Neighbourhood Policing Teams Priority Setting Meetings are held quarterly, where the Force and other Partners, like The Office of Police and Crime, Council representatives etc. Attend and as a group discuss what priorities there should be. This is based on crime stats as well as community thoughts and ongoing work in the area. These Priorities then inform engagement in the local areas.

Please note there are only a few priorities for each area so not every concern sent in my Parishes will become a priority, but they will play a large part in the decision making for each neighbourhood policing area. Crime stats and information from other partners is also taken into consideration when choosing the next quarters priorities.

Priority One:	 Road safety. Our villages have a high volume of cars and Heavy Goods Vehicle's travelling through daily often exceeding the speed limit. There is a strong case for requesting a regular visible Police presence in Colsterworth, North Witham, Stainby, Lobthorpe and Gunby based upon the A1 running through the parish. A marked traffic car or motor bike regularly parked on the B676/A151 flyover would send a 'welcome to Lincolnshire' message to northbound traffic, while a tour of the parish with the occasional stop at our speed data collection sites, especially at school traffic times, will gain a lot of public awareness. The Parishes of Colsterworth North Witham, Stainby, Lobthorpe and Gunby should receive some preventative policing sited as Colsterworth is situated at an important transport crossroads the A1 Truck Stop roundabout.
Priority Two:	Theft - There have been reports of suspicious activity in the early hours of the mornings on the local housing estates. Based that the A1 runs



	through the parishes of Colsterworth, North Witham, Stainby, Lobthorpe and Gunby it is strongly believed that most crime incidents are by visitors to the parish using the convenience of the A1 for access.
Priority Three:	Anti-social behaviour A visible Police presence will also have a good effect on local anti-social behaviour with youths gathering at play areas, drinking and smoking.
