HEADLINES FROM THE PARISH COUNCIL MEETING 24th JANUARY 2023

There was one member of the public present who reported that one of the Back Lane street nameplates was in need of repair. The Clerk explained that she had previously reported that nameplate to South Kesteven District Council (SKDC) who responded that they would not be repairing the nameplate due to financial constraints because there was another metal nameplate on the opposite side of the road. The nameplate would be repaired in the future when finances allow. The member of the public then left the meeting.

Chairman's Remarks.

Chairperson Caroline Hainsworth welcomed everyone back after the Christmas and New Year break and hoped that everyone had a good one. They made special thanks to Community Cleaner Kevin Atter for keeping the service going and sent the Parish Council's best wishes to Mark Robertshaw for a speedy recovery.

LCC & SKDC Cllr Reports

County/District Councillor Report; -

SKDC Cllr Ben Green reported the following: -

- Community Speed Watch (CSW) Cllr Ben Green donated 2 x 30mph Community Speed Watch (CSW) signs to the Parish Council.
- Fix My Street (FMS) Lincolnshire County Council (LCC) Highways department reported that an empty grit bin at North Witham was not their responsibility and would not be filling it with grit and suggested that the Parish Council adopt the grit bin. Čllr Ben Green agreed to follow this up with LCC to ask them to take responsibility for re-filling the grit bin as the Parish Council do not have the facility to re-fill the bin.
- Gravity Fields Festival SKDC are hoping to cut back on the Arts funding budget and are looking for a huge amount of voluntary support for the event. Cllr Ben Green stated he was keen to drive this forward and encouraged the Parish Council to do so also. Chairperson Caroline Hainsworth asked for the Parish Council to be kept informed and invited ideas from the Parish Cllrs.
- LCC Police Communication exchanges and discussions with LCC Police continue to have a PCSO attend a Parish Council meeting at least once a year. Feedback from the Parish Council was that only a physical presence at a meeting would be acceptable.

SKDC Cllr David Bellamy Reported: -

- New Housing Estate off Bourne Road, Colsterworth The contact that the Clerk had made with Balfour Beatty Homes was very useful. Further information under Clerks report below point 17.
- Stainby damaged grass verges Second FMS reports made regarding damage to the grass verges on Middle Street and mud all down the road cause by HGV's. If necessary, Cllr Charlotte Vernon will be asked to escalate this.
- Vehicle Activated Sign (VAS) in North Witham. -Thank you for the VAS the residents of North Witham appreciated this. It would be useful to be able to turn the VAS

in the opposite direction. The Clerk will arrange to purchase the tool required to do this. Chairperson Caroline Hainsworth commented she was pleased that it had been well received.

Lincolnshire County Councillor (LCC) Charlotte Vernon was not in attendance at the meeting.

<u>Allotments</u>

It was resolved to increase the annual allotment rent by £2.50 per half allotment to £20 to help cover its costs as recommended by the Clerk at their Annual Renewal in April 2023.

Woolsthorpe Road Children's Play Area Wet Pour

A discussion took place and Cllr Ken Vickers proposed quotation 1 by Company 1 – Option 1 which was agreed by a majority at the increased quotation to include fencing hire at £6,399.31 excl VAT subject to the Clerk obtaining firm/fixed costs, specification, guarantee and timeframe.

Parking issues on the High Street.

Clirs reported on the ongoing issues, particularly with buses being obstructed. It was agreed to escalate this through Cllr Vernon Cllr Vernon in line with the request made September 2022 to consider all the High Street issues with LCC. In addition, this will be included on the Parish Priority Setting feedback to Lincolnshire Police, deadline 7th March 2023. It was also agreed for the Clerk to contact the bus company for feedback.

Church Troughs

It was resolved to agree to the Gardeners and Allotment Holders Association Grant application for flowers and liners for the Church Troughs for £280 as per the grant application submitted. (S137)

Nature Trail boundary.

It was unanimously agreed to send the amended letters to residents whose boundary meets the Nature Trail.

- Clerks Report

 1. Dama Damaged fence on Footpath 21 half-way between the High Street and Old Post Lane reported to LCC ROW. LCC ROW report the fence is not their responsibility. The landowner has now re-instated the fence.
- Signpost on Back Lane corroded base reported to Fix My Street. Work completed 6th January 2023.
- The Sir Isaac Newton bench has been installed on Woolsthorpe Road. Minute ref May 2022.22
- FP 15 reported to LCC ROW who have inspected the stiles, the kissing gates to replace these stiles are currently on order and will be completed when they come into stock, hopefully soon in the New Year.
- The cost of printing the In Touch magazine will increase from £230 excl vat to £250 excl vat from the February 2023 edition.
- The Clerk has taken receipt of the documents relating to the former charity, 'Sir Isaac Newton Memorial Hall'. To be stored by the Parish Council for the required six years. Minute ref December 2022.115.
- Grit bin refill requested for grit bin Water Lane, Stainby. LCC confirmed works are planned. Ref 441032.
- Keep left sign close to A Truck Stop damaged. LCC confirmed work is planned. Ref 442174.
- Multiple potholes reported on the High Dyke to FMS. 9. Work completed 5th January 2023.
- Potholes reported to FMS Back Lane before junction Woodlands Drive and also further up on Woodlands Drive. Work completed 13th January 2023.

