- It was resolved to publish the AGAR Notice of Conclusion of Audit from 8th September 2022 to 31st October 2022.
- It was resolved to re-appoint the internal auditor.
- It was resolved to remain opted into the Smaller

Authorities' Audit Appointments for the next 5-year appointing period which runs from 2022-23 until 2026-27. Deadline to opt out 28th October 2022

### LCC & SKDC Cllr Reports SKDC Cllr Ben Green Reported: -

- Firstly, Cllr Ben Green thanked the Cllrs who attended the Isaac Newton Ward Parish Council Summit on Saturday 6th August 2022. Cllr Green said he hoped to arrange it again next year if reelected.
- The PCSO who covered Colsterworth and District is on long term sick. Cllr Green has taken this up with the Chief Constable of Lincolnshire Police to ensure Colsterworth and District is covered with a PCSO with regular attendance.
- The status of the Police Office on Back Lane remains unchanged following a recent review.


### PARISH COUNCIL VEHICLE ACTIVATED SIGN (VAS) PROJECT UPDATE

### NATURAL HISTORY BULLETIN

The Nightshade Family of flowering plants contains some species both spectacular in appearance, and deadly in their content. This September, as in the past after a hot summer, two exotics have flowered in gardens. The Thorn Apple (a) has elegant white flowers and spiny fruits rather like the spiky cases of conkers. Although poisonous, up until 1940, the drug stramonium was derived from it and used to treat asthma. The active ingredients are a mixture of atropine and hyoscine. Imported from Eastern Europe it needs the right temperatures to germinate and develop fully. A close relative is the blue bell-shaped flowering Apple of Peru(b) which also appeared unexpectedly in gardens this year. It is sometimes grown deliberately for the flowers and decorative fruits. The berry is encased in a capsule which breaks down into a lantern-shaped lacy network. This resembles the Chinese Lanterns (Physalis sp.) (c) grown for Autumn and Winter Decoration.





Deadly Nightshade is a third member of this family found this summer and identified by its berry. It has a capsule which splits into a star shape (d). Treatment for its effects close at hand? Even more deadly is Henbane, a plant more likely to be found in sandy soils but which very occasionally flowers and fruits on waste ground (e). It was with this that Dr Crippen poisoned his wife in 1910. Other members of the family, less toxic, are the climbing Bittersweet and the agricultural weed Black Nightshade.







What is most surprising is the numbers of the Nightshade family in our diet. Potato fruits are poisonous but their tubers are not. If the tubers are left to go green in the light the green part is know to have some adverse effects. Tobacco plants contain the harmful narcotic (nicotine). We do eat the fruit of one Nightshade regularly – the Tomato.

Plants poisonous to man may not be harmful to birds. Several people have noted that by the third week in September, trees and shrubs are still laden with berries. Hawthorn, Spindle, Rowan, Guelder, Elder, Whitebeam and Sloe. (Rose Hips are generally left until their sugars have developed in the Winter. At the time concern is expressed about the lack of birds in winter. At the end of the summer we generally see less of them as when they moult their old feathers and are vulnerable they tend to hide away. They have also ceased their full song. The ability to identify birds by sub-song and contact calls is more demanding. It is therefore good to hear of a Greenfinch identified in a garden in this way. By contrast many of the Croware much in evidence. Rooks and Jackdaws flying in flocks as they gather to establish winter roosts. Starlings lined up on telephone wires. Enough Magpies congregating to count the old Country saying "one for sorrow, two for joy, three for a letter.......

Butterfly reports have been mainly of Whites. There is some concern that the timing of the Holly Blue is out of synch with its food plant for the second brood. It relies on the flowers buds of the Ivy on which to lay its eggs. This year the butterfly emerged earlier before the Ivy had produced flowers. In addition Ivy has to be about seven year's old before it flowers and we all know man's attitude to ivy.

**To Look For in October.** There should, after several poor years, be some Fungi about. Several plants are having a late flowering and may be attracting insects. I look forward to all your records and observations at 61 Woolsthorpe Road, 860465, e-mail jnostler@hotmail.co.uk *Jane Ostler*
