All Councillors then introduced themselves to the members of the public who then stayed beyond the public forum to observe the meeting.

Chair to the Council Caroline Hainsworth welcomed everyone to the meeting and started by saying this was a landmark meeting by being the first face to face meeting of the Parish Council apart from the Annual Parish meeting on 21st May 2021 since the easing of lockdown restrictions in May 2021.

Mr Kenneth Vickers and Mr Ian Johnson were unanimously Coopted as Parish Councillors for Colsterworth and District.

Accounts for payment were approved by Council.

#### /District Councillor Report County

#### County Councillor Adams reported the following

District wise there had been numerous changes in Committees. There were too many potholes, not enough repairs and that the contractors were struggling to keep up with the repairs required.

The biggest costs to the Council were in Social Care and Children's Services.

A short discussion took place around the future of hospitals and private care.

Councillor J Skelton raised a question for Councillor Adams on Planning Enforcement staffing levels to which Councillor Adams confirmed that new members to the team had been appointed.

The Clerk has registered the 14th November Remembrance 3 Service event with Lincolnshire County Council (LCC) Ref No 1072766. The Clerk has registered for the LCC Remembrance Service Awareness training to be delivered in October 2021. Date TBC by LCC.

Wicksteed Play Area inspections are scheduled to be being 4. completed in June 2021.

Thank you to the volunteers who completed a litter pick on the 6. High Dyke and footpath 7 area close to the China Moon.

The blocked dyke/soak away on Bourne Road is blocked by 7 debris has been reported to SKDC. District Councillor Bellamy is aware of flooding implications with Bourne Road estate and is following up with this. The Clerk has created a page of remembrance on the Parish

#### **General Correspondence**

#### Nature Trail

1. It was unanimously approved to make an application to the SK Community Fund up to a maximum of £5,000 with the Parish Council committing to 20% or £1,000 maximum match funding for repairs to the Nature Trail steps and railings. Application closing date 23rd July 2021.

It was unanimously approved to enter the Lincolnshire 2. Environmental Awards 2021 to establish a new entrance and green space at the Bridge End entry to the old village by-pass. First prize £4,000, two

runners up prizes, each £500 halved in two tranches, with the remainder given in March 2022 when good initial progress has been evidenced. Application closing date 31st July 2021.

# NATURAL HISTORY Bulletin

Our parishes are important for the remnants of limestone grassland which have survived development of roads, housing, quarrying and agriculture. None of these has been entirely negative. Roads have left verges with scarce plants. Quarrying left bare limestone where plants which couldn't competition survived. Sadly Glebe quarry was filled in years ago and more recently others have gone to landfill, but pockets remain for surprises like woolly thistle and bladder campion. In some cases where grassland has gone under the plough, conservation headlands have been left. Sheep grazing is also sympathetic to a diversity of plants. Housing development would seem to leave no room for scarce native plants and for the butterflies and other insects which depend on them. Part of the Colster Way estate was built over ancient grassland, remnants of which were left in lawns and verges. At the end of June you will see an area beautiful with white oxeye daisies above yellow trefoils hiding the bee orchids. This is thanks to the efforts of one person who recognised what was coming up in front of his own house. He persisted over many years, and changes in householders to persuade some of his neighbours to leave areas unmown until later in the year. The result is glorious.

The River Witham as it flows from its source at South Witham, through North Witham and Colsterworth and on to Grantham is special. It flows clear and supports life which cannot survive pollutants, or the introduction of nonnative species. The vulnerable native crayfish lives here, water voles have survived an influx of mink, the insect life is food for the grey wagtails which nest on its banks. Each pollution incident is a grave threat as is the introduction of aggressive non-native species like the signal crayfish. Dead white crayfish were found in Colsterworth this June and this was reported to the Environment Agency. There did not seem to be evidence of pollution. The cause may have been the combination of hot weather and shallow water driving out oxygen from the water but there is also the fear that Signal Crayfish have got in. Cinnabar were in gardens and the caterpillars of web spinning moths like the lackey were not welcome on garden shrubs.

**To Look for in July.** The day the newly fledged Swifts join their parents in the sky before the latter leave on migration. Dragon and Damselflies. Any sightings of cuckoos, which also leave early and have



June can be overwhelming for the abundance of flowers, insects and young birds. Yellow Rattle, which is a hemiparasite and reduces the success of vigorous grasses, is welcome on the Protected Roadside Verges. In the gardens reports of nesting robins, wrens, blackbirds, starlings, jackdaws, blue and great tits, chaffinch and goldfinch, collared doves and wood pigeons. By third week of June many rearing second broods. The blackbirds have provided much interest and enjoyment with their songs continuing after others have fallen silent. An anxious watch is on for House martins and swallows. Last year early broods failed because not enough mud for nest building. This year cool wet weather meant insufficient insect food. Swifts fortunately returned in numbers
