Due to the ongoing medical emergency CAD Parish Council will be making provision first and foremost to protect the health and well being of Parishioners along with their staff and Councillors. The situation is changing on a regular basis and measures have been implemented with updates provided to Councillors (last Update: Version 3/24th May 2020). This has been done with the full guidance from central

government, NALC and LALC including changes in legislation to hold remote meetings to ensure business continuity and maintain services at this time.

Public Forum

There were no members of the public in attendance.

Chairperson Remarks

Chair of the Council Caroline Hainsworth thanked everyone for joining the meeting. She explained that at this time much Parish Council work had been going on in the background and was ongoing.

County/District Councillor Report

District Councillor Dave Bellamy reported :-Planning Meetings had increased from 1 a week to 2 a week from this month.

County Councillor Bob Adams reported :-

Things District wise were getting off the ground with virtual meetings. Regarding the Plan, this was is ongoing process.

The change of contract for road repairs was business as usual.

The S20/0129 Concrete Block planning application was still in open for comments. Councillor Hainsworth confirmed that the Parish Council had already submitted their comments.

Reminded the Council that funding was available for groups helping with the current COVID-19 pandemic.

Updates for Council administration

1. The Draft Code of Conduct - It was unanimously agreed to defer to a later meeting to be consulted along with the Social Media and Communications policy.

2. Gardeners and Allotment holders Grant Request. Unanimously agreed the £100 grant for the Church Troughs for the winter 2020 season and set a budget of £200 to be reviewed annually by the Council on request by the Council grant application process.

3. Request to have three flag poles sited at the War Memorial Garden. Unanimously agreed to defer this until the War Memorial Project was finished.

Overgrown footpath Bowls club to Rope Walk. Unanimously agreed for the Člerk to inform the homeowner that the work would take place in September and for the Clerk to seek a second fixed price quotation.

5. Chairpersons Allowance. Unanimously agreed to award £125 to the Chair of the Council Caroline Hainsworth.

Risk exception Report

The Report had been reinstated as a precaution due to the COVID-19 Pandemic. It was unanimously agreed that there was no cause for concern.

Finance

Accounts for payment were approved by Council.

Playgrounds remain closed - Playgrounds at Colster Way, Old Post Lane, Woolsthorpe Road and North Witham remain closed until further notice as per the Government guidance.

Clerks Report

1. Replacement foot bridge planned for North Witham foot bridge. Diversion route planned. From 7th July 2020 for approximately 3 weeks.

2. The Clerk has made arrangements for the In-Touch magazine to be delivered by new and existing volunteers.

3. The War Memorial Bench made and donated by Chris Kennedy of Roll and Scroll has been fitted at North Witham. Many thanks to Chris's generosity. He has kindly made another offer of a donation of an NHS/Key-worker (Blue) bench to replace the one between the doctors surgery and the pub. He is mindful that the one currently there is in a very good condition and so proposes moving that one to Bourne Road to replace the one there that is in poor condition.

4. The Parish Council has been awarded £500 from the Councillor Fund to cover associated costs incurred by COVID-19 pandemic. Thank you to Councillor Bob Adams.

5. The poppy wreaths from the War Memorial have been removed and placed in the St John the Baptist Church.

6. The Community Cleaners have reported that the dog waste bin which was replaced on the Nature Trail close to the Woolsthorpe play area cannot cope with the amount of dog waste bags being deposited.

When the bin is full dog waste bags are left on the ground for the Community Cleaners to pick up. The Clerk will arrange for the old dog waste bin to be sited in the locality to take the excess bags. The bin will be adapted so that the weight of the dog waste does not break the extra strong black bags which happened previously. The Parish Council acknowledged the difficulties that the Community Cleaners had when removing the black bags from the large bins which regularly split due to the volume/weight of the contents. The Cleaners then manually picked up the waste bags and placed them into two separate black bags for removal. The smaller bins are more manageable and hygienic.

NATURAL HISTORY BULLETIN

At the beginning of June we were at the end of nearly three weeks of hot, dry weather. On the 4th June temperatures dropped ten degrees to 11C and days of rain began. It is still unsettled at the time of writing (20/6/20). There have been fewer butterfly records - Common Blue, Meadow Brown, Small and Large Skippers and newly emerged Small Tortoiseshells and Red Admirals. Red and Black Cinnabar Moths are doing well. And on the limestone verges Chimney Sweep and Lattice Heath Moths have been seen. On cool days the value of Bumble Bees is evident. They are out pollinating the flowers, including those of fruit and vegetables when it is too cool for many other insects to fly. A wasp drew attention to itself by falling into someone's beer. Tranquil enough usually (especially under the influence?) it is very aggressive when its nest, in tall bushes, is disturbed. As sufferers of hay fever will know to their cost, June is a month of flowering grasses. Pollinated by wind their long anthers hang free as the flower opens. Their vast numbers of pollen grains have about twenty minutes when dispersal is effective. Interest is added to a walk by noting the time of day each species is open. Grasses can tell the time. Timothy is open at the break of day. Perennial Rye opens at noon, after Cocksfoot and before Tall Oat, all before the Bents which are late afternoon. In this way the pollen load is spread throughout the day. June is also the month for the flowers of limestone verges. Many belong to the pea family - Bird's Foot trefoil, Common, Bush and Kidney Vetch, Red, White and Zigzag Clovers, Hop Trefoil and Black Medick. (See the illustration). Salad Burnet, Wild Liquorice, Bee Orchids and Pyramidal Orchids are amongst the scarcer plants found on our two Lincolnshire Trust Roadside Nature Reserves. Bee Orchids are back on various sites around Colster Way where

they are allowed to grow by those who value them more than a cut lawn. An added interest in built up areas is plants associated with old walls. Ivy leaved Toadflax, Yellow Corydalis and Petty Spurge are three plants where ants aid dispersal. They all have seeds with an oily appendage, attractive to ants. They carry these away, not damaging the seed. The Ivy leaved Toadflax has a belt and braces approach to dispersal since its fruits are on stems which turn away from light and so can bury the seeds in the wall. Red Valerian is usually removed from walls where its roots are damaging. A garden escape, it was once all red but has evolved at the base of walls with pink, mauve or even white forms. Thriving in thin dry soils it is attractive to butterflies and the Humming Bird Hawk Moth. Snapdragon also found on walls and gone wild from gardens revert to their original pink forms with a yellow 'throat' Something which has arisen from the

lockdown is the time spent by some in observing garden birds, as individuals and their behaviour. A Jackdaw raised by hand after being found in a poor condition after falling from a nest, has thrived and is reaching the stage when it will fly after being given exercises to strengthen its wings, encouraging it to flap them as its siblings would be doing in the trees before fledging. A photograph sent of some froglets kept separate from the main pond as tadpoles is particularly cheering in a year when some ponds have been unsuccessful.

To Look For in July. There has never been a better time to not only see what is about but what it is doing (and this applies to plants too). If you share some of this with the rest of us it will not only add to our enjoyment, but to our understanding of plants and animals in our parish.
