HEADLINES FROM THE PARISH COUNCIL MEETING 31st MAY 2022

Public Forum Brief details of the Public Forum are below, and full details can be found on the Parish Council website.

There were two members of the public present: -

The first spoke in relation to parking on the High Street in the vicinity of Spring Lane which reduces visibility when exiting Spring Lane onto the High Street for both drivers and pedestrians. They asked the Parish Council to take this forward with the County Council to have a white line installed like the one opposite the junction to Back Lane.

Action – Chair to the Council Cllr Caroline Hainsworth gave a brief history of the Highways and Footpaths reports on the High Street and the Clerk suggested the resident send any photographic evidence to support any request to County Council Highways department. The Clerk will also inform the local PCSO of the issue.

The second to speak was the Nature Trail lead Ranger who gave the following update: -

- The volunteers have opened new paths by taking out lots and lots of scrub allowing wildflowers to grow resulting in the
- following season wild strawberry plants growing.

 The new, 'Jubilee Wood', had been planted with over 100 trees donated by the Woodland Trust as part of the Queen's Green Canopy.

The following benches have been donated and installed:

- The Queen's Platinum Jubilee Commemorative bench donated by the Parish Council.
- Vicky's View bench donated by the Frederic Ingle Trust and SKDC Ward member Grant.
- Veteran's View donated by two anonymous donors. Full details can be found on the Parish Council website under Nature Trail https://colsterworth.parish.lincolnshire.gov.uk/ Chair to the Council Cllr Hainsworth acknowledged the valued work of the Lead Ranger and all the volunteers.

Chairman's Remarks

Chair to the Council Caroline Hainsworth welcomed everyone to the meeting and read out a letter from Dot Williams secretary to the Women's Institute advising that it was their great pleasure to donate £500 in commemoration of Her Majesty's Platinum Jubilee to be used towards replacing the bench on Old Post Lane which would include a commemorative plaque acknowledging the Women's Institutes generous donation.

Updates for Council administration

Accounts for payment were approved by Council. No Finance and Administration Meeting this month.

LCC & SKDC Cllr Reports LCC Cllr Charlotte Vernon sent her apologies.

District Cllr Dave Bellamy Reported: -

- The Bourne Road/A1 Housing development had been deferred for the following reasons:
- Frontage not in keeping: 2)The position of properties in relation to existing properties: 3) Drainage – Awaiting Angliar Water comments: 4) The builder to return revised plans or appeal. Drainage – Awaiting Anglian
- SKDC Planning Department staff shortages are causing a backlog of planning enforcement issues. Cllr D Bellamy has become Chairman of SKDC Planning Committee.
- Cllr Bellamy asked for Cllrs availability so that he can arrange a Neighbourhood Plan Review meeting with SKDC Planning Department.
- The 6th plot on the Stamford Road development was awaiting the Consultation Decision to be made.

SKDC Cllr Ben Green Reported: -

SKDC Customer Services is now back in business offering in person service from 9am to 1pm Monday to Friday. The £150 energy rebate has by and large been paid out through he Council Tax direct debit system. Those not on direct debits are encouraged to pay by direct debit by 13th June.

- SKDC is the leading Kesteven district for housing Ukrainian refugees
- A short discussion was held on the maintenance responsibility of the Margaret Thatcher statue.

- It was agreed to replace the damaged bench High Street junction Bourne Road, Colsterworth.
- It was agreed to supplement the Women's Institute donation of £500 to replace the bench on Old Post Lane including fitting and removal of the old bench.
- It was resolved in principle to replace the Woolsthorpe Road bench near Bridge End, in the hamlet of Woolsthorpe by Colsterworth with a metal bench, to commemorate the birthplace of Sir Isaac Newton. Final agreement on formal quote.

Our president, at the start of the meeting, thanked everyone who had helped to make the Platinum Jubilee picnic a great success and said that she and other members of the committee had received cards and telephone calls, thanking them for an enjoyable afternoon. Another letter from the Parish Council thanking our institute for its donation which will enable the seat on Old Post Lane to be replaced to commemorate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee. Did you hear the bells last evening?

This question is often posed by residents in Colsterworth when the six bells of St. John the Baptist are heard especially during the lighter nights of Spring and there appears no apparent reason for them to be rung.

