Public Forum

There were three members of the public present, who spoke in support of the following two events/projects:-

Pop up create, Arts Activity Day Saturday 22nd May 2021:

There were two speakers, the first to speak was a local creative producer who explained that Colsterworth was one of five Villages nominated by South Kesteven District Council (S.K.D.C.) that he had been invited to deliver an Arts Day for. The proposed date of the Arts Day is Saturday 22nd May 2021, between 9am and 2pm.

Isaac Newton Project:-

The Reverend Neil Griffiths summarised the Isaac Newton Project to date and provided a vision of its future. He said that the Arts Day linked in well with the Isaac Newton Project for Community Events. The four focusses for the Church are: -

- For flexible modern worship.
- Create a modern community space, flexible for learning and 2 community events.
- 3. Create an education space to learn about the church and the Village.
- Create a space that recognises our heritage and links to Sir Isaac Newton

Chairperson Remarks

Chair to the Council Cllr Caroline Hainsworth welcomed everyone to the meeting and said that it had been worth spending the time listening to the public session and what is going on. Clir Hainsworth said that we are moving into the next phase and to see what happens.

County/District Councillor Report

District Councillor D Bellamy had sent his apologies for the meeting and some notes which were read out by the Clerk, summarised below:

- S20/2084 the extra house at Stamford road planning application has been withdrawn by the developer.
- S20/1820 North Witham children's home has been
- provisionally refused pending further reports.

 S20/0345 The KWR application to move their business to the new location Bridge End Road Colsterworth is still waiting to come back to committee having been deferred.
- Thank you for the Highways report regarding 50mph speed limit on the average speed camera-controlled section of the A1.
- I support all the observations of the Highways and Footpaths Group but the 50mph proposal was an interim safety measure rather than instead of the engineering measures the group suggested which could be years away. This section of the A1 is the only one left with busy crossing points, private drive and field access points and no reduced speed limit.

County Councillor B Adams Reported:

District Councillor B Adams started by thanking Graham Kiely and Mo Taylor for organising the recent a litter pick. Over 100 orange bags of litter and unpleasant bottles containing urine were collected from the A1 Flyover and Stamford Road. Cllr Adams stated that he was happy to continue support the litter picks and asked that a letter of thanks from the Parish Council be sent to both Graham and Mo.

- County wise meetings are on hold until after the local elections in May.
- The Government are looking at Unitary Authorities, a short discussion took place on how that might affect Parish Councils in the
- The North Witham HGV access and A1 issues were discussed, and Cllr Adams said he and Cllr Bellamy were continuing to pressure the County Council and Gareth Davis MP on these issues.
- Derelict Garage, High Street, Colsterworth. Contact has been made with the family of the resident with historic ownership of the derelict garage who is starting the process to formalise ownership with HM Land Registry.
- Remote Meeting legislation expires on 6th May 2021. The Parish Council is awaiting further guidance on this.
- Notification of received of the Annual Governance and Accountability Returns (AGAR) for 2020-2021. Submission deadline 02/07/2021. Annual Internal Audit arranged for early April.

- On Wednesday 24th March 2021, the Cemetery Inspection at Old Post Lane Cemetery was carried out with the Clerk and Cllr's C Russell and C Hainsworth. The Clerk to follow up with grave owners/ descendants of unstable memorials.
- SKDC have confirmed that they are looking into improving the illumination at Bridge End.

NATURAL HISTORY BULLETIN

In spite of sharp frosts at night, sunny days have meant that by the third week in April spring is truly here. Fieldfares and Redwings have gone and the first of the warblers are back. The Chiffchaff was heard at the end of March. The first Swallow was reported on 12th April and House Martins seen the day before. The dawn chorus has increased in volume and in the daylight hours birds are busy building nests. A blackbird, for instance was watched as it repeatedly visited a pond to dip dried plant remains in the water. A wren was seen disappearing behind a log with a beak full of moss. Butterflies which emerged earlier in the year, having overwintered as adults (e.g. Brimstone, Peacock, Small Tortoiseshell and Comma) were joined by those which had just emerged from a chrysalis – Small White (29/3/21) and Orange Tip (13/4/21). Next to look for are the Holly Blue and the Speckled Wood. Ladybirds (7-spot) have been abundant. Amongst them have been the black form of the smaller 2-spot Ladybird. Fortunately there are no reports of the Harlequin Ladybird an invasive alien.



For those interested in Bees and the time to take a closer look, gardens have provided the opportunity to find about a wide range of species. It is possible to find six kinds of Bumble Bee if there are a range of nesting places, sunny sheltered corners and flowers with available nectar and pollen. The three earliest to arrive this year were the Buff-tailed (the largest and most frequent) the White Tailed (similar

but smaller) and the Tree Bumble Bee (a recent arrival in this country and spreading fast). Next the Red-tailed and Carder Bees. The last named has a ginger thorax and is long tongued so that it can reach into tubular flowers. The Early Garden Bee doesn't live up to its name but it may be overlooked as it has a striped body rather like two of the other species. By mid April the solitary bees begin to appear – unlike the social bees which divide the community's females into Queen and workers the female starts the nest and continues to tend the young from eggs she has laid. Three Andrena spp. easier to identify than most have been observed in April. The Tawny Mason Bee emerged from bee hotels where it is the most frequent resident. It has orange hairs on both its abdomen and thorax. Another bee covered in orange hairs is the Tawny Mining Bee (a) which is an important pollinator of currants and gooseberries. A third kind of solitary bee is first noted by the volcano shaped mounds where it has excavated its nests. It has an orange thorax and an orange tip to its abdomen. These solitary bees may be even more important pollinaters in the garden than the more noticeable Bumble and Honey Bees



Reports of hedgehogs this month have come from both observations on trail cams but in one case from checking security cameras! Our mammals are so elusive that we have to rely on tracks trails and signs. The find of the month must be of tracks near the River Witham of otter (b) Their five-toed prints are distinctive, claw marks showing near the tip of the pads (unlike the badger). They may well leave the impression of their sturdy tail as it slides on the ground

behind them. In the 1960s they were scarce everywhere and by the 1980s were declared extinct in Lincolnshire. Their return here is by a series of introductions from Norfolk but their continued existence depends, amongst other things, on good water quality in the rivers. Unlike coastal otters the river otters are nocturnal and easily disturbed by man (and dogs).



To Look For in May

Cowslips (c) Are there less of them this year, and with fewer flowers and shorter stems as reported in the press? The drawing shows a 'normal' one. Cuckoos – usually heard for the first time in Twyford Wood. Skipper Butterflies, Common Blues. Frogs – How are the tadpoles doing as they grow their legs and change from a vegetarian diet to feeding on minute animals?



Advance road works notice from Lincolnshire County Council (LCC).

B676, Stainby Road, Highfield Bridge, Colsterworth, Lincolnshire Anticipated start date for these works is 21/06/21 and is to last for 3 weeks



Lincolnshire County Councils intention to carry out maintenance works to the above structure, the location of which is shown on the above plan.

After carrying out recent inspections it has been identified that the bridge is in need of maintenance. The existing masonry wingwalls and abutments on both sides of the bridge have deteriorated and have large cracks in places. LCC are proposing to repair the defects by replacing and repointing the masonry where necessary which will help to prolong the life of the structure.

The anticipated start date for these works is 21/06/21 and is to last for 3 weeks. These dates and timescales are subject to change depending on the current Covid 19 pandemic, the availability of our term maintenance contractor and progress on this site and others.

At this stage in the design it is anticipated that we will require minimal traffic management throughout the works, with traffic signals only being required when materials/equipment are delivered or removed to or from site.




