HEADLINES FROM THE PARISH COUNCIL MEETING 5th **JULY 2022**

There were three members of the public present: -

- 1. The first spoke regarding the ongoing litter problem on the area around the A1 Truck Stop and asked if there had been any response to the correspondence sent by the Parish Council requesting extra bins. Clir D Bellamy suggested informing the Environmental Health Department regarding the issue of the discarded bottles believed to contain urine. Action: The Clerk advised that to date they had received no reply and to follow up this with the A1 Truck Stop and they would inform the Environmental Health Department.
- The second member of the public spoke in support of their application to be Co-opted as Councillor for Colsterworth and District Parish Council. Agenda item 2022.42. Chair to the Council Caroline Hainsworth invited the member of the public to stay and observe the meeting.
- Cllr L McShane spoke on behalf of the third member of the public who reported that the Newton Court street sign needed repair.

Action - The Clerk will report this to South Kesteven District Council who are responsible for street signs.

Chair to the Council Caroline Hainsworth welcomed everyone to the meeting and advised that she had nothing significant to say other than to congratulate Cllr E O'Neil on his recent marriage.

Updates for Council administration

- Shannon Walker was unanimously voted as Councillor for Colsterworth.
- Accounts for payment were approved by Council. No Finance and Administration Meeting this month.

LCC & SKDC Cllr Reports

LCC Cllr Charlotte Vernon reported: -

- LCC would like 750,000 trees planted across the next 3yrs. There is a 'Tree Counter' to record trees planted on the LCC website.
- Electric Vehicle Charging 5 x Lincolnshire Local Authorities have put in a bid for 101 charging points.
- Minerals and Waste Plan Consultation is in progress.
- There is an unwanted medical equipment amnesty for people to consider returning medical devices
- LCC was not selected for the British Railway Headquarters.

Advance notice for maintenance on Highfield Bridge, Stainby Road (B676).

Work is planned to commence in the week of 5th September 2022 and be complete before the end of September, although these dates and timescales depend on clement weather and the maintenance contractor's progress on this site and others. Timings are also constrained by environmental licences.

Work will be undertaken during daytimes only. However, the 24/7 closure of one lane of Stainby Road (B676) over the bridge will be necessary, with traffic being controlled by temporary two-way traffic lights. A temporary reduction in the speed limit along the A676 (to 30mph) will also be in force from the crossroads with Old Post Lane to Colsterworth village.

NATURAL HISTORY BULLETIN

The heatwave, leading up to record high temperatures on 18th and 29th July 2022. had repercussions for wildlife, as well as ourselves. Some of these were observed in our gardens. A hedgehog was seen drinking from a shallow bowl of water left out for the birds. The hedgehogs diet consists, not of vegetable matter, but of caterpillars and other grubs, beetles and other invertebrates with exoskeletons. For moisture it relies on earthworms and slugs. Sketch a) is based on an early etching which shows a hedgehog holding the soft body parts of a snail which is conveniently out of its shell. Like many animals the drought is more of a stress than the heat. Already this years young hedgehogs are living independently, but new litters may be produced well into September. Late arrivals may not put on enough weight (450g or 1lb) to survive winter hibernation.



Birds, especially seed eaters, need moisture and protein in their diet. Blue Tits and Robins are amongst the small birds which benefit dried mealworms which, if soaked provide both. Attention was drawn in one garden to a plum tree with unripe fruit where numbers of 'wasps' were circling the leaves. Closer examination revealed any number of insects feeding. The smaller 'wasps' were yellow and black striped hoverflies. In the absence of flowers they were probably attracted by honeydew. This is the surplus


juice sucked from plants by greenfly. These same greenfly were being eaten by Ladybirds. The true Wasps on the other hand had found grubs to collect. These are fed to Wasp larvae in the nest. The workers only turn for themselves to ripe plums, jam or anything sweet when their work is done at the end of the season.



On a wet afternoon on 17th June Nature Trail volunteers saw some 20 Marbled White Butterflies (b) emerging from grasses in the meadow area. Two years ago marked the first sightings of the Butterfly in this parish, and one of the first records in Lincolnshire. Many more had been seen over the previous weekend on a sunny day. Holly Blues in a garden in Woolsthorpe on 9th July. Both Small and Large Whites in mating pairs on July 16th. There has been an abundance of the newly emerged adults of Small Tortoiseshell Butterflies and several garden records of Commas.