- 11. Three FMS Reports made for damage to grass verges and excess mud on the Road in Stainby, Water Lane, Middle Street and Hall Lane caused by heavy vehicles. The Clerk & Cllr Bellamy have reported the issue again with FMS.
- 12. The broken style on FP3 reported to LCC ROW. Submission reference 1764488. Reported to the Parish Council by two parishioners.
- 13. FMS grit bin refill request made for Houghton's Lane, adjacent to the White Lion and Colster Way, close to Little Legs Nursery.
- 14. FMS report re blocked drains Bourne Road. Will be cleaned as part of the next schedule of works. Report closed.
- 15. Update from David Wilson Homes following the meeting with the Parish Council in November 2022: -
- a. They are investigating where the gulley outfalls to and if part of the pipe/system needs to be repaired.
- b. They have sent an enquiry to the residents' management company to find out if they are maintaining any of this area. Once they know one way or the other, they will know how to proceed.
- c. Lincs highways are happy with the condition of the culvert's underneath Brunel Avenue, they are only concerned with how the structures will be maintained and repaired in the future. David Wilson Homes are working on how this can be done. It is still their intention for all the roads to be adopted by LCC.
- 16. Parish Policing Priority Setting Meeting Feedback Form received. Due back 7th March 2023.
- 17. A resident reported concerns regarding HGV's, mud and access to the new housing estate being built off Bourne Road. The Clerk contacted the Balfour Beatty Land and Planning Manager who took on board the concerns of the resident and would instruct extra street cleaning and that they would try and mitigate the initial access problems until a fenced compound with turning circle is created.

Correspondence

Council received details of correspondence received across the Parish ranging from, allotment queries, blocked drains, potholes, litter and fly tipping.

Chairperson Caroline Hainsworth thanked Cllrs Roy Brocklebank, Colin Russell, Dave Bellamy and the Clerk for their time and help in taking delivery, setting up the 40mph sign and transporting them to their designated site for installation on Friday 20th January 2023. Special thanks were mentioned to LCC Road Safety (Accident Investigation) Manager Graeme Butler who supported the Parish Council thorough this project and installed the VAS onto their posts.



NATURAL HISTORY BULLETIN

Some of the earliest flowers of the year are provided by our trees. Hazel was recorded with catkins and female flowers by 2nd February. A few days later the Grey Alder had both catkins shedding pollen and female flowers. This is earlier than our native alder which only thrives in wetter conditions. Pussy Willow was a welcome sight in the few places where there are two kinds of Willow which flower before the leaves.



The Bramley Apple Tree, mentioned last month, has now been measured. Its girth is 80" (a rule of thumb for native deciduous trees is, after 50 years, 1" circumference of trunk at chest height, equals 1 years growth). Less is known about fruit trees. There is a photo taken before 1932 of this tree, which was planted together with other fruit trees in estate gardens. It is already well grown, with the tenant at this time standing beside it. At its base is the washing up bowl in which water from the village pond nearby was taken. This information and much else of interest is learned from a local resident whose family moved into

the house in 1932. This year it has been learned that two apple trees in Woodnook were planted by (the same?) estate in 1911. A fine example of trees carrying our Parish history.

In February Śnowdrops and Aconites are at their best in the hedgerows. The green flowers of Spurge Laurel had to be looked for on the Nature Trail. Brightest of the flowers were those of the Gorse but then "gorse is only out of flower when kissing's out of fashion". The green male flowers of Dog's Mercury were discovered by their yellow anthers. They are an indication that a wood was once there.

Dead leaves left on the ground still bore Galls - red spangles on oak, nails on maples, blisters on willows. Do they still contain insect life and provide food for birds after the berries have gone? In the first few days of February Queen Buff tailed and Tree Bumble Bees were out in gardens. Honey Bees had the very early Crocuses to themselves as the Bumble Bees were too heavy. All three species were seen at intervals from then on in various gardens, appearing when there was sunshine and milder conditions. The Small Tortoiseshell Butterfly first seen on 6th February and on two occasions since, was the only record of Butterflies by 18th February. Most welcome has been the lists of garden birds sent in. Taken together they show the scarcity of finches - particularly the greenfinch, with goldfinch only very slowly recovering from the population crash two years ago. By contrast blackbirds were in numbers, particularly where apples had been put out for them. Pied wagtails like open spaces, and this time of year are regulars on the playing fields. There was one record of them on rooftops and one on a lawn. The Greater Spotted Woodpecker is now a regular feeder in several gardens. One comprehensive list from garden and view from window included a flock of Yellow Hammers over a field and a line of Great and Blue tits on a fence waiting for the feeders to be renewed. Starlings, having fewer places to go nowadays were heard at dusk, numbers of them very noisy,

settling into a laurel hedge. Other observations include those of behaviour, particularly as a prelude to courtship and nesting. Woodpigeons are not typical – as evidenced by notes on three separate pairs. Pair one billing and cooing and bowing in courtship on a roof. Pair two building a loose construction of twigs, precarious near the top of a tree. Pair three with an egg dropped on the ground below.



Animals seen out were Muntjac Deer, Hares, Rabbits and Badgers. A single Frog at a pond was the first reported this year.

To Look For in March - The Song Thrush is last in full song. Becoming scarce it may sing on until summer if unable to find a mate. Frogs now depend on garden ponds and every record of them is invaluable. Toads are even scarcer. Don't forget to look up into the trees and to note the valuable scrub and its contents. Blackthorn will be out. The flowering Coltsfoot is the next on Natures Calendar. Spring really starts with the yellow Brimstone Butterfly - "the butter coloured flutterby". NOTICE OF FOOTPATH RE-SURFACING, COLSTERWORTH

The Parish Council have been advised of Lincolnshire County Council's footway micro-surfacing scheme in some areas of Colsterworth during 2023

Residents will receive 5-7 days in advance of the works from Lincolnshire County Council
