NATURE TRAIL FIRE

On Tuesday 11th October 2022 an underground fire was discovered on the Nature Trail at the rear of 54 Woolsthorpe Road. It was necessary to call but the Fire Service who put out the fire using 1,400 litres of water. The cause of the fire was identified as hot ashes being dumped in an area close to large tree roots. The fire destroyed the roots of three large trees causing them to become dangerously unstable. A tree surgeon attended and felled the trees at a cost of £680 to the Parish Council. Thanks to the Nature Trail Ranger and volunteer who initially investigated the report of fire any further fire damage was minimised. The Nature Trail was still very dry from the hot summer it could have been a lot worse!!!

INSPIRING WOMEN

Colsterworth Women's Institute October 2022 Last month in our report and forthcoming meeting. NATURAL HISTORY BULLETIN

Avian flu locally has meant that any hens have had to be penned in and isolated from wild birds which might be infected. One householder in our parishes commented that the lack of bird visitors. especially wood pigeons and collared doves, meant the hens likely to be less threatened. In another garden it was the numbers of house sparrows causing comments as well as the absence of blackbirds both of which nested earlier in the year. There was just one hedge sparrow seen flying from its roost in the honeysuckle where it had been unsuccessful in rearing young. Only a solitary robin singing in the morning. All this in a garden with plenty of shelter and food including berries left on elder, spindle, rowan and whitebeam. There have been some sightings of interest including an influx of blackbirds, parties of long-tailed tits and a woodpecker at a feeder, but the concern about the lack of garden birds continues.

Now that logs are being brought in for fires there is some interest in the insects they bring in with them – a Wood Wasp with a long ovipositor often mistaken for a sting, a queen of a common wasp disturbed from hibernation, the delicate lacewing attracted to a window. The mild days mean some late sightings of the Red Admiral Butterfly. The new queens of both buff and red-tailed bumble bees are still out collecting nectar to see them through the winter.

The building of new estates in Colsterworth has included on land previously either grassland or woodland. It is perhaps not surprising that gardens are sometimes visited by animals which once called these their home. In October one occupant reported a fox. They had previously had a hare, in neighbouring


gardens rabbits are returning. Squirrels and Muntjac deer roam far from their woodland habitat. Badgers have setts to the north, east and south of Colsterworth and are found regularly as road casualties. In October several were young ones, having to find their own way in the world.

A Fungus Foray in Twyford Wood on 18th October discovered a good range of species but there were some absences – no Blewitts, Puff Balls or Chalk Caps. Some species are notoriously difficult to identify (beware mistakes made in considering them worth eating). Their Scientific names seem to be going through big changes. Enjoy instead the agreed common names for some of them found at Twyford –

False Chantrelle, Lion Shield, Slippery Jack, The Deceiver, Sulphur Tuft, Brown Roll Rim, Turkey Tail, Honey Fungus, Birch Polypore, Shaggy Inkcap, Clustered Bonnet, Lilac Bonnet, Lilac Fibrecap, Clouded Funnel, Birch Milkcap



To Look For in November Who will have the last sightings of any butterflies or dragonflies? Too early for the first bird winter migrants. But I must also add a plea for any records and observations – which have suddenly dropped off, without them there will be little to say – and it is in what you may consider to be too common to be of interest that we are most likely to get an idea of what is happening in our environment. Dementia "Smart" Wristbands

A "smart" wristband will be issued to people living with dementia. in a new project launched by the Alford & Mablethorpe NPT and part funded by the county's Police and Crime Commissioner. The wristbands will store the names and contact details of a wearer's next of kin and can be read by smart phones using near field communication technology. A pilot project using hundreds bands is being launched in East Lindsey and supported with a £1,000 grant from PCC Marc Jones and additional funding from local community groups including the Royal British Legion. The bracelets can be worn or carried by people living with dementia so, if they get lost, police or members of the public can quickly access details of the next of kin and contact them. These are not trackers, but details can be retrieved simply by placing a mobile phone against the device. If the trial is successful the project could be rolled out across the county. According to figures released by the NHS in January this year there are an estimated 11,800 people in Lincolnshire living with dementia - with 7,200 officially diagnosed.

It is crucial that people living with dementia can get to a place of safety and security, with friends or family, as quickly as possible. These wristbands will help achieve that. The project comes in the wake of Lincolnshire adopting the Herbert Protocol named after war veteran and dementia sufferer George Herbert. The Protocol form includes details about an individual's medication, daily routine and significant places as well as including a description and a photograph.

Include their date of birth and home address along with the requested name address and contact number and a member of the team will be in touch. Steve Bill


