



HEADLINES FROM THE PARISH COUNCIL MEETING 1st MARCH 2022

Public Forum

There were two members of the public present who had been invited to the meeting by Chair to the Parish Council Cllr C Hainsworth because of their interest in the War Memorial Project which was being discussed later in the meeting at agenda item 2021.144.2.1. Brief details of the Public Session are below and full details can be found on the Parish Council website at https://

colsterworth.parish.lincolnshire.gov.uk/downloads/download/7/ agendas?downloadID=7

- The first member of the public introduced themself and spoke in support of their suggestions for the Parish Council to consider for the War Memorial project.
- The second member of the public introduced themselves stating that this was the first meeting they had been to regarding the War Memorial Project. They spoke as a member of Colsterworth Festival of Remembrance (CFoR) stating that CFoR had a vested interest, military connections and would offer to donate £500 towards the War memorial restoration.
- The first member of the public to speak finished by informing the Parish Council that they were in discussion with the Social Club to arrange a rounders competition and picnic on Woolsthorpe Playing field to celebrate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee.
- Councillor C Hainsworth thanked both members of the public for attending the meeting and acknowledged that community engagement was needed. The members of the public left following the public session which had been extended to 7.50pm to allow them both to speak.

Chairman's Remarks

Chair to the Parish Council Cllr C Hainsworth started by referring to the sad situation in the Ukraine. They informed everyone that Reverend Neil Griffiths was arranging for a collection of donations such as toiletries, clothes, dried food etc. to be taken to the Walton Academy at 3pm on Friday 4th March for the humanitarian appeal. **District Councillor Report**

District Councillor D Bellamy Reported: -

- Devolution is back on the agenda for levelling up and is currently under discussion.
- There is to be a Council Tax rebate for bands A-D in the new financial year. A £150 cash payment, there will be a further £200 in the Autumn which will be repayable from 2023 for 5yrs. There is a proposed council tax rise for a band D property, the average percentage rise will be 3.6% but in cash terms this is 4.5% which is £89.
- Filtration tests are ongoing on the proposed housing development off the A1.
- There is a consultation regarding a solar farm planning application near Stamford, an area of 3.5 square miles. Cllr L Bennett raised the question of storage of the electricity generated. Cllr D Bellamy confirmed that there would be storage capacity. Cllr C Russell raised a question on what was driving such planning applications, Cllr D Bellamy said this was down to Government Policy.
- The boundary commission are looking at proposing a new Parliamentary seat, 'Rutland and Stamford, looking to absorb the Isaac Newton Ward in the new seat.

District Councillor Ben Green Reported: -

- That he was thrilled to be the new SKDC District Councillor and was committed to come and listen to the Parish Council's meetings and do what he can.
- The boundary commission are looking at proposing a new Parliamentary seat, 'Rutland and Stamford, looking to absorb the Isaac Newton Ward in the new seat

The Queen's Platinum Jubilee Celebrations

- It was agreed to purchase and install Green Canopy Plaque and new bench at the Nature Trail (£767.00)
- It was agreed to take part in the Queen's Platinum Jubilee Beacons 2nd June 2022.
- It was agreed to satisfy insurance requirement the beacon

would be sited and lit on the Colster Way Green.

- It was agreed to purchase a Gas fuelled Platinum Jubilee Beacon at a cost of £490 excl vat including carriage. Manufactured by Bullfinch Gas Equipment.
- It was agreed to investigate the possibility of installing Commemorative Planters one each for North Witham, Colsterworth, Woolsthorpe and Stainby

- It was resolved to renew the Lincolnshire Association of Local Councils Membership subscription of £452.99 net & to renew the Lincolnshire Association of Local Councils (LALC) annual training scheme membership at £162 net.
- The following policy was adopted at their annual review: CAD Marking the Death Of A Senior National Figure.
- It was agreed to hold future Parish Council meetings in the Methodist Church Hall to be reviewed after three meetings.
- It was agreed to hold the Annual Parish Meeting on Tuesday 17th May 2022 at 7.30pm, venue to be confirmed.
- It was agreed to move the Parish Council meeting scheduled for Tuesday 7th June to Tuesday 31st May 2022.




