There were three members of the public present: -

1. The first member of the public requested that the oil cans in the pond at the top of Bourne Road are removed and a new bin to be installed on a concrete base on Colster Way Play Area between the two benches there – similar to one that is already installed. The member of the public believed that installing a bin on a concrete base would make sure it was not tipped over and also felt that it would encourage people to use it. They advised that they were liaising with SKDC for confirmation of the landowner of the pond at the top of

Outcome: -

Chair to the Parish Council Cllr C Hainsworth confirmed that the request for a bin would be referred to the Clerk for investigations into costs and conveyed a special thank you to them for all the work they were doing on their litter picking activities.

2. The second member of the public spoke was a representative from Herewood Homes, they handed out drawings in support of the proposed 6th house on the Woodyard Development on Stamford Road, Colsterworth. They said the one extra stone-built house with a paddock would finish off the land. They explained that the Planning Officer from SKDC advised that they would require Parish Council support for the 6th property. Cllr's listened to what the member of the public had to say and advised that the Parish Council was not a Planning Authority. Cllr's were not supportive of any change to their original position of no comment.

3. The third member of the public offered to leave as the Public Forum had over run its time. The Chair to the Council Cllr Hainsworth invited them to stay so each member of the public was heard. They spoke in relation to the Parish Council's War Memorial Project. They commented on the good work already done by the Parish Council and raised caution with the Parish Council to take on board interventions from another community group as he had heard discussions about moving the War Memorial. He was reassured that this was not the case by Cllr Henton as this was raised at last meeting and the view was that it should stay in its current position.

They were also advised that their interest as a member of the working party was noted as was the interest of any other members of the community who expressed a view and request to be involved in the progress of the project which was still in process.* Chairman's Remarks

The Chairperson Caroline Hainsworth welcomed everyone to the meeting and the public session was extended until 7.50pm to allow each person to speak.

County/District Councillor Report

District Councillor Bellamy reported the following -

- Reserved Matters S21/1906 (in respect of S18/Ž379) Feedback from the SKDC Planning Officer was that they were reassured that a new pond would be installed as part of the development which they were satisfied would catch surface water and be discharged into the existing system in a controlled manor into the Anglian Water system.
- So far there was no detailed information on predicted drainage.
- District Cllr Bellamy passed on County Councillor Adams apologies for not being able to attend the meeting.

NATURAL HISTORY BULLETIN




Among the colourful birds returning to our bird feeders this autumn was a Great Spotted Woodpecker attracted by nuts. In another garden a surprise was a Jay, well away from its woodland habitat. With its bright blue feathers near the top of its wings and a crest blown up by the wind it seemed exotic. Twyford Wood is an area where jays have been seen gathering acorns in the winter. A pile of cherry stones found beneath a tree were all neatly holed at one end, probably by Blue Tits extracting the kernels. Few reports of finches except for a siskin which gave the observer plenty of time for identification as it explored for seeds. Birds in flocks included rooks looking for new roosting sites, black-headed gulls travelling after dawn and before dusk to their overnight place of safety on Rutland Water. Jackdaws often travel with rooks but two were seen emerging from a large nestbox intended for tame pigeons. Geese were heard calling on an overnight flight. Tawny Owls were t'wooing rather than t'witting. A kestrel seen hovering before swooping down on its prey of a small rodent. By the river a grey wagtail feeding on the winter gnats emerging from a

shallow area of water near a riffle. Three Little Egrets are seen regularly at the riverside from the central area south, but a grey heron keeps aloof further north. Kingfishers have again been reported this month

Three young hedgehogs discovered in the second week in November will probably need help if they are to put on enough weight before hibernation. There have been a number of road casualties reported, fallow deer, badgers and a single hedgehog alongside Twyford Wood and Badgers alongside the Al. Young foxes have been seen after darkness, which comes so early this time of year. Following a request to look out for evidence of rabbits last month there are signs of them returning to their old haunts alongside Old Post Lane, on the Nature Trail and on the slip road to the A1. The season for Moths and Butterflies on the wing is over. There have been more than the usual reports of those butterflies which overwinter in sheds and buildings coming out on mild days, with flowers still to top up their energy stores. A Red Admiral, for example, on November 16th and a Peacock on 13th November. A dead and rather tattered moth brought in for identification was of the very large Blue Underwing (Cliveden paralais). It had been found in Leics, The Rutland Natural History had featured it in its autumn magazine as two first records for their county. Originally a migrant in the south of England it is now spreading north and worth looking for locally next year. In flight in September, its caterpillars feed on

On the Nature Trail the Yellow Staining Mushroom has turned up again. Beware it looks like the edible mushrooms but some people are severely allergic to it. Fortunately the Wood and Field Blewits, liked by many people are more easily recognised. The smaller fungi of grasslands often go unnoticed. A photo sent in was of the dainty Egg Yellow which in its early stages can look like an egg yolk. There have been some spectacular crops of Shaggy Ink Caps in grass fields where a Giant Puffball the size of a

football was found. It is edible when young but soon its interior turns into a smelly powdery mess. On the Nature Trail there is a smaller but fascinating fungus which appears in its earliest stages to be a puff ball but which splits out into a star shape to reveal the inner containers for spores.



The Collared Earth Star has done well this year. Its dried remains keep its original form for months so it can be searched for even in the depths of winter. To look for in December. No reports yet of Fieldfare and Redwing. There should still be fungi about until the severe frosts when the Velvet Shank Fungus turns up on the trunks of old trees and the new bracket fungi continue to develop. The fallen leaves bear witness to leaf mining moths and the galls of many kinds of other insects. Lots of berries to brighten things at the time of writing. 
