There were two members of the public present. The first gave thanks for the opportunity to speak regarding the ongoing problem of the height, weight and width of Heavy Goods Vehicles (H.G.V.s) travelling up and down Church Street, North Witham which was causing concern due to the shallow foundations of their property. The main problem being the angle of turn. The resident stated that she had contacted a local business to request that their vehicles approach from their end of Church Street but when they follow their SATNAVs damage has been caused at roof level. They also stated that on several occasions over the last ten years HGV's had caused damage to their property. They had made two house insurance claims since 2019 and the issue is now affecting their health. The resident thanked County Councillor Bob Adams for his visit and support earlier in the year.

Councillor J Clark followed on by speaking with experience and knowledge about the Road Traffic industry and vehicle weight limit restrictions including 'Environmental' limits. Councillor J Clark also stated that in 2019 he had reported an issue to the Police which was not acted on and the actions he had taken on behalf of the residents of North Witham escalating these to Lincolnshire County Council (LCC) and the local member of Parliament.

The second member of the public spoke requesting that the Parish Council put pressure on LCC to place 'No H.G.V.' signs at area in question at North Witham.

District Councillor D Bellamy agreed to take the issue forward with the officer dealing with the case at LCC.

Councillor C Hainsworth summarised that the issue would be taken forward with LCC.

PROJECT OPENS - NORTH WITHAM PLAY AREA

The refurbished play area at North Witham is now open following the final sign off by the Colsterworth and District Parish Council at its meeting on 07 September 2021

This has been made possible due to a grant of £31,177 from FCC Communities Foundation.

Colsterworth and District Parish Council contributed nearly £4,000 to the scheme and provided administrative and financial management to the project. Volunteers from the community gave up hours of their time in planning, consulting and working on the site with the contractors.

The money has been used to buy new play equipment at the North Witham Village Hall. The site has been re-surfaced and surrounding area tidied up and made safe to make it an attractive and usable space with new equipment brought up to current standards that are modern, appealing, and





NATURAL HISTORY



The foresters name "tree rat" for the Grey Squirrel (A) is at odds with this animal's charming ways and attractive appearance. The movements of its bushy tail which is almost as long as its body can define its personality and mood as it helps propel it through a sequence of agile movements. Added to this it has a cute face with rounded eyes and hand-like paws as it handles its food. The problem is that its living requirements conflict with our own. It will destroy or distort young trees with its nibblings and pillage the fruit and nuts in our gardens, going to great lengths to reach bird food that we think we have protected. In September a Grey Squirrel found a Hazel tree at the bottom of a Woolsthorpe garden. Presumably it told its friends and each morning they can be seen running up and down on the fence tops. Then they come down into the gardens with a stash of nuts, seeming to decide which to eat and which to bury. They rarely find them all again and in time there will be enough seedlings to grow a hedge.



A few Yellow Toadflax (B) will still be in flower in October. Like a miniature snapdragon in creams and deep yellow, its elegant shape enhanced by a long fluted base in which the nectar is found. However the plants success is not dependant on visiting insects but on its exceptional ability to reproduce by spreading underground roots. Patches of the plant along the Nature Trail may have started from a central seedling. The resulting plants will all be clones of the parent, that is genetically identical. They will produce seeds but fewer than in plants of mixed parentage and studies have shown poor germination of these. Sitting outside in the sunshine in September observations were made of bees visiting Garden Antirrhinums (also called snapdragons). The large Buff-tailed Bumble Bee sat on the bottom lip and pushed head first into the opening created. There followed much 'bumbling' as the bee, now filling the closed flower turned round and emerged head first above the lip again. The Common Carder, a slightly smaller Bumble Bee, tried to enter using the same technique but could only just gets its head in. It moved on to a more accommodating fuchsia bush. Solitary bees, out in force, made only the briefest attempt before joining a host of their kinds exploring the tiny pink flowers of a Sedum.

A photo was sent in of a Garden Carpet Moth which lays eggs on plants which are members of the Cabbage Family.



Another photo titled correctly 'a picture fly' (C) was of one distinctly marked with a zig-zag pattern. It lays eggs in thistle stems causing the stem to swell into a gall, storing food for the emergent grubs which continue living in the stem until the next summer when the adult, winged flies

Reports of a single Tawny Owl hooting in the evening have come from three different areas in Colsterworth, probably of the same owl. Grey Wagtails have been seen near the River Witham and it is hoped they have produced young this year. The only late observation of House Martins was of them feeding in evening above Woolsthorpe road on 5th September, one of the few fine evenings for some time.

To Look for in October. There have been few sightings of gill fungi, and if anyone sees either Swallows or House Martins these late records would be important. Galls on plants are much in evidence at this time of year. A dramatic one on young wild roses is a mass of bushy red hairs. Still dragonflies about but the first of the winter migrant birds will be returning. As gardens are cleared you may discover frogs, toads, newts going into hibernation. 
