PUBLIC FORUM

There were three persons present at the public forum. Brief details are below, full details can be found under https://colsterworth.parish. lincolnshire.gov.uk/downloads/download/32/agendas-and-minutesfrom-may-2022?downloadID=32

Broken Gate - The first spoke in relation to a broken gate from the metal fence around Colster Way Play area close to Rope Walk. The Clerk explained that they had already contacted the manufacturer for replacement hinges and due to the weight of the gate needed help to remove it for safe keeping. The second member of the public kindly offered to collect the gate and store it at their home.

Litter - The second member of the public a valued regular volunteer litter picker spoke in relation to the ongoing litter and fly tipping problem around the local businesses in the location of the A151 flyover. They thanked the Parish Council for the recent article placed in the In Touch magazine on the large voluntary litter pick they arranged where 60 bags of litter were collected over the A151 flyover. SKDC Cllr D Bellamy said he would contact the Environmental Health Department regarding this and let the Clerk know of any action taken.

Speeding- The third member of the public spoke in relation to speeding traffic at Bridge End, saying now they had small children they were more aware of the issue.

Chair to the Parish Council Cllr C Hainsworth extended the public forum to 7.45pm to allow each member of the public to speak. CHAIR'S REMARKS

NATURAL HISTORY BULLETIN

Though catkins on hazel, willow and alder appeared at similar times to previous years other tree flowers, like ash and elm were later. More noticeable has been how late the trees are in producing leaves. Coltsfoot 's bright yellow flowers were noted first near the disused telephone box by which time dandelions were coming out in the hedges. Cowslips alongside the A1 and Marsh Marigolds beside a pond both flower regularly at the beginning of April, later than the books suggest. The Danish Scurvy grass, a salt requiring plant, was forming a white flowered border along the edges of the A1 central reservation. Its seeds have travelled on the wheels of vehicles all the way from the NE coast living with the help of salt spread on roads in winter. An April survey on 3/4/23 of the Roadside Nature Reserve in Woolsthorpe found lungwort in flower and patches of the Early Dog Violet, distinguished by its smaller flowers and paler colour from great swathes of the vivid Sweet Violet. The cowslips emerging were on short stems and not noticeable until close to them. Often overlooked, the tiny Spring Whitlow Grass, with tiny white flowers and shining round seed heads, was managing in the merest scraps of soil.



Bees under close observation during the last three years in one garden had the Tree Bumble Bee and Bufftailed Bee Queens out first followed by, a Carder Bee Queen on 3rd April. The Hairy footed Flower Bee, both the males and females were later out, not seen until April. At time of writing (12th April) in this garden, no other solitary bees seen out, few Honey Bees and no hover flies, so that with windy weather and few pollinators, there is concern for the pollination of pear, plum and cherry blossom. Indeed, generally so few insects about that 7-spot ladybirds crawling out from shrubs, a green shieldbug in a conservatory and a Queen Wasp emerging from a woodpile were cause for excitement. A Humming Bird Hawkmoth in a garden on the evening of Easter Sunday.Brimstone, Peacock and small white Butterflies have been seen in gardens.

Particularly valuable are the observations of those of you who watch the changing behaviour of birds as Spring gets under way. Starlings which gathered in a walnut tree at dusk in March, steadily increasing in number until they formed a small murmuration as they circled before going to roost. They have now dispersed to nest. Jackdaws, deprived of their traditional nests in chimneys now cleared and capped have found new sites, including a pigeon coup and an owl box. After a hedge lost, a blackbird has a nest in the thick vegetation at the base of a winter-flowering clematis, undeterred by the fact it is right against a back door. Another similar plant is home to a dunnock and they are building, as last year in a thick mass of Clematis montana. Families of long-tailed tits which have fed regularly at feeders are now split up and a pair comes on its own.

Other sharp eyes have picked up the first migrating birds like blackcap, and keen ears the sound of chiffchaff. A single siskin amongst finches at a feeder and most unusually a brambling. On 12th April a single swallow flew low near a nesting site from last year – almost to the day one seen here last year. It will be a male who are the first to arrive.

Tadpoles are now developing in ponds, the first spawn was recorded on 13th March. Several fairly new ponds are doing well but three older ponds have had no spawn, one for the first time in 40 years, though last years spawn didn't develop. A white deer seen amongst the fallow deer in the Twyford area. Hares out in daylight, more often noted than rabbits,



The most intriguing record was shown in a short video of two stoats fighting in a flurry of arms legs and tails. They difficult to be sure they appeared to be two adult males, larger than females. Two male mammals fighting would usually denote holding territory or attracting a mate. However stoats mate in the autumn and, due to delayed implantation do not produce young until March at earliest. The female has her own nest. The male has his own and does not take part in rearing young except has been known to bring food to the female during lactation when she cannot get out herself. Young stoats are known to take part in play fighting, some of which can look quite fierce. Does anyone know more about this activity?

To Look For In May. The best thing would be that those who send in observations continue to do so as last month a regular update on our common plants and animals and how they are doing and notes on the more unusual and those things which we await each season like the house martins and swifts, the cuckoo and the spotted flycatcher, butterflies, bats and reptiles.
