

NATURAL HISTORY BULLETIN

At the beginning of October a rabbit was found dead on the side of the road in Woolsthorpe, killed it seemed by a car. Fifteen years ago when this bulletin was started, this would not have been worthy of comment. Since then cars may have increased but rabbit numbers have decreased dramatically. Myxamatosis, a disease carried by fleas wiped out whole populatins in the 1950s. Recovery was gradual as survival rates increased, espescially in rabbits which lived a less subterranean life. These "superbunnies" continued to produce offspring even through the milder winters. Numbers built up in the U.K. to an estimated 37.5 million. Since then a new and fatal variant of a disease, rabbit haemorrhagic disease (RDH) reduced the population to around I million. Naturalists were asked to report any sightings. Three years ago there was no evidence of them on either the Nature Trail of the Roadside Nature Reserves – our most closely monitored sites. Before that any road kills were quickly "mopped up" by red kites which visited the landfill site before it was filled in. The rabbit is important as a close grazer of diverse grassland sites on poor soils. It leaves patches of bare ground where small, scarce and fragile flowering plants can survive. On the Nature Trail these included lichens of two groups. The dog lichens look like fallen grey leaves but with upturned edges which bear fruits. The reindeer lichens, with shapes like antlers and which provide their namesake with



food in the Arctic have brown or red fruits in tiny cups. Over the last two or three years they have all but disappeared under the grass. No rabbits, no ground lichens and no rabbits fewer stoats who rely on them as prey.

This year the height and lush growth of plants has been remarkable. In the gardens in late summer fifteen foot sunflowers, Michaelmas Daisies on long stems with lower leaves browned in their shade, Crocosmia in thickets of leaves. Those responsible for keeping pathways open, trees safe and grass cut have had extra work. On the plus side an Indian summer has meant butterflies, bees, hoverflies and other attractive insects have been on the late flowers. Photos have been sent in of rose sawfly caterpillars, comma butterflies, an oak bush cricketall from gardens. Also from the Nature trail the pale tussock moth caterpillar which feeds on a variety of deciduous trees.

Like ants, mass emergence of winged insect adults prior to mating makes for a main event. There have been recent ones including of the Common cranefly, Tipula paludosa. These live in grassland as grubs called leatherjackets where they pupate

They pull themselves out of the ground where the males mate almost immediately with the females, they do not feed as adults but may gather on walls to sun and come into houses at night attracted by light.

David Attenborough's latest series shows exotic insects being fed prey by males, anxious to keep them occupied whilst they mate and so avoid being eaten themselves. There are insects in Britain which do the same. They range from ones who just give a meal, through those who wrap the meal up in ever more complex parcels to the ultimate solution of an elaborate parcel with nothing in it. Now wouldn't that be something to see?

To Look For in November. Rabbits – out in the daytime, see in car lights at night, evidence in droppings (currants). The arrival of winter birds – redwings, fieldfare, waxwings. COMMUNITY SPEED WATCH RESUMES

The village Community Speed Watch teams have restarted following the Covid closure. We just want to assure you that we are there to remind you of the village speed limits and show we care for everyone in the community. How are you doing?

In the 6 months to February last year we monitored 763 vehicles and logged 77 vehicles exceeding the limit. Thirty Four were going fast enough to warrant a letter from the police and a further 6 were logged a second time with one persistent speeder receiving a visit from the police.

From this September a further 205 vehicles were monitored with 19 exceeding the limit and 9 receiving a warning letter.

In both periods one in 10 were going too fast. Please respect the speed limits. We are doing this for your safety. It could be your Granny, your child or your dog that is hurt.


