## Public Forum:

There were 15 members of the public in attendance, a brief summary of the issues discussed is below. Full details can be found on the Colsterworth and District Parish Council website detailed above

**Gunby Brook Flooding:** - First to speak was a resident from Gunby who spoke about Gunby Brook and how this should be an attractive feature in the village but over the past 4/5 years it has not been cleared regularly enough and had recently led to flooding events with lots of weeds blocking the brook.

Gunby Potential Anaerobic Digestion Plant (Biogas): - A resident from Gunby produced a model of the proposed Biogas development showing the actual impact in terms of size. They understood that there would be two tanks measuring 19 metres in height. The model showed the scale of the domes and storage units in relation to the terraced houses in Gunby. They expressed their opinion that it will not be about farming but will be a factory industry site not suitable for the village of Gunby.

Blocked drain outside 12 Ramsey Court, Colsterworth: - Action: The PC to write to LCC Highways/SKDC

Old Larkfleet Development/Colsterworth Trust Estates: -Several residents reported that there appears to be some activity on the development site and had heard that building will be starting in the new year. Cllr D Bellamy explained that as far as they were aware there would need to be a new planning application submitted.

Steels Lane, Colsterworth: - A member of the public requested that the tree at the bottom of Steels Lane with the High Street is cut down as it is obscuring the view into the road and is scraping against cars as they come down the Lane. Action The Clerk will visit the area to establish responsibility for cutting back the tree.

Woolsthorpe by Colsterworth Issues: - A resident from Woolsthorpe reported, overgrown vegetation on Woolsthorpe Road, work is planned. Gravel at the junction Water Lane & Old Post Lane preventing water draining into the ditch. Post meeting note: FMS Report made Ref: 478299.

Request that the PC investigate alternative options for displaying the PC Christmas Lights in December 2024 if the Yew Trees at St John the Baptist Church yard grow too big to display the lights in the usual way.

The Public Forum was extended to 8.05pm to allow all those present to speak.

We are delighted to update you on the successful completion of our river restoration project in Colsterworth, immediately south of Stainby Road.

After carefully surveying the river for fish and native crayfish, as well as other wildlife that could be affected, we were fortunate to start work during the continued dry spell at the end of September.

With archaeologists on site daily to monitor excavations, the experienced contractors soon got to work re-creating natural river features such as limestone gravel bars and lowering the banks in some areas to enable the river to freely reconnect to its floodplain in high flows.

They also redirected a spring which was previously running directly into the river, encouraging it to inundate the floodplain and create a wetland area for wildlife.

This wetland along with the new ponds will help to provide additional water storage during times of high rainfall making it available for drier periods and will also help to slow the flow of the river whilst filtering out silt and other pollutants.

The introduction of gravel bars, riffles and woody material have ensured more diverse flow, creating ideal habitat for wildlife including brown trout and numerous freshwater invertebrate species.

Luckily the contractors had completed the works just in time for the arrival of storm Babet which, as I'm sure you are aware, brought with it incredibly exceptional amounts of rainfall across the country

The interventions held strong as the valley bottom was awash with a month's worth of rain over just a few hours and, as the water subsided, the ponds were filled and the restoration was working as planned, holding significantly more water to help slow the flow downstream and creating a haven for wetland wildlife.

We are very excited to watch the area recover and establish over the coming months and have plans to continue to work with the Wild Trout Trust, the Environment Agency and other partners to carry out further works along the river Witham over time, which collectively we hope will help to store even more water, alleviating flooding pressures and will provide much needed habitat for our threatened wildlife.

Enormous thanks go to our funders the Environment Agency and Anglian Water Get River Positive, and to the landowners Buckminster Estate and their very patient tenant farmer for all their support and for allowing us to carry out the project in this location.

## NATURAL HISTORY BULLETIN

Wet conditions favour fungi. The annual foray in Twyford Wood at the end of October was well attended with 40 people including children from the Watch Group of the Lincolnshire Wildlife Trust. They found 70 different kinds including jelly and coral types which do not have the familiar cap, stalk and gills.. We give common names to things we see often and remember them when we know something about their lives. All fungi have a tale to tell, some seem in the realm of fantastic. The mushrooms and toadstools, brackets and other structures we see above ground are only the fruiting bodies. Below the surface is the extraordinary network of threads (hyphae) forming their web of life. This 'mycelium' draws in water and nutrients from the soil and can exchange these with trees. The Oyster fungus is so called for its culinary value. It breaks down lignin in wood. It has an extra ability to obtain nitrates. Its threads trap and digest minute worms. Sulphur Tuft mushrooms are named for their colour and habit of growing in clusters at the base of trees. They are a good source of yellow dye. Some fungi are parasites. The Tinder Bracket emerging from Silver Birch trees is deserting a sinking ship. Its name comes from its ancient use for fires. The common Birch Bracket has anti-biotic properties. Its alternative name is Razorstrap fungus as it was used to sharpen blades. These are just some of the readily identifiable species which were found on the foray.

20 years ago a line of trees was planted on a new estate. The exotic Turkish Hazel appeared two years ago to have gall-like growths on some of its branches. This year the trees have been covered in spiny rosettes of ripe, brown fruits, resembling sea urchins. Their hazel nuts remain tightly enclosed until they drop to the ground. Grey squirrels, so abundant

everywhere this year were foraging them and carrying them away. Interestingly field guides refer to them as not fruiting in this country because it is too cold.



On the fungus foray one of our largest land birds, the Raven, flew overhead. Nearby one of our smallest, the Goldcrest, was sitting in a larch tree. At a garden pond it was most unusual to find two visitors, a Kingfisher and a Grey Wagtail. This delighted the creators of this pond which has already provided much interest and value for wildlife. Redwings and Fieldfares were back in numbers by November 1st, feasting on berries and fallen apples on the Nature Trail.

Several people have noted signs of Badgers out and about. They will continue active except in the coldest conditions, their cubs born in the sett and not emerging until May. Unfortunately we have evidence of Badgers most often from roadkills. It is important for several reasons that the whereabouts of their setts is not publicised. Not least because the threat to them (and to hares) is that they are a target for illegal activities called 'sport'. We are fortunate to have a few people who have the interest and patience to look for signs of their activity.

TO LOOK FOR IN DECEMBER At the time of writing (9th November, 2023) reports are coming in of Waxwings on the north Lincolnshire coast, flying south. Perhaps we will have a 'Waxwing winter' as they have settled before in this area, including on the Nature Trail. Fungi will be about until the first hard frosts. Severe weather will bring in wading birds looking for some open water on Witham and surrounding fields. And winter is a time to focus on small thing lost in the abundance of other seasons. In leaf litter on branches, under stones how is life surviving? A Great Tit on a sunny day may anticipate Spring with a song. I look forward to you sharing your observations via 61 Woolsthorpe Road, 860465,


