NOTIFICATION OF ESSENTIAL DRAINAGE MAINTENANCE A1 COLSTERWORTH TO LONG BENNINGTON

I'm writing to let you know that we'll be carrying out essential drainage maintenance on the A1 between Colsterworth and Long Bennington.

All carriageways will be open, as usual, outside of our working hours.



NATURAL HISTORY BULLETIN

Looking back through the Bulletins since they began in 2006, there have been some wide fluctuations in Spring weather. This year it has been exceptionally dry. The June 2012 bulletin starts "At least the cool wet season has produced a good crop of interesting fungi. St George's Mushroom made it in time for 23rd April." There then follows a description of Scarlet Elf Caps and the small red cups with dark fringing hairs of the Eyelash Fungi. This year it was mid-May before any of the Spring fungi appeared.

They included the pale, sponge-like caps of the Morel which came up in limestone grassland at the edge of trees. Their rounded fruits with a honeycomb of angular pits were small and soon dried up. Their specific name 'esculenta' means good to eat. However, in addition to being sure of their identification, this fungus now includes a number of types which are known to cause stomach upsets and all need to be cooked thoroughly. In 2012 two other scarce Morels were described "as the stars of the show". The Thimble Cap Morel had turned up for the first time for several years under Hawthorn along the Nature Trail. The Semi-free Morel has

a darker, folded cap a is found in old wet grassland. There is little of this habitat in our parishes.

On the Colsterworth Roadside Nature Reserve the scarce Wild Liquorice is in flower. A member of the pea family with cream flowers it clambers amongst the grassed areas. On the mounds left bare after the roadworks a great variety of limestone plants are slowly colonising. In this area the first Common Blue butterflies were seen in early May. In the gardens they can be picked out from the earlier emerging Holly Blues because they spend time flying close to the ground whilst the Holly Blues are usually seen higher, having emerged from shrubs or small trees. Grizzled and Dingy Skippers are back in Twyford Wood and the Green Hairstreak was found on the Nature Trail

Concern about the low numbers of insects continues. One interesting aspect of this is that the Harlequin Ladybird, a recent arrival and a threat to our native species, is being found in just ones and twos, whilst the 7-spot Ladybird is frequent. Perhaps the alien is becoming a tolerated member of the community.

Grass Snakes seem to be surviving somewhere in the vicinity of the Nature Trail. They are noted when out sunning or in the dry weather seeking out garden ponds where they predate any amphibians. A cast skin was found on the Woolsthorpe Roadside Nature Reserve.

The first Cuckoo was heard on 1st May and a week later at Twyford Wood, earlier than usual. Swallows and House Martin numbers are down. On their return they found neither mud to build nests nor the insect numbers needed to support feeding young. Fortunately swifts are back in force (first back at nesting sites on 8/5/22). There has now been enough rain to initiate swarms of small gnats dancing in the sky to the delight of squealing swifts swooping through them in the evening. Another piece of good news was of Spotted Flycatchers seen in a garden for the first time in 2 years. Their aerial

acrobatics as they caught larger insects on the wing leads to hopes they might stay. There have been some very interesting observations sent in on bird behaviour. To select just one – a Crow dipping what may have been bread in a pond and flying off with it (to its thirsty as well as hungry young?)



To Look For in June

If you have a pond you may get a visit from Dragonflies (which rest with spread wings or Damselflies which rest with folded wings. Note the colour of their bodies (in some species male and female are different colours). Note anywhere House Martins or Swallows are nesting since their future appears to be threatened. The limestone flowers are at their best and many are on the verges. Trees are now the gathering places for many overlooked insects. Young birds and mammals are about if you are lucky enough to see them. I look forward to hearing from you at 61 Woolsthorpe
