



NATURAL HISTORY BULLETIN

April was exceptionally dry with night frosts which continued into May when more extremes, this time of rainfall and high winds, combined to affect butterflies. Those which had overwintered as adults and appeared before April, like the Small Tortoiseshell, were on the wing on favourable days. The exception seems to be the Red Admiral.



This was once only a migrant to this country. Now it seems it does not withstand prolonged winters but the populations may be renewed this summer. Next of the butterflies to emerge are those which overwinter as a chrysalis. They benefit from frosts which kill any parasites at the early stages of development. There was a good emergence of Orange Tips, but the weather in May has meant that there have been no clouds of them on roadside verges, but only singletons in sunny gardens at the time of writing (21May 2021).


Holly Blues have not been reported. They are unique in laying eggs on two food plants - Holly in May and Ivy in late July and August when the first broods have become adults. In both cases the emerging caterpillars feed, not on the leaves but the flowers. With such specific requirements Holly Blue populations can crash in some years. They can be mistaken for the later emerging Common Blues which can be seen flying throughout the summer. These feed on various members of the pea family. Holly Blues

rest with wings folded showing pale blue underwings with tiny black dots. If a Common Blue can be observed with wings folded it has patterned wings, tinged with orange and larger rows of black spots surrounded with white. The male upper wings are not plain blue but brown and can be mistaken for the Brown Argus, a much scarcer species of limestone grassland



Our scarcest butterflies are the Dingy and Grizzled Skippers. These were first reported on 8th and 6th May a fortnight later than last year. They have a very short flight period and are one brooded. For those of us who record the earliest flowering dates of wild flowers it has been interesting to note that these have also lagged behind this year by about a fortnight. Some like the celandines, cowslips and dandelions have continued to flower later and provided spectacular displays on the verges.





The Dawn Chorus is at its peak in May. In recent years some species have been absent – the Turtle Dove, the Nightingale and several warblers from our woods. From our gardens we hear the cuckoo less. Other birds continue to sing and it is difficult to know if the Song Thrush, whose numbers are declining, is still trying to attract a mate as the summer approaches. For many of us it is the blackbird which is the songster of Spring, who continues into summer and into the moult with a great variety of melodies and calls much of which cannot be clearly assigned either to mating or to holding territory.

To Look for In June. You might like to pay special attention to the butterflies lots more to come especially the usually abundant Hedge and Meadow Browns and Ringlets and a new speciality, the Marbled White. More finches have been reported recently in gardens which is a very welcome sign and we have familiar garden birds which by observing carefully we can learn more about their behaviour. 