Operating a moth trap correctly causes no harm to specimens. They are identified, (if necessary photographed) recorded and then set free in the area from which they were collected. We are fortunate that we have one being operated in Woolsthorpe which is giving some idea of the amazing numbers and variety of species we have locally, many of which are night fliers only and so are overlooked. For example one night in July 200 specimens of 63 species. From a relatively new garden these included several kinds of Hawk Moths.

These are large and readily recognised moths. Last year it was the strange looking Elephant Hawk Moth caterpillars which were in the local news. This year there were photos sent in from several locations and a number in the moth trap The Poplar Hawk Moth is distinguished by the peculiar way it holds its back wings forward at rest (c). The Privet Hawk Moth was known from a hedge in Woolsthorpe several years ago but an adult was found in the trap, although the original hedge has gone. The Pine Hawk Moth is not often recorded but the garden where it was found has a pine tree next door. It has also been a good year for Humming Bird Hawk Moths, feeding on tubular flowers like the Honeysuckle.



Pond levels may be low but aquatic plants are continuing to thrive - wasps pollinating Water Figwort, White Butterflies on the Purple Loosestrife and Southern Hawker Dragonflies laying eggs amongst the Water Crowfoot. In the aquatic world normally hidden from us a discovery was made whilst putting in an overflow grid between a spring-fed pond and a pipe leading into a feeder stream. The Water Shrimp was in the pipes. Who knows what else can travel in spring lines in the limestone which run into neighbouring counties? Does Anybody Know..... what connects Ingle Charity with new flower tubs at Colsterworth Methodist Church?

The link is Frederick Ingle. 1839-1912

Frederick was born in 1839, son of a Colsterworth farmer, whose family had moved from Rutland in 1620. However, Frederick was not interested in the farm, and he became assistant to an architect in Nottingham. Eventually he was made a partner in the business; they pioneered and patented a way of fireproofing buildings. The business grew rapidly and had offices in Whitehall. Frederick was involved in the construction of many well-known buildings including the Foreign Office and the Winter Gardens in Blackpool. But Frederick always had a fondness for Colsterworth and its people; he owned Middlefield House and returned whenever he could.

Frederick died on 30 May 1912 aged 73 years, ending a life of architecture, science, and philanthropy. In his Will some of his tenants were given their homes; he left money to cousins worldwide and donated to charities in London, Nottingham, Grantham, and Stamford.

For the people of the Colsterworth Parish he left a sum of money to be invested and his Charity was set up by his executors in 1914 – originally in three parts, the Benevolent Charity, the Nursing Charity, and the Pension Fund. The first list of beneficiaries was taken from Frederick's own Christmas list of villagers who he regularly supported. Other parts of the Charity funded a boy through Grammar School; paid for an apprenticeship, with boots and tools; and provided a nurse for the village to care for the sick and poor. To benefit from the Charity, you had to be Sick, Poor and a Resident of the Parish for 5 years. You can visit Frederick in Woolsthorpe Cemetery on Old Post Lane.

The Charity still functions today; in 2001 work was done, with the help of the Charity Commissioners, to simplify the three parts and unite them under one heading 'The Frederick Ingle Charity', with the number of Trustees reduced from 9 to 5. The administration of the Charity is overseen by the Parish Council.

The Trustees meet twice a year, in March and September, to consider grants and we always try to make our decisions based on 'would Frederick approve'!

One such grant was awarded to Helen's Helping Hands to help establish monthly coffee mornings at Colsterworth Methodist Church Hall, offering support and friendship to anyone in need. Steve Bill has been so pleased with the help he received in making one of Helen's wishes come true, that he has decided to provide new flowering plants and tubs at the front of the building for everyone to enjoy!

How amazing to think that Frederick still touches our lives today.

GREET THE GEORGIANS GET HANDS ON WITH HISTORY

Greet the Georgians of Folkingham

Set up in 2020, the Aveland History Group is a popular local history group for the villages and town of the ancient Aveland Wapentake, an area of the South Lincolnshire fen edge, from Bourne in the south, to Osbournby in the north. Following a hugely successful medieval family day last year, the Group will hold a weekend of events on a Georgian theme on Saturday 17th & Sunday 18th September in Folkingham village centre.

With a generous grant from South Kesteven District Council, the event is free access to all and meets the aim of the Group to get hands on with history and bring to life skills and knowledge for young and old alike.

Organisers are inviting visitors to "Take a Cruise Through History" with special events including Those History People, who will provide activities for children based around simple crafts such as spinning, soap and candle making, inks and printing, while adults can enjoy finding out about the ordinary lives of Georgians portrayed by The Mannered Mob, a specialist society of re-enactors describing civilian life between 1730 and 1760.
