

HEADLINES FROM THE PARISH COUNCIL MEETING Clerks Report 7th DECEMBER 2021

Public Forum

There was one member of the public present who thanked the Parish Council for the opportunity to speak and introduced themselves as the Acting Chair of the Village Hall Committee (Sir Isaac Newton Memorial Hall Charity). They gave some background on agenda item 2021.102 below and confirmed that after many years the existing Committee members wished to retire and they had been unable to recruit new Committee members with the required skills to run the Charity and stated the following: -

It had been agreed by a majority at both the Extra Ordinary Meeting and Annual General meeting to surrender the remainder of the lease to the Village Hall building

The Village Hall Committee (Sir Isaac Newton Memorial Hall Charity) had received a letter from Shouler & Son surveyors stating that there was no value in the remainder of the lease.

The Social Club Committee are willing to accept the surrender of the lease and would continue to run the Village Hall for the benefit of local groups.

The member of the public finished by saying that the existing Village Hall Committee members were very sorry that the charity would not be able to continue. **Chairman's Remarks**

Chair to the Parish Council Cllr Hainsworth thanked everyone for coming considering the bad weather that was being experienced. They acknowledged that the late County Councillor Adams would take place at 11am on Thursday 9th December and that he would be missed by the community. Cllr Hainsworth added that they were very sorry not to be able to attend the funeral, but the Clerk Sue Grant would be attending. Cllr Hainsworth informed the Cllrs that Cllr Jim Skelton had had to step down due to work commitments and gave thanks for his contribution to the Parish Council.

County/District Councillor Report

District Councillor Bellamy reported the following -

- The SKDC Planning Department was quiet, and he was not aware of any issues with the County Council planning department.
- The proposed housing off Bourne Road has not yet gone to Committee. He would seek clarification on the timing of the survey which had been requested.
- Cllr L McShane asked a question regarding the Woodyard Development on Stamford Road and Cllr Bellamy confirmed that the extra dwelling had been refused planning permission.

Cllr Bellamy finished by say how much the late Cllr Bob Adams will be greatly missed.

Updates for Council Finance & Administration

Cllr J Skelton resigned due to work commitments. SKDC Elections informed, and Casual Vacancy advertised.

Footpath 7 classified as Priority 2 from LCC ROW. 02/12/2021 LCC ROW confirmed by email Patching works and potholes will be repaired by highways. 2.Comments on the Reserved Matters S21/1906 (in respect of S18/2379) submitted to SKDC. Minute ref 2121.88. 3.Street lights1, on Bourne Road and 74 & 79 on Woolsthorpe Road reported to SKDC for repair.

4. Wicksteed Leisure have been instructed to carry out the replace the bearings on the roundabout at Woolsthorpe Play Area. Lead-time for the works to be completed will be within 6-8 weeks however this is dependent upon the necessary parts being procured.

5. From public forum 2nd November. A heavy-duty litter bin including fixing kit £224.23. See Agenda item 2021.105 December Meeting.

6.Allotment inspection carried out by the Clerk and Cllr C Russell on Friday12th November 2021. Letters sent to all allotment holders.

7. The Clerk completed and submitted the Pensions Regulator re-enrolment duties.

With a twice a day visit from a crisis care team and my daughter looking after me this enabling me to come home rather than being transferred to a specialist unit.


Although I was very ill, I was grateful I was back home but the road to recovery was a really tough and long one.

For weeks on end I battled with the feelings of despair, loneliness, pain, heartache and not wanting to be here. It felt like it was never going to end, it was like torture just being here. I remember sitting on my bed sobbing, pleading with my daughter to make it all go away but then.....step by step, day by day things gradually lifted. I never ever thought I would get out of the big black hole of depression but I did with the help of others.

I now want to reach out and help those who are in a similar place I was. Nobody deserves to live through the pain and torture of depression but I am living proof there is light at the end of the tunnel.

Please, if there is anyone you know within our village who is suffering from loneliness, isolation pick up the phone and let me know.



NATURAL HISTORY BULLETIN

Written in mid-December this bulletin looks back on the previous year which starts with records of the first flowers. After a mild start to winter there was a continued trend for earlier flowering of key species and the survival of plants which would in the past have died down in late autumn. Sharp and sudden frosts came at a time when fruit trees were in flower so, for example, a poor apple harvest Bumble bees which had started nests early had a considerable set back. By late summer many plants were taller than usual with lush growth.

The summer saw less of some Butterflies(e.g. Holly Blues, Common Blues, Small Tortoiseshell, Grizzled and Dingy Skippers.) Not a Painted Lady Year but there were exciting records of Purple Emperor and Silver Washed Fritillary. Numerous reports of the caterpillars of the Elephant Hawk Moth which seem to have adopted garden fuchsias. A photo of a Privet Hawk Moth caterpillar in a garden, away from its food plant was a particularly good find. The attractive Pale Tussock Moth caterpillars were found in numbers on the Nature Trail. requirements. No records of any seen were sent in 2021.

Returning numbers of Swallows and House Martins continue declining but Swift numbers remain good. Finches notable for their absence from gardens (except for Bullfinches at blossom time!) Plenty of records of breeding Red Kite , Buzzards, Kestrels, Sparrowhawks, Tawny and Barn Owls, One record only of a Spotted Flycatcher and the Turtle Dove is no longer heard. Along the river Little Egret, Heron and nesting Grey Wagtail.



Deer, both fallow and Muntjac are increasingly found away; from woods, including in gardens. Roe deer have become established now in some local woods. The otter, seldom seen has a stronghold in the wider area and there is evidence of it feeding in the Witham. Badgers seen by most of us usually as road casualties, have at least three groups of active setts.



COMMUNITY SPEEDWATCH UPDATE

The Community Speed Watch teams increased the number of checks in November with over 300 vehicles checked at several locations in the village. Results were most encouraging with the percentage speeding reduced by a third and 21 letters were sent out to remind people to watch their speed.

This time maximum speeds recorded were generally less than 45 mph but remember, these are 30 mph zones for a reason. Regrettably there one car was estimated at 70 to 80 mph when observed in Woolsthorpe Road on 21st November.

As well as the local Community Speed watch teams around Colsterworth there are other local teams in Corby Glen, Castle Bytham and Ancaster.

Please respect the speed limits. We are doing this for your safety. It could be your Grannie, your child or your dog that that are hurt. Remember Speed Kills.