NATURAL HISTORY BULLETIN

Why are frogs and toads disappearing? They have always led life on the edge. For many years garden ponds have been important for their survival as field ponds and flooded fields have disappeared. In the managed countryside their breeding places of open water are often polluted. As adults the invertebrates they feed on are scarcer each year . Their porous skins take in pesticides as well as air and they have little protection from predators. At the beginning of their lives newts and fish devour eggs tadpoles and toadlets. Grass snakes, larger birds and some mammals eat frogs, but toads are left alone because their skins produce a strong unpleasant taste. Toads, unlike frogs travel far away from their breeding places and on their travels are road casualties.



If you have a pond consider it as a breeding place for these declining

animals. Has it shallow, vegetated areas Are there hiding places? Is the water healthy and full of tiny plant and animal life? Tadpoles in the early stages will graze on the algae on surfaces but later need the protein found in minute insect larvae and in crustaceans. A covering of duckweed or other green will cut off the air supply. There needs to be a 'broiling mass of spawn each year for enough adults to survive and breed to renew the population. Each year it is good to hear of the ponds which continue to produce frogs. The first spawn reported was on 7th March. One, usually the earliest was slightly later on 11th March. Last year spawn was raised in a tank and the froglets returned to the wild. Only one pond has reported the long strings of toad



Fine weather in March has resulted in the waysides in flower with Violets and Primroses, Lesser Celandines and Spring Whitlow Grass, The first Coltsfoot and the first Blackthorn in the hedges alongside elder showing green buds. The Buff-tailed and Tree Bumble Bees have been regular visitors on sunny days, but few Honey Bees. A small solitary bee with the lengthy common name of the Hairy-Footed flower Bee was noted because of the loud buzzing of the male, heading for its favourite Pulmonaria flowers. The larger, black females emerge later. Small Tortoiseshells, Red Admiral and Peacock Butterflies have made brief appearances on the sunniest days but on 10th March the first Brimstone Butterflies were seen in Jane Ostler several gardens – the true harbinger of

Spring. Last years nest, of what was probably a Norwegian Wasp, was found in the rafters of a garage during a Spring Clean. Its beautiful construction of wax honeycombs and paper covering are a thing of wonder. The larger constructions of the common wasp will soon be underway as the Queens are out feeding up ready for the task ahead. At the same time numbers of 7-spot Lady birds were emerging from the bushes in which they had hibernated.



Birds in and around our gardens have provided much interest. Jackdaws, for instance which have taken over a nest box built for owls. Other Jackdaws which are nesting in a dovecote in sight of the garden where it is believed one of them was rescued two years ago as a fledgling and later returned to the wild. Two BlueTits are nesting in a gap in a stone wall which they occupied last year. A Greater Spotted Woodpecker is now drumming at the bottom of another

To Look For in April. See if you can find pin-eyed Primroses where the stigma sticks out from the centre (not several anthers as in others). Listen out for the chiff chaff. Note any frogs and toads . Most of all I hope you have time to 'stand and stare' and enjoy the plants and animals. I look forward to your observations at 61 Woolsthorpe Road, 860465, e-mail inostler@ hotmail.co.uk

Following Cllr Bob Adams' sad passing, by-elections were held on 24 February to fill vacancies he left on South Kesteven District Council and Lincolnshire County Council. I'm delighted to have been elected as your new District Councillor, and briefly wished to take the opportunity to introduce myself, set out what I want to do and list the best way to get in touch. Born at Grantham Hospital, I'm the fourth generation of my family to have lived and worked in the area, with rich childhood memories of Arbon and Watts toy shop, a bustling George Shopping Centre and thriving market. I attended a nearby grammar school, graduated from several universities where I studied history and have worked a variety of jobs. Roles that have taken me from pulling pints at the local pub, to selling tickets for a Cotswolds castle and now promoting a leading environmental charity. I'd now like to follow Bob's example of giving back. Isaac Newton Ward, over 35 square miles stretching from Stroxton to South Witham, with Colsterworth along the way, has some stunning history and scenery.
