

Advance road works notice from Lincolnshire County Council (LCC).

B676, Stainby Road, Highfield Bridge, Colsterworth, Lincolnshire Anticipated start date for these works is 21/06/21 and is to last for 3 weeks



Lincolnshire County Councils intention to carry out maintenance works to the above structure, the location of which is shown on the above plan.

After carrying out recent inspections it has been identified that the bridge is in need of maintenance. The existing masonry wingwalls and abutments on both sides of the bridge have deteriorated and have large cracks in places. LCC are proposing to repair the defects by replacing and repointing the masonry where necessary which will help to prolong the life of the structure.

The anticipated start date for these works is 21/06/21 and is to last for 3 weeks. These dates and timescales are subject to change depending on the current Covid 19 pandemic, the availability of our term maintenance contractor and progress on this site and others.

At this stage in the design it is anticipated that we will require minimal traffic management throughout the works, with traffic signals only being required when materials/equipment are delivered or removed to or from site.

Public Forum

There were no members of the public present.

Chairperson Remarks

Chairperson Cllr Caroline Hainsworth thanked everyone for joining the meeting and hoped that all were keeping well and busy.

County/District Councillor Report District Councillor D Bellamy Reported:

- The SKDC Budget had been set with an increase from the previous year of 3.3%, County Council increase of 2% and the Police increase of 5.9%.
- SKDC were no longer underwriting the £100K
 SKDC for the statue of the late former Prime Minister
 Margaret Thatcher, this is now being underwritten by private business.
- An amendment had been made to give an increase in wage to the lowest paid of the SKDC staff.
- Cllr Bellamy apologized for the delay from SKDC on some current planning enforcement issues advising that from the start of the new financial year another enforcement officer will be appointed.
- The previous and recent flooding at Bourne Road Estate, Colsterworth will be monitored by the SKDC Housing Department.
- Planning S20/0345 at Bridge End, Colsterworth had been deferred for reports.
- Planning S20/1820, Change of use to Children's Home at North Witham was going before the Planning Committee on 3rd March2021.

County Councillor B Adams Reported:

- Lincolnshire County Council had agreed a balance budget for 1 year. The current issues relating to the pandemic prevented a longer budget from being agreed.
- £12 Million has been removed from Highways which they will try and save through efficiencies and savings.
- The Government has told the County Council to put aside £10 Million for local businesses to come from reserves.
- A County Council precept rise of 6%.

Clerks Report

- 1. The code to the padlock on the gates to the Defibrillator outside the Village Hall has been logged with the ambulance service.
- 2. Advance road works notice from Lincolnshire County Council (LCC). B676, Stainby Road, Highfield Bridge, Colsterworth, Lincolnshire. The anticipated start date for these works is 21/06/21 and is to last for 3 weeks.
- 3. Request for a grit bin School Lane close to Whitham view has been rejected by LCC Highways because that part of the road is unadopted.
- 4. The Clerk has requested SKDC street-lights outside the Co-op are replaced with ones with improved illumination.

Ingle Charity 2021

Ingle Charity would like to express thanks to two long-serving Trustees who have died recently. Bill Senescall, served as a Trustee from 1980 to 2011, and Dora Farley who became a Trustee in 1989, was still serving the Charity when she died in February. We offer our condolences to their families. Interestingly, both were born in Woolsthorpe and clocked up nearly 62 years of service between them!

Ingle Charity History

Ingle Charity was the legacy of Frederick Ingle, who died on 30 May 1912 aged 73 years. He was the son of Edward Ingle and his second wife Eleanor of Middlefield House Colsterworth. His executors set up the Frederick Ingle Charities in 1914 – originally the Benevolent Charity, the Nursing Charity and the Pension Fund, the first list of beneficiaries being drawn from Frederick's own Christmas list of villagers whom he regularly supported. Other parts of the charity funded a boy through Grammar School; paid for an apprenticeship, with boots and tools; and provided a nurse for the village, to care for the sick and poor.

Ingle Family History

The Ingle family came to live in Colsterworth sometime after 1607; Henry Ingle was bailiff to Isaac Newton and Kelly's Directory of Lincolnshire in 1885 listed Edward Ingle, Frederick's father, as 'a farmer and grazier'.

Edward Ingle had such radical views on religion that he broke away from the Methodist Chapel, holding services at his business premises in the Dunkirk area of Colsterworth. This congregation became the Wesleyan Reform Chapel. After leaving school Frederick was articled as an architect to Mr Hinde of Nottingham, but later changed his employment to the building-contracting firm of Mr Dennett in Nottingham. The firm grew and Frederick improved on the Dennett fireproofing system by encasing structural pillars in fire-resisting concrete.

Later he became a partner, and Dennett & Ingle were best known as contractors providing two construction features: firstly, they installed their ironwork in buildings, and secondly, and most importantly, they were renowned for their concrete fireproofing construction.

