at a close it is time to thank all those involved in the preparation and distribution of the monthly village magazine – 1000 magazines each month. Thank you to John and Julia Hincks who co-ordinated the volunteers for the first part of the year and to Margaret Winn and husband Colin Russell who took on the co-ordinating roll in September not forgetting the 20 loyal volunteer helpers that distribute the village magazine through all kinds of weather; the editor Stuart Whitcombe for compiling and layout of the magazine, contributors and of course our many advertisers for their continued support.

VILLAGE MAINTENANCE. A big thank you to our handyman Graham Brumpton who always goes that extra mile keeping the grass verges and amenity areas trimmed and tidy including public footpaths and the nature trail.

LITTER PICKING. Thank you to our community cleaners Kevin and Mark who help keep our streets free from litter. They also go that extra mile literally to clear litter from village verges discarded by selfish motorists. This year we have seen a particular problem with dog fouling on the footpaths and overflowing dog waste bins. The Parish Council has addressed the overflowing dog waste bins by providing an extra bin on the Nature Trail close to the Woolsthorpe Playing area and paying Kevin and Mark for additional bin emptying each month. Please clean up after your dog and if the dog waste bins are full please take your dog's waste home and deposit in your own bin.



## **NATURAL HISTORY** BULLETIN

Fallow Deer(a) were seen by early morning in Twyford Wood on 24th October. They are nocturnal grazers but shelter in the woods by day. At this time of the year they can be seen with the females. Seven year old stags have antlers at their best, with a palmate or flattened section which distinguishes them from all other deer found in the wild in Britain. They circle round in display areas cleared by trampling, surrounded by the frayed bark of trees, challenging other males with groans and belching noises. Fallow deer are believed to have been first introduced by the Romans and later reintroduced by the Normans who prized them for hunting. Later landscaped deer parks adjoined most stately homes. All our feral deer derive from escapees into the wild. By December the stags will have returned to their bachelor life. Does will remain in groups until their young are born in June.




A story of rescued hedgehogs was sent in at the end of October. Two young ones had been found in a poor condition, thin and infested with fly larvae. They were cared for by cleaning of parasites and fed until they reached a weight to enable them to survive hibernation. The health of our local hedgehogs is due, in part at least to the care given to them in garden environments – food, safe areas for nesting and hibernation and territory allowed by passageways between gardens.

There are regular reports of kingfishers seen from downstream of the Nature Trail to areas behind Stamford Road gardens. More recently it was good to hear of them further upstream of the Witham between North and South Witham. A single Crossbill was observed in conifers in Twyford Wood. Parties of Crossbills are on the move but no Redwings seen by third week in November.

In Twyford Wood a row of young oak trees bears clusters of the Oak Marble Gall (b). Some of these have a single exit hole where the adult insect has emerged. Others have either the marks or exit holes of the smaller inquilines (those which live alongside the galls). Others on the ground had large holes where birds had taken out the fat grub of the gall causer.

In Colsterworth a mature oak is infected with the Knopper Gall. (c)These grow from the acorn cup forming folds and swellings but also penetrate the whole acorn making it inviable. Only reported in Britain in 1962 it has two generations, the other form found on Turkey Oak catkins. Cherry galls(d) were also found on fallen oak leaves in November as were the smaller spangle and button galls. Their common names describe these red galls well. Tangles of red threads hiding the pockets containing gall grubs are found on the wild rose bushes on the Nature Trail. A local name is Robin's Pincushion(e). Look for the Spiked Ball Gall (f) hidden under rose leaves. All these galls provide food from their grubs for birds in the depth of winter.











To Look For In December. Examine fallen leaves for galls and look for them revealed on bare twigs of trees. Jays in Twyford Wood may be feeding on the abundant acorns. Will Waxwings and other scarcer winter migrants return this winter? What will be the last sighting of the year of a Butterfly or Moth? 


