

Chair to the Council Caroline Hainsworth welcomed everyone to the meeting and said it was nice to see that everyone was on board with Zoom and that she had nothing to report other than there was a full agenda.

County/District Councillor Report

District Councillor Dave Bellamy reported:

Councillor Hainsworth stated that the Highways & Footpaths report had already captured the traffic issues on the High Street for over two years and were already with Lincolnshire Highways Department and

County Council finances - Although the County Council's finances were better than many the financial implications of the COVID-19 pandemic were

New Highways Contractors – Initial reports had been good but there were now some discrepancies which Councillor Adams said he would take forward. \$18/2237/PL/0076/18 Skillington Quarry Planning Decision with conditions – A short discussion took place and Councillor Adams explained that H.G.V. traffic pinch points had been identified in the Colsterworth and District Parish. There should be increased monitoring by the Police, Lincolnshire Road Safety Partnership (L.R.S.P.) and the quarry Operations Management. Councillor Hainsworth offered to assist with compiling data, photographs etc. Councillor Adams emphasized the importance of residents to be vigilant and report any breaches of the conditions imposed.

Updates for Council administration

- 1. Chris Pool was Co-opted as Councillor for Gunby and Stainby by a unanimous vote.
- 2. Thank you to Mark Ramage who has stood down as a Councillor for his hard work with various areas of Council business and in particular the work he has put into the War Memorial Project.
- 3. Code of Conduct, Communications Policy, Social Media Policy & Financial
- Reserves Policy were unanimously approved.

  4. The request of a £150 contribution towards the cost of maintaining the churchyard at St. Peter's, Stainby was unanimously approved subject to invoices being provided. This is an open Churchyard and the grass cutting is still the responsibility of the Parish Council.
- 5. It was unanimously approved for Chris Kennedy of Roll and Scroll to donate and fit the following:
- •A 4ft Captain Tom bench for Bourne road to replace the one that has fallen into disrepair. Nil cost to the PC.
- •A 6ft blue NHS bench, with commemorative brass plaque, for all those that lost their lives during the pandemic. It is proposed to replace the existing serviceable bench between the doctor's surgery and the pub. The serviceable bench can be relocated, this would be at the Parish Council cost in the region of 100 if the bench were to be kept, if not then nil cost to the PC 6. A request for two extra dog waste bins was voted against by a majority and agreed to forward agenda to the September meeting to explore an alternative solution.

### **Allotments**

A request for allotment holders to use hosepipes to water the allotments in addition to filling the water buts was unanimously approved on a trial basis.

With the water usage to be reviewed in January 2021 in line with the allotment rent review or remove the facility if the water cost is deemed excessive.

Play Areas

The annual Wicksteed Inspection was carried out which recommended that the play area at Old Post Lane remained closed until a repair had been made to a climbing rope. The Clerk and Councillors made an operational check and risk assessment of each play areas. Colster Way, Woolsthorpe Road and North Witham play areas were opened by the Clerk on Sunday 12th July and COVID-19 guidance information was displayed at each site and on the website.

The Nature Trail

Thank you to Kevin Russell (KWR) who provided a tree surgeon at no cost to the Parish Council to cut down some large trees at the Bridge End of the Nature Trail. The volunteers used the tree trunks to make a seating area.

Clerks Report

- 1. Overgrown hedge and footpath Water Lane outside Woolsthorpe Manor. The National Trust were contacted, and arrangements made to tidy up the footpath and cut back the hedge after nesting season. For now, any long unsightly branches will be cut back.

### Colsterworth war memorial receives a funding boost from War Memorials Trust Grants Scheme

Colsterworth war memorial benefits from a grant of £1500 from War Memorials Trust Grants Scheme. The money enabled an investigation to understand and formulate a repair strategy for the accelerated stone loss at base level. Water appears to be leaching through the base and is causing the stone to split and shear. The investigation aimed to understand the construction of the plinth and the source of the water ingress. Over the course of a day, one side of the plinth was dismantled under the supervision PPIY architects. The focus of the investigation was on the lowest level and of the foundation of the memorial. Following these investigations, a report was produced outlining the threats to our war memorial allowing the Parish Council to consider measures to repair and protect the 101-year-old Grade II

Those involved in the project are PPIY Architects, Colsterworth and District Parish Council, War Memorials Trust and Colsterworth Festival of Remembrance.

Frances Moreton, Director, War Memorials Trust said, "War memorials are a link between previous generations, ours and those who follow us. They enable us to pay tribute to the sacrifices of so many. War Memorials Trust is delighted to support this project and assist the community to improve the condition of the war memorial. If anyone knows of any other war memorials in need of help please contact the charity or, if you believe in the importance of our work, support us as the charity can only give further grants if it raises enough money."



# NATURAL HISTORY BULLETIN


The Marbled White Butterfly is back. It was seen for the first time in Woolsthorpe last year. On 12th July this year 5 were reported in the same area again and several have been seen since on the Roadside Nature Reserve and the adjacent Nature Trail. Marbled Whites lay their eggs on grasses and the caterpillars will hibernate whilst still small. They continue their growth in the spring until they pupate on the ground. They are single brooded and so rely on good weather in the breeding season of June and July.





The meadow on the Nature Trail is now a very good habitat for butterflies. In July adults of Small, Large and Green-veined Whites, Large Skipper, Small Copper, Small Tortoiseshell, Peacock, Meadow and Hedge Brown were flying and feeding

there. The abundance of Field Scabious and the two Knapweeds were a favourite source of nectar for them and for the many Bumble Bees. The yellow members of the dandelion family were in flower with a diversity of species including, Cat's Ear, Mouse Ear Hawkweed, Rough Hawkbit and Hawkweed species which only specialists in this group can identify.



Tall plants of Wild Lettuce (Lactuca serriola) were noted on waysides. This plant, shown in the sketch, is also known as the compass plant because its large serrated edged leaves always turn in a north-south plane. Our culinary lettuce is derived from another species, but shares its mildly soporific properties with the wild plant, used as a sedative by herbalists. Wild Parsnip (Pastinaca sativa) has yellow umbels of flowers out in July. Its specific name 'sativa' means a plant cultivated for use and suggests that it was developed into our vegetable parsnip. The roots of the wild plant are stringy but the leaves smell of parsnip. Wild carrot

(Daucus carota) doesn't have tasty orange roots and carrots were developed from a Mediterranean species of Daucus. Chicory has flowered this month, an 'adventive' (turning up in unexpected places), it is a relic of a time when it was grown in cottage gardens and the leaves blanched by tying them together. Fennel used for flavouring as well as the roots eaten, is also is in flower on verges. So many of our wild plants used for food, medicine, and herbs remain still in uncultivated corners.

Young swifts flew for the first time this month. On 17th July there was a sudden increase in numbers flying over gardens in Woolsthorpe. By 20th July the numbers had dropped. The adults had begun their long journey to their winter home. The young birds will follow when they have built up food reserves and strengthened muscles. Remarkably they will find their own way, these birds which live their lives in the air, even sleeping on the wing. They are not able to take off from the ground so their nesting places are always high up. To Look for in August By now we are getting to know visitors to our gardens as individuals, especially when they have something different in their appearance or behaviour. Observations this month include hedgehogs which come in a trio to squabble and feed at a dish put out for them. The Wood Mouse who is out and about in the patch of herbs near a house at a regular time in the evening (near the bird feeder). The blackbird with the white feather, whose daily activity can be followed amongst more anonymous males. There will be so much more going on in August and all records and observations are greatly appreciated.
