Minutes of the remote Parish Council meeting held on Tuesday 6th April 2021

Public Forum

There were three members of the public present, who spoke in support of the following two events/projects:-**Pop up create, Arts Activity Day Saturday 22nd May 2021**:

There were two speakers, the first to speak was a local creative producer who explained that Colsterworth was one of five Villages nominated by South Kesteven District Council (S.K.D.C.) that he had been invited to deliver an Arts Day for. The proposed date of the Arts Day is Saturday 22nd May 2021, between 9am and 2pm. The organiser's concept is that the event will take place outside as they are aware that some COVID-19 restrictions may still be in place.

The second representative to speak explained that the Arts Day would take place in three strands: -

- 1. Organised busking acts moving around the Village.
- 2. Post Card Project celebrating the Village and local area.
- 3. Local artists doing a project where packs can be sent out to celebrate Colsterworth and the identity of the Village.

The organisers explained that they were looking no other commitment from the Parish Council other than for their support and enthusiasm to promote the event in Colsterworth. Both speakers took questions from the Councillors who suggested that the Clerk contact local artists, musicians, Woolsthorpe Manor and the Nature Trail Ranger on behalf of the organisers to give them the opportunity to contact the organisers and join in the community event. Chair to the Councillor C Hainsworth liked the idea saying it was an opportunity to raise the spirits of the Community.

Isaac Newton Project: -

The Reverend Neil Griffiths summarised the Isaac Newton Project to date and provided a vision of its future. He said that the Arts Day linked in well with the Isaac Newton Project for Community Events. The four focusses for the Church are: -

- 1. For flexible modern worship.
- 2. Create a modern community space, flexible for learning and community events.
- 3. Create an education space to learn about the church and the Village.
- 4. Create a space that recognises our heritage and links to Sir Isaac Newton.

After an unsuccessful application to the 'Heritage Lottery Fund' in 2020 they are now looking towards a phased approach for funding.

Phase 1: Approximately £70,000 to have running water/sewage, bathroom facilities and a servery. Removing some pews and re-siting the Font to the corner giving a much more flexible space. To fund this work funding bids have been made and further bids are planned, and some funds have already been secured Once phase one is complete the Church will be better able to meet the needs of the community post COVID-19.

Cllr E O'Neil suggested linking in with Woolsthorpe Manor and the Reverend explained a leaflet had already been designed with a map for visitors to follow from Woolsthorpe Manor to the Church and visa-versa.

The Public Session was extended to 19.59hrs to allow the members of the public to speak.