They rang on the evening of Saturday 28th May – the reason – when members of the Lincoln Diocesan Guild of Church Bell Ringers held their monthly meeting at Colsterworth.

Members from Grantham, Harlaxton, Barrowby and Bourne were welcomed by Hilary Winstanley. Methods rung were, Plain Bob, April Day Doubles and Cambridge Surprise Minor.

After a short formal meeting and further ringing members repaired to their own towers to prepare for Sunday Service ringing the following day.

Colsterworth has a fine ring of six bells rung from the ground floor. A mixed set of bells dating back to 1674 when the third bells was cast by Toby Norris III (1634-1698) a bell founder from Stamford. Three of the bells are by Taylors of Loughborough including the tenor bell which weighs over 11 cwt and bears the beautiful inscription in Latin "NON CLAMOR SED AMOR CANTAT IN AVRE DE!" which translates to "Not a noise but singing in the ear of God".



NATURAL HISTORY BULLETIN

Nothing lifts the spirits more than a Skylark filling the sky with its song (a). Earlier in the year they can be seen in the hedges, chattering and tumbling in energetic displays. The term 'skylarking is used for human behaviour which is carefree and fun. Their song, celebrated in verse and music as 'joyful', 'blithe' and 'serene', is performed high above fields which are the territory for this groundnesting bird. The eggs and chicks are vulnerable to both disturbance and predation. The skylark was heard in June above a field adjacent to the Nature Trail.



Reports of Orchids are always special. Photos sent in showed Bee Orchids in flower on a lawn. Three Spikes of Common Spotted Orchid were photographed on the Nature Trail. This species is not common, nor are its leaves always spotted (b). The flowers vary from deep pink to white. There were any number of the white forms, and a few of the pink, in a grassed garden area at Twyford which is left uncut until late in year to encourage diversity of wildflowers. Fourteen kinds were in flower at the end of May. Even on a dull day there were Hoverflies and Bumblebees feeding on

them. Both the Buff tailed workers and those of the Red tailed Bumblebees were out in numbers.



Again at Twyford an extensive pond had developing Tadpoles, Newts and the 4-Spotted Darter Dragonfly - Libellula quadrimaculata - was laying eggs on the surface. The Common Blue Damselfly was in nearby long grass. In June on the Nature Trail there were newly emerged Tortoiseshell Butterflies, the first Meadow Browns, Small Skippers and Small Whites. A photo of a Speckled Wood was of a very dark form, the white markings picked out against an almost black background. Where ant hills have been revealed by clearing a new path on the Nature Trail a Red Admiral was seen making use of the ants architectural skills in catching the sunlight as it warmed itself in the early evening. The hills were larger, and rather differently constructed to those of the yellow ants which are a feature in the Butterfly Glade at Twyford Wood. They may be those of the larger black ant - the Wood Ant, but this needs checking. The drawing (c) shows a cross section of a Wood Ants Nest. The life cycle of our native species is every bit as complex and fascinating as the exotic kinds which are the stars of natural history films. The majority of the ants seen are workers. As in social bee communities, they play no part in reproduction which is left to a

Queen. During the summer winged males

and winged gueens emerge in large swarms. They mate and the females as well as the males, which die, shed their wings and attempt to found new nests away from the one they left. She will seal herself in and not lay her eggs until the following spring, tending to the emerging young using food derived from energy still stored in her no longer needed wing muscles. These workers will take over the running of the colony, extending and repairing the nest, collecting food and tending new eggs, larvae and pupae



Lots of other 'events' this June. Bats seen out in gardens. Grass Snakes disturbed whilst mating and scuttling off when disturbed, the female dragging the male with her. Humming Bird Hawk Moths seen in gardens. The first tiny froglets creeping out of a pond. A nestling blackbird surviving after falling from nest and his pleas for food being rejected by adults. It found refuge in the garden border and was found feeding itself in the morning. A Red Kite was observed feeding its young.

To Look For In July: Garden Records continue to provide lots of interest and surprisingly you may find Dragonflies and Damselfly adults, even if you haven't a pond. Every record of Hedgehogs is important. July is the time to start looking for grasshoppers and perhaps we shall have a sighting of the Marbled White Butterfly this year. 


