Nature Trail Update



The Nature Trail volunteers have been busy recently planting tree saplings at several locations along the Trail. A significant proportion of the existing trees along the old railway line are Ash and unfortunately these are beginning to show the signs of Ash Dieback. Most of them are unlikely to survive this disease and a number of dead trees have already been removed. If nothing is done to replace them then the Nature Trail will have a very different character in future years

So, for the last couple of years the volunteers have been planting new trees donated by the Woodland Trust; these are all native species such as Oak, Willow, Hazel, Rowan and Birch that will allow us to maintain the wooded environment along the Trail and fill in the gaps left by the Ash. It's hard work for the volunteers but a worthwhile investment for the future. We were kindly joined by Councillor Ben Green for the last outing, who took the opportunity to get out of his office in the Woodland Trust to do some real work. Thanks Ben.

Chairman's Remarks

Chair to the Parish Council Cllr Caroline Hainsworth welcomed everyone to the meeting and thanked Cllrs Lucienne Bennett and Colin Russell for joining representatives of the Colsterworth Women's Institute, for the official photograph of opening the Commemorative bench donated by Colsterworth Women's Institute and Colsterworth and District Parish Council to celebrate the Platinum Jubilee of Queen Elizabeth 11 in 2022. Thank you also to Neil Bennett who stepped in to take the photograph. The bench is situated on Old Post Lane, Colsterworth.

Chair to the Parish Council informed everyone that just before the meeting she had received an email from Helen Scorror giving information on the' Warm Space Initiative' the Methodist Church will be having. As Helen was able to make the public meeting Caroline put this to PC on her behalf.

The 'Warm Space Initiative' is supported by the Frederick Ingle Charity at the Methodist Church Hall for the villagers. The hall will be open from 3-5pm on 8th, 22nd and 29th November 2022 and the 6th and 20th December 2022. Thanks were given to Cllr L McShane for stepping in to take the notes of the meeting in the absence of the Clerk.

LCC & SKDC Cllr Reports LCC Cllr Charlotte Vernon Reported; -

- Cost of Living Crisis LCC have information on their website. https://www.lincolnshire.gov.uk/council-councillors/ cost-of-living The Clerk to include in the next edition of the InTouch and Parish Council website.
- Fixmystreet (FMS) Continue to report concerns regarding potholes or damage to roads via the FMS website. New app coming very soon. More information on this at the next meeting.
- Fireworks Awareness LCC are raining awareness of buying unlicensed fireworks which could be extremely dangerous. Only licensed traders are allowed to sell fireworks. Unlicensed traders can be reported to Trading Standards https://www.nationaltradingstandards.uk/
- Avian Flu Unfortunately there are positive cases in Lincolnshire (Ancaster). Anyone keeping birds at home or commercially is advised to take measures to reduce the risk of the disease spreading. Do not touch dead wild birds, report them to the Animal and Plant Health Agency (APHA) on 03459 335577.
- Launch of The Home Learning Environment Campaign – Encouraging parents and carers to chat, play and read more with their child to develop their communication language and literary skills before they start school. Ideas for these activities can be found on the following website www.nhs.uk/start4life/chatplayread
- Biker Down A national training course designed to reduce motorcycle fatalities on the roads is available in Lincolnshire for the first time. The 3-hour course is free. To register an interest, please email biker.down@lincoln.fireuk.org
- Part-Night Streetlights Adjustments 30th October 2022 marked the end of British Summertime with the clocks going back one hour. This will temporarily affect the county's part-night streetlights. The sensors in the streetlights enter a period of adjustment, when their timings may vary as they adapt to Greenwich Mean Time.

- National Highways have announced a £196 million investment to improve roads across the Midlands. The A1 southbound near South Witham to benefit from £4.3 million resurfacing scheme.
- Financial LCC are facing financial constraints with the cost-of-living crisis and finance.

SKDC CIĬr David Bellamy Reported: -

- Devolution is back on the agenda due to the potential savings. This would be more likely to be a combined authority not unitary.
- The review of the SKDC Local Plan has not identified any shortage of land for housing supply at this time.
- SKDC moving offices to above the Savoy Cinema in Grantham. The old offices are to be sold; no offer has yet been made for these.
- There is multi agency action against fly tipping involving the Environment Agency, SKDC, Police, HMRC and LCC.

SKDC Cllr Ben Green Reported: -

- Ben is still trying to get a local PCSO to attend a meeting as the current PCSO for Colsterworth and District is still on sick leave. New PCSO's (between 3 – 10) are being recruited and once trained will attend Parish Council meetings. Commitment is to attend one meeting a year on a rota through the Isaac Newton Ward. It is hoped that there will be a better line of communication and presence in the New Year. The Public Safety Officer is to attend Parish Council meeting in the future.
- SKDC will remove old benches (not concreted in) if 2. contacted.
- SKDC are experiencing similar problems with cost of living and finance as LCC.

