NATURAL HISTORY BULLETIN



The drawing of the Cormorant is from a photograph taken looking towards the River Witham from the Stamford Road. It was later joined by three more and two Red Kites, all in the same tree. The presence of Cormorants, Heron, and Little Egrets beside the River Witham bears testimony to the quality of the water, supporting as it does both fish and a wide variety of invertebrates. The River Witham at Colsterworth is near its source at South Witham. As it flows south through built up areas it is vulnerable to pollution as we have seen in the past. Jackdaws, displaced both from a tree which has been felled and from nesting sites in chimneys which have been capped, are having a restless time whilst they explore other sites, including an owl box. Bird song has begun. A Song Thrush has been heard since January. Blackbirds, Great Tits and even a Skylark. A nest started in a tree is that of a Chaffinch which often begins to build before there is any leaf cover. The Robins winter song has changed and two seen together, without fighting, were probably a pair. In the same garden there was a sudden influx of 10 Blue Tits, though elsewhere they seem to have been less frequent in gardens than previous years. A dark form of the Queen Buff-

tailed Bumble Bee appeared in one garden on the 1st February. It was feeding on a winter honeysuckle and was believed to have spent night in dense vegetation behind on a south facing wall. It was seen for two or three days but not since and no other reports of bees have been sent in.

records. Please don't overlook the "common" things _any insects, amphibians, (frogs, newts and toads) reptiles (lizards, grass snakes, slow worms), birds and mammals _so many of which are 'hanging on by a thread'. I do not say this lightly, but after looking back over more than 20 years of records in our parishes. I know that so many of you are interested. Even if you haven't the opportunity to walk, garden records count for more each year.

A number of the earliest flowering plants in our parishes belong to the Buttercup family. Some like the Winter Aconite and the Lesser Celandine are buttercup like. However search of the flowers on mild, sunny days has so far (February 20th) found no visitors, not flies, beetles nor bees.




