#### **Public Forum**

There were three members of the public present, the first to speak was a member of the Colsterworth Women's Institute who spoke in support of the ideas that that Colsterworth Women's Institute had for celebrating the Queen's Platinum Jubilee such as commemorative villages gates or a bench. The Chair to the Parish Council Caroline Hainsworth thanked the member of the public for their time explained that this event would be discussed later in the meeting and that the Clerk Sue Grant would contact them following the meeting with an update. The second and third members of the public were the Conservative team for the forthcoming by-elections:

Both Charlotte Vernon Conservative candidate for Lincolnshire County Council Rural Division and Ben Green candidate for South Kesteven District Council Isaac Newton Ward introduced themselves saying that they were there to listen to what is affecting the villages, what matters to the villagers and to get to know the people.

The public forum closed at 7.40pm and the Conservative Candidates remained to observe the meeting.

<u>Chairman's Remarks</u> Chair to the Parish Council Caroline Hainsworth welcomed everyone to the meeting after the Christmas and New Year break and was looking forward to 2022. They thanked the Clerk for arranging use of the Methodist Church Hall due to the usual venue of Colsterworth Village Hall being unavailable.

#### **District Councillor Report**

- SKDC Planning application S20.0129 concrete block facility had been officially withdrawn.
- There had been an issue with a recent recycling bin collection at Gunby due to the current road closure. The bins were collected the following day.
- They commented on the recent press articles on InvestSK the background relating to the appointments of EnvironmentSK and LeisureSK.

#### **Updates for Council Finance & Administration**

The following policies were adopted at their annual review: -

Unanimously agreed small increase of £2.50 per small & £5 per double advertisement to help reduce the Council subsidy for 2022/2023 at their Annual Renewal in April.

Unanimously agreed to keep the current allotment and field rents prior to their Annual Renewal in April.

Thank you to all the Volunteers and to Jon Weston for providing his vehicle to collect the rubbish.

#### **Group Reports**

#### Highways & Footpaths Working Group Report (Cllrs Bennett, Clark, **Brocklebank and Hainsworth)**

Cllr Hainsworth thanked Cllr Brocklebank for the work he is carrying out for the Council. A report had also been received about the Vehicle Activated Sign (VAS) at Stainby requiring some attention as it was requiring more frequent charging. It was agreed by Council that the investigations into costs for updated and new signs be looked at for future consideration.

#### **Environment & Amenities Working Group Report**

1. War Memorial Project (Phase 2) Update. (Cllr C Hainsworth)

The three tender quotations have been received. A short discussion took place and the Clerk agreed to ask the architect to re-assess the specifications of the quotations for value for money and quality at no further cost to the Parish Council. Cllr Hainsworth agreed to make further investigations with the War memorials Trust, other potential Grant options and Public Contract Regulations.

The Queen's Platinum Jubilee Beacons update. (Cllr's T Neale, I Johnson, K Vickers & L Bennett)

Cllr L Bennett had obtained a quotation of £650 excl vat (supplier not vat registered) for a locally sourced Beacon.

Clir T Neale proposed a gas fuelled beacon at £490 excl vat. A discussion took place on potential locations for the beacon, and it was agreed to bring a firm proposal to the March meeting.



# NATURAL HISTORY BULLETIN

Valentine's Day was supposed to be the date when birds pair up. The sound of a pair of Song Thrushes singing was particularly welcome. Their numbers are so low locally that it is not unusual for one to call for a mate all spring without success. Herons one of the earliest of birds to nest were seen carrying twigs but also a pair apparently displaying to one another near the Witham, watched by a Little Egret. Blackbirds courting includes the male stretching its neck and staring. This is not as attractive perhaps as their melodious song. A brambling seen in one garden was noted for its bright colours. Another colourful bird is the pink flushed Long-tailed Tit. A party of these has been visiting a bird table daily at the same time, much to the delight of the owner. Birds can be a sign of health in the environment in several ways.



There are three places locally where Kestrels are seen regularly in Colsterworth and Woolsthorpe. In each case there is a wide verge and some scrub over which the Kestrel hovers. The kestrel is telling us of mice and voles hidden below. Though hidden during the day they leave behind scent/urine markings coloured by ultra violet – a colour which we can't detect but which is visible to Kestrels. The birds can follow their trails and pinpoint their prey with extraordinary eyesight. This winter there seem to be more Buzzards alongside our roads. Single ones sit low in the trees or

in a tall hedge. When Pheasants are released from rearing cages they are not roadwise and there is regular scattering of dead ones, hit by cars. Other smaller animals, victims of traffic also provide carrion, but the numbers of these seem to be less.

Last year on 8th March the snow fell and remained frozen on the ground until the 16th so that comparisons of first dates for insects and flowers is more useful if the previous years are looked at. This has so far not been as far forward as several in the last decade. At the time of writing ( 17/02/22) after a very early Buff-Tailed Bumble Bee there has only been a brief appearance of the Tree Bee Bombus hypnorum. However, last year after the snow went there was a warm period and the first Brimstone Butterflies before the end of February.

daisy is a perennial and has other ways to flower throughout the year. The drawing is of daisies on a lawn. The flower stems are too short to make daisy chains but a mower can pass above the buds and the plant show flowers again within the week. The daisy does not open until an hour or so after the sun is out (it is the day's eye). By this time its central flowers are 6C above the surrounding temperature to attract bees in for the nectar and pollen. As a perennial it has another device for success. It produces side shoots which spread the plant in a protective rosette over a wider area.

#### To Look for in March

Coltsfoot and Wild Primroses are the next in the list of early records, and for the Elder Bush to be showing green shoots. But don't forget the 'weeds' or to look up



Winter is a time to wonder at 'weeds' a term which refers to plants unwanted by man. These are the great survivors who defy all our attempts to get rid of them and some which flourish where and when other plants can't. Write a list of plants in flower on a walk and the chances are you will not have noted Chickweed or Daisies although they may have been the only plants in flower. Chickweed is an annual. It produces, even at low temperatures, abundant seeds quickly. These germinate in almost anything resembling soil. They can even be seen pushing through the cracks in the pavement. Like other successful annuals they can be pollinated by very small insects which are out in all weathers or they can self pollinate. The

to see what the trees and bushes are doing. Garden records of birds are becoming all the more important. We seem to be seeing less of either in the countryside. Hares at least should be out in the fields. The first of the spring fungi may be about and a warm spell will bring out the Butterflies. Observations of behaviour in birds and insects help us to learn more of what they need. And most import the first sighting of frogs, toads and newts. HHH are working and supporting people on different levels to improve their quality of life. Part of this is giving practical help to assist with tasks they find difficult and have asked for our support with.