Derelict Garage, High Street, Colsterworth Agenda item 2022.97.

Agenda item deferred to December meeting.

Nature Trail boundary. Agenda item 2022.100 It was unanimously agreed that as tenants of the Nature Trail the

Parish Council will inform FCC the landowners of the concerns regarding encroachment for them to investigate further.

Clerks Report

- On Tuesday 11th October 2022 an underground fire was discovered on the Nature Trail at the rear of 54 Woolsthorpe Road. It was necessary to call out the Fire Service who put out the fire using 1,400 litres of water. The cause of the fire was identified as hot ashes being dumped in an area close to large tree roots. The fire destroyed the roots of three large trees causing them to become dangerously unstable. A tree surgeon attended and felled the trees at a cost of £680 to the Parish Council. Thanks to the Nature Trail Ranger and volunteer who initially investigated the report of fire any further fire damage was minimized.
- Small dam built on the River Witham Colsterworth, School Lane bridge area. Lincs River Trust and the Environment Agency informed who believe it may have been created by children, but it is not thought to be a problem.
- What looks like a temporary repair using chicken wire to the Bridge at the west end of the Nature Trail has been done. The Clerk has contacted FCC requesting a permanent repair to the Bridge wall is arranged.
- Footpath 3 has been inspected by LCC ROW and they noted that the crossfield section of public footpath is obstructed by a crop. They have written to the landowner in question and asked for the crop to be cleared from the path within the next 14 days.
- Very large overhanging branch on Woodlands Drive reported to Fix My Street Ref 434388. Work is scheduled.
- Back Lane, street nameplate at junction Back Lane/ Bridge End is in need of repair/replacement reported to SKDC.

NATURAL HISTORY BULLETIN

The appeal for more records, including observations of the more common plants and animals ,bore fruit. In a time of doom and gloom, here are some for us all to enjoy.

GREY WAGTAILS – one on a roof, another on a pond 'using lily pads as stepping stones.

GRASS SNAKES – an exact location for one 'with its yellow bow tie' showing

LONG TAILED TITS – a family lined up on telephone wires opposite the garden where they have been feeding daily until frightened off by a cat.

RED KITE coming at a regular time to feed in a garden where four species of tit (coal, longtailed,blue and great) feed regularly (at a separate time!) on 'smorgasbord' of delights

SLOW WORM A young one washed up on a step, near to a known breeding site. BULLFINCHES returned to a tree they were feeding in at this time last year. ROBINS Several reports of them returning to gardens. Their mournful songs contrasting with outbursts of aggressive behaviour. These may not be the same birds which were present throughout the summer as the females migrate south after breeding.

JACKDAWS – In mixed flocks with rooks, picking grit from roads, or single ones 'appearing to stand sentry on chimneys' whilst the others were out foraging, or squabbling.

FROGS Discovered when ponds cleared out, including in the filtration systems or new ponds attracting them. One young one in grass at pondside a bright green, jumped in the water where if it stays will darken in colour over the winter.

TOADS The records of these are scarce but one person reports hearing 'a very cross one' in the vicinity of the pond.



HEDGEHOGS searched for when preparing bonfires for Nov 5th. But none found. Also none seen out in the mild weather – an example of the usefulness sometimes of negative reports.

RABBITS Young ones seen out at dusk by afternoon walkers on their way home in the shortening days.

GREEN FINCH – A single male on a bird feeder

SPARROWHAWKS Two instances where one has discovered feeders. In the first sitting in a tree above them. In another flying in but on being aware of a window turned an abrupt right angle in mid swoop and flew away.

BEES Queen bumble bees and one report of honey bees out on mildest days (to16C)

REDWINGS Feeding on Holly berries in Woolsthorpe graveyard.

BUTTERFLIES Red Admiral, Small Tortoiseshell and Peacock

GREEN SHIELDBUG This still in its summer livery, it darkens as it hibernates in cold weather

BLACKBIRDS Some return to gardens where they have been absent

GREATER SPOTTED WOODPECKERS Young Birds, with their bright plumage have continued to feed in two gardens.

COLLARED EARTH STAR A fine photograph of this special fungus from the Nature Trail

HONEY FUNGUS Again a photo of a large clump of this parasite on a tree stump.

This is how we put together a picture of what has been happening in our parishes. Not by one month's observations of course – but over the 16 years we have been doing this. The more unusual species are sent to county recorders and rely on specialists sometimes for identification but there is an importance too in the plants and animals we can take for granted on our doorsteps.

To look for in December There are lots of gaps in the lists above. Add a couple of specials - are any blackcaps or chiff chaffs overwintering with us? Looking for overwintering insects – try a bramble patch. There may, for example be the tunnels of the larva of micromoths on the leaves.
