



### Public Forum

Chairperson C Hainsworth welcomed the two members of the public present.

The first member of the public spoke in support of their application for Parish Councillor for Colsterworth, agenda item 2023.45. The Clerk confirmed that the applicant met the qualifying criteria to become a Parish Councillor for Colsterworth and the Chairperson invited them to join the Parish Council. The member of the public duly signed the Declaration of Acceptance witnessed by the Clerk before leaving the meeting at 7.36pm to attend a prior engagement.

The second member of the public spoke in support of agenda item 2023.46.1 and 2 as the tenant of the Stamford Road paddock. They handed document \*SRA1 to the Cllrs outlining their plans for the agenda item to build three small nonpermanent field shelters for housing horses and goats with no requirement for planning consent. They answered questions raised by Cllrs to their satisfaction before leaving the meeting at 7.45pm.

\* At 8.20pm a third member of the public arrived. Chair to the Council C Hainsworth reminded them to arrive for 7.30pm for the public forum before allowing them to speak. They reported the damaged sign on Colster Way Play area already noted at agenda item 2023.50.8 Clerk's Report and a streetlamp on Back Lane illuminated during daylight. The Clerk will report the streetlight to the relevant authority for repair.

# Chair's Remarks

Chairperson C Hainsworth welcomed everyone to the meeting stating that they had no significant remarks and moved to the next agenda item.

## **Lincolnshire County Council and South Kesteven District** Councillors Report.

LCC Cllr C Vernon, SKDC Cllr B Green and SKDC Cllr D Bellamy sent their apologies.

### **Co-Option for Cllr for Colsterworth**

Mr Mike Childs was unanimously approved as Cllr for Colsterworth.

### **Stamford Road Paddock**

It was unanimously agreed for the paddock tenant to build nonpermanent shelters for two ponies and one horse.

## **Eco-Tumble surface – North Witham Play Area**

Unanimously agreed for the evidence provided by Cllr Clark to be presented to Wicksteed Leisure Ltd.

Post meeting note - On Friday 7th July 2023 the head of Wicksteed Customer Service confirmed that the repair to the play area surface would be covered under the guarantee and arranged for contractors to attend on Monday 10th July to rectify the issue.

# **FOCUS**

Friends of Colsterworth United Societies - The beginning. Dennis Adams called an open meeting for all villagers, to discuss the possibilities of starting up a Social Group. A document was established to determine what interested most people. Out of this came New Age Kurling. The remit of FOCUS at start up -"FOCUS is for all of us to take part and get something out of it. New friendships and new interests. We would like to think there is something for everyone. If there is something you would to see get started please let us know and we can see if others are interested in the same things. If you have any suggestions on how we can go forward with this group, your input would be appreciated." FOCUS started in 2012 with a luncheon at the Wheatsheaf, followed shortly afterwards by a walk along Grantham Canal, and looking to set up New Age Kurling. Rosemary Haw submitted sheets of interest to those present at a committee meeting and asked for votes on what they would most like to see set up. It was unanimous that New Age Kurling was the most requested activity. On the 1st November 2012 Francis and Rosemary wrote to the Colsterworth and District Parish Council for a grant to purchase necessary equipment for New Age Kurling. The Parish Council actually gave a grant of £600 to fund the cost of said equipment. Because at this time, there was no formal Committee, a meeting was arranged and a steering group was set up. This consisted of June Jessop, Eileen Lewenden, Liz McCaig and Rosemary Haw. It was agreed that the group would encompass a wide range of activities, many of which were already set up.

After 1 year it was agreed a formal Committee would be set up including a Chair, Secretary and Treasurer. In November 2013, A full Committee was set up, Chair: Rosemary Haw, Treasurer: Liz McCaig Secretary: Francis Haw, Ted Ray, Brian Ostler, Bill Walsh and June Jessop. New Age Kurling was arranged for every Monday initially, but its popularity soon outshone its capacity and a waiting list was put in place, which resulted in the second group being arranged for a Thursday starting in May 2017, and memberships at this group quickly grew. As the success of New Age Kurling continued, so did the inclusion of other activities, some of which are listed here-Photography Group, Luncheon Club, Walking Group, Singing Group, Art Group, Travel Group, and Winter games afternoons. All these became very successful and were run by the Committee.

Many trips were organised, River Trent Boat trips which included lunch, a very popular outing, Coach trips to, Thursford, Derbyshire, Black Country Museum, Cambridge and York to name but a few. Also, the villagers got plenty of entertainment too, including - Annual BBQ first week in August - subsidised. Annual Christmas Lunch subsidised. Dog Racing at Peterborough - subsidised. Queens Golden Jubilee was held at Millfield house, with Morris Men and ScottishCountry dancers. On the Queens 90th Birthday, all villagers 90 years and older were invited to celebrate at the village hall with a fete, tea party and entertainment. Christmas Tree Festival was held at the village Church every year. Christmas carols sung around the village, usually with a stop at the local inn. An Art Display was also held at the village Church. Cheese and wine parties where held to raise funds for the village church. Events were also held to raise money for local charities, usually about £400 per annum. A Fund raising activity was initiated which resulted in the purchase of a Defibrillator. This was duly achieved and it is situated on the front of the village hall. Many other events were held at the village hall, all usually in collaboration with the Social Club included such events with bouncy castles, children's races craft and art stalls and Tombola. In 2019, New Age Kurling, Lunch Club, Singing Group, Walking Group and Games Group, along with many social functions were still enjoyed by many of its members. Unfortunately ,COVID, really didn't help with the decline in numbers and activities from New Age Kurling and from all of its other Groups. Rosemary and Francis took the difficult decision to stand down just under a year ago, due to leaving the village and to explore new and exciting things. In July 2021 a meeting was held to discuss the way forward of FOCUS coming out of COVID. It was suggested that a meeting could be arranged for all members to seek their preferences. An Open meeting was held on 11th August 2021 in the village Hall and after lengthy discussions and consultation it was decided that New Age Kurling should remain the focal point of FOCUS for the time being. We are still moving forward as a new Committee and will continue to look to both of these very dedicated people for their help and support in the future. Many of these ideas originated from Rosemary, who worked very closely with members of the Committee and it is to Rosemary and Francis that we, the new Committee and all it members give our thanks. # NATURAL HISTORY BULLETIN