The architect Sir Gilbert Scott favoured their technique, and it can be seen in such buildings as the Foreign Office in Whitehall, where the ironwork is exposed and decorated, and in the Royal Courts of Justice and St Thomas' Hospital.

At the age of 72, Frederick was still working, living at his London house, 24 Queen Anne's Gate in Westminster. The offices of Dennett & Ingle were also located there.

Frederick was non-conformist but donated to both chapels in Colsterworth; he also gave £50 for the restoration of the bells in the Colsterworth Parish Church.

When Frederick died, he left the majority of his estate to his niece Sarah Abbot of Colsterworth. To some of his tenants he willed them their homes and left money to cousins worldwide; he donated to charities in London, Nottingham, Grantham, Stamford.

Frederick's funeral took place at his house, Middlefield, in Colsterworth, and the Parish Church of St John the Baptist rang a muffled peal of bells in the evening. He is buried near his parents in Woolsthorpe Cemetery.

Mourners came from Manchester, Nottingham and London, and there were many tributes, including the message on a wreath from the well-known Grantham solicitor Mr R.F.Moresby White – 'a kinder heart never beat'.



NATURAL HISTORY BULLETIN

Snowdrops and Winter Aconites lasted well into March this year and Lesser Celandines added to the colour on the roadside verges. The first Sweet Violets were seen on 4th March. The only one of the four kinds of violets found locally to have a scent they also have a white form and are the first to flower. Not long behind in flowering are the Early Dog Violets. These dainty pale petalled flowers prefer the shade and are often associated with ancient woodland. The so-called Common Dog Violet is tolerant of a wide range of conditions but locally is less frequent in open grassland on the limestone than the Hairy Dog Violet. On the 11th March the Coltsfoor was in flower another plant, like the Lesser Celandine which is used as an indicator of the early or lateness of the season. It, like the Blackthorn (first reported on 19th March) are both later this year than in 2020. A plant usually unnoticed due to its small size was a favourite of the American Naturalist Aldo Leopald. Of Spring Whitlow Grass he wrote that sand too poor and sun too weak are good enough for this plant which is a true harbinger of spring. Its tiny white flowers, with five deeply cleft petals are encircled by slender hairy leaves. It has no scent to tempt pollinaters in and is self fertile. Over a number of generations the populations of clones evolve to their particular patch so that a colony may become (say) more hairy, taller flowered than the next. It was noticed on the Roadside Nature Reserve by its the round shining and translucent pods, rather like miniature honesty seedheads.


The first Brimstone butterfly was seen flying on 23rd February and together with a single Tortoiseshell Butterfly in the same garden flew every day for almost a week. Bufftailed Bumblebee Queens were busy collecting nectar even when buffeted by cold winds and there were a few Tree

Bumblebees out too. The males of the first Hairy footed Flower Bees have not yet appeared (by 19/3/21) but their favourite nectar source, Lungwort is out and waiting for them. On 23rd February ants clambered out in numbers from a large garden pot where they had nested. Frog spawn was first reported on llth March – to the day it was first seen in one pond last year. In another the spawn was seen on 18th March. In all cases few adults were seen either before or after the discovery of spawn.

Skylarks heard singing but bird song generally is still subdued. The dawn chorus should increase and reach its strongest by the beginning of May. On March 19 rooks gathered amongst nineteen nests in an ash tree were making what can only be described as a clamour. Gilbert White, the 18th Century Naturalist wrote "Rooks in the breeding" season, attempt sometimes in the gaiety of their hearts to sing, but with little success" On the Woolsthorpe Roadside Nature Reserve two Bullfinches, in their brightest colours were seen in the bushes with two Kites displaying in the sky above. Blue Tits nesting in a wall overgrown with bushes, Little Egret on the Witham where a brief flash of colour indicated a Kingfisher and the lesser drama of a Moorhen nearby were some of the sightings shared for this article.

A hedgehogs out on the Nature trail, appeared in good health. Fresh molehills on higher ground were probably made by moles escaping the wet. A photograph of a Muntjac in a garden and a phone message of the same thing may have been in another garden but the same deer. There have been signs of activity round the three lots of Badger's setts. They seem to have been taking the roots of Wild Arum which would be very caustic to eat. Hares about in the daytime, 'boxing' in the fields.

To Look for in April. Butterflies should be more in terms of numbers and variety. Other kinds of Bumble Bee, Mason and Solitary Bee should all be flying. The first Summer Migrants like the Chiff Chaff, Willow Warbler and Blackcap. What would be particularly useful is records of Frogs, Newts and Toads. I wonder if this year if anyone will see a Lizard or a Slow Worm? I look forward to your records and observations at 61 Woolsthorpe Road, 860465,e-mail jnostler@ hotmail.co.uk Jane Ostler