On Saturday night, 8th July a vehicle travelling home from Corby Glen found its windscreen splattered with insects, a rare occasion nowadays. These included moths. Writing in mid July of period from 14th June there have been regular reports, some with photographs, of both adults and caterpillars of moths, mostly seen in gardens. In one case night-fliers have been watched after sunset as they visited the opening flowers of Evening Primrose and Honeysuckle. Both have pale flowers which shine but scent in the honeysuckle is also an attractant. It helps guide the moths to the entrance to the narrow tube leading to the nectar. On the night the flower buds open, both the anthers and the stigma hang outside the flower but in such a way that only the anthers with the pollen come into contact with the visiting moth. Later the stigma is so arranged that only it will come into contact. In this way the flower avoids self pollination a) and b).

In one garden Cinnabar Moths in red and black laid the eggs of their black and yellow caterpillars on groundsel – all colours to warn predators of their poisons which are best know as being concentrated on ragwort. The yellow papery chrysalids of Six Spot Burnets were found attached to the tall stems of grasses. Photos from a garden of Scarlet Tiger Moth with red underwings and

another of an equally striking Magpie

Moth with red amongst its black and

white markings. The latter may lay eggs on the gooseberry bushes where its caterpillars will strip all the leaves. Black markings on the fluffy white wings of a Small Ermine found with a piece pecked out of its wing by a bird. On its way across the Stamford Road, its bright green fat and fully grown body encircled with what looks like rows of studs a fully grown caterpillar of an Emperor Moth of A Brown-tailed Tussock Moth in a hedge but much darker. There was a photo of a Brown Tailed Tussock Moth in a hedge, soon with others to spin protective webbing. A Mottled Beauty adult was misleading, its scalloped lines against a dark background rather than the more usual grey. A large Hawk Moth, not as colourful as many other kinds of hawk Moth was hidden and resting in the day amongst Ivy leaves. The Poplar Hawk Moth is however distinctive in the way it spreads its lower wings above its upper wings at rest this is another way it remains camouflaged.(c)



On the Nature Trail the numbers of Marbled Whites built up in July and there continued to be many Meadow Browns and, in the shade, Speckled Woods. Ringlets and Gatekeepers are now also numerous. By contrast only a single Small Tortoiseshell and a single Red Admiral has been seen as evidence of summer broods. Ants seen swarming on 7th July were reported from one garden, but less in numbers than previous years.

New ponds continue to bring new interest to their owners. One has a sequence of photographs of a dragonfly emerging from a pond to stretch, spread out and dry its new wings.

On 12th July, following days of storms the sky was clear, but empty of the Swifts which have sliced through the air each morning. Their young having already departed the parents have followed them on their long migration.

A dead pigmy shrew was carefully checked for its identification. Though much smaller than the Common Shrew its size can be near to that of a baby one. A better feature is the length of the tail in proportion to the body. It is shorter than the body length of the common shrew but as long or longer than the body in the pigmy shrew. Dentition would have also been diagnostic but the head of this specimen had been bitten off probably by a predator who rejected it because of it s foul taste. The pigmy shrew is rarely seen although it feeds both day and night needing to eat the equivalent of its body weight every twenty four hours. It runs rapidly through tunnels of grass seeking out beetles, spiders earthworms and wood lice. It is more silent than the common shrew. We are most likely to see it brought in as a trophy by the domestic

# Spotlight on Mo Taylor and the Nature Trail



Since 2014 Maurice Taylor or Mo as he likes to be known has created, led and inspired volunteering efforts to transform the disused railway line in Woolsthorpe by Colsterworth from a somewhat neglected piece of industrial land into a green asset for the benefit of the local community and natural environment. The railway was still in use until the late 1970's, used to transport the ironstone that was quarried in the area for many years. Once the railway line was de-commissioned and the track removed nature took its course, and the area of land quickly became overgrown and inaccessible.

In 2014 Colsterworth and District Parish Council were granted a 99-year lease from Lincwaste/FCC'. Maurice Taylor volunteered to be Lead Nature Trail Ranger for Colsterworth and spearhead the transformation of the 2 mile stretch of land into a 'Nature Trail' for the benefit of residents and surrounding villages.

Work began on the Nature Trail almost immediately, creating an entrance and a footpath at Bridge End, Colsterworth by cutting down trees, overgrown shrubs, and blackthorn. Steps and handrails were installed to ensure that visitors could access the Nature Trail safely. Local members of the community hearing about Mo's mission and seeing the early stages of the transformation soon volunteered their services. The initial group of 3 volunteers has now grown to over 30, enabling them to clear and create a footpath that stretches for over 2 miles. An abundance of apple and pear trees has been uncovered, which have apparently sprung up as a result of the train drivers
