If you would be interested in free defibrillator training please contact the Clerk to the Parish Council, Sue Grant, email: clerk@colsterworthanddistpc.co.uk Tel: 01476861888. Sessions will take place on a Tuesday or Friday evening between 19th February and 26th March 2024. More info:

LeisureSK is keen to engage and support our communities and with our team of trainers already in place at our leisure centres we've been able to help by delivering a number of sessions in the community based on the Royal Lifesaving Society "Save a Life" scheme. These are free 2.5-3hrs sessions that cover some basic first aid skills, resuscitation and using a defibrillator. The sessions are offered for awareness and practise/ experience and are not a qualification. The sessions have been well received though with feedback from those attending the sessions feeling more confident in how the devices work and how they can respond in an emergency. Over the last few years there has been a significant growth in

the number of Automatic External Defibrillators (AED's) within our communities. Whilst this offers reassurance to help in an emergency, some in the community did express a concern that they had no experience of cardio pulmonary resuscitation (CPR) or how to use an AED – especially as it's likely to be an

extremely stressful situation when it's needed. Sessions run for approx. 2.5-3hrs Training equipment is provided.

Training Venue to be confirmed at Colsterworth Village Hall, North Witham Village depending on numbers attending. Maximum 12-14 individuals per session. The sessions are delivered free of charge but those taking part

Play Areas

The Council maintains the Play Areas at Colster Way, Woolsthorpe Road, Newton Grange and by North Witham village hall.

Old Post Lane Cemetery

The management of the Old Post Lane cemetery includes the provision of burial plots and maintenance.

Defibrillators

The Council maintains the five defibrillators which are located :-1. Outside the White Lion Public House. 2. Outside Colsterworth Village Hall. 3. Woolsthorpe Road, in the old telephone kiosk. 4. Outside Little Legs premises on Colster Way. 5. Outside North Witham Village Hall.

Finance

The Council has the authority to raise a precept to finance its expenditure.

Traffic and Highways

The Parish Council would like regular contact with LCC Highways to try and resolve speeding, maintenance, signage and other problems (also in consultation with the Police)

Policing and Crime Prevention

The Council is active in working with the Police in reducing and preventing crime in the villages.

Clearing Litter

Twp part-time Litter-pickers are employed to keep the villages tidy.

Plánning

The Council is a statutory consultee in planning but has no decision-making powers.

Parish Plan

The implementation of the Parish Plan is a high priority.

Footpaths and Rights of Way

The Council is active in having footpaths and rights of way kept open and clear.

Grants

Grants may be given for local groups but are proportionate to the number of people who would benefit.

Seats

The Council will consider the provision of seat that would benefit parishioners.

War Memorial

The Council previously had a project to investigate restoration of the War Memorial and at the December 2022 Parish Council meeting it was agreed for former Cllr T Neale to start a dialogue with Colsterworth Festival of Remembrance (CFoR) to investigate working in partnership to support the restoration of

the War Memorial. Nature & Wildlife

The Council supports biodiversity projects in the Parish and particularly supports the Nature Trail on the old Railway Line. **Lincolnshire County Council** is responsible for maintaining the county's adopted roads and footpaths. You can report a fault on the following website:

NATURAL HISTORY BULLETIN

On 1st January 2024 the sun came out briefly and a Queen Buff-tailed Bumble Bee emerged from her nest to sip nectar from the winter Honeysuckle flowers - a rare and premature sign of Spring in the dark, cold and exceptionally wet Winter days. Apart from winter Gnats dancing in the air to attract a mate, insects were hard to discover.

One of you brought inside a twig of Hazel. Its catkins were still unopened. On its branch a single fat Greenfly was discovered. We are used to seeing them in numbers, fastened by their tubular mouths onto some green and growing plant from which they siphon sap. Since they can turn our prized plants into diseased and sticky messes our main concern is to get rid of them - but their ways of reproducing can outwit us. This individual was a female. Without a mate or fertilization produces other females, fully formed in a process which resembles a breach birth. This baby will already bear a new female. Rapidly new daughters are produced in a line behind the original mother. The colonies thus formed are part of an important circle of life.



Textbooks so often take glamourous or exotic examples to illustrate the principles of ecology - Pandas and Bamboo shoots, Lions, Antelopes, and Grasslands. The stories are in our own gardens for us to discover. Aphids, like Greenfly rely on

plant sap. Small birds like Bluetits feed on Aphids and in turn are predated by those higher up the food chain (other birds. mammals). The plant took life from sunlight and air, water, and soil. The treads of Fungi work to break down living matter and, in a healthy soil make essential nutrients available to other life. It is more than a food chain it is the circle of life.

The Crow family can be relied upon to anticipate Spring early. Crows and Rooks beginning to inspect their nesting sites. Jackdaws in pairs on the roofs. Though several people have lamented the lack of birds in gardens they seem to have accumulated in others. Fieldfares and Redwings at first concentrated along the Nature Trail feeding on apples are now dispersed into fields. Goldfinches are returning to feeders. Fat balls and Sunflower seeds attract Greater Spotted Woodpeckers, Tits, and Sparrows. Many gardens with a resident Robin and a Wren – both feeding from the ground. One report was of several dozen Bullfinch on a field hedge. Another was of a Bullfinch on yellow Rowan berries. An important sighting which just missed the last bulletin was of Waxwings in a garden on 18th December 2023.

White and Red Deadnettle and Ivy-leaved Toadflax are wildflowers in bloom, but garden flowers are important for bees. One garden has a dozen herbs, shrubs and trees out on January 1st 2024. Winter Aconites are a fortnight earlier this year, but records of Snowdrops can be misleading. The species drawn Galanthus Nivalis, long naturalised in the wild but other species and varieties flower early in December. We have a special place in folklore for the early plants which mark the turning year - Snowdrops and Primroses, Cowslips and Bluebells - all of which to look forward to.



TO LOOK FOR IN FEBRUARY - Bees and Butterflies, Lesser Celandine, the first Frogs.

SOUTH KESTEVEN PROSPERITY FUND GRANT

The Parish Council have been successful in a grant application to the South Kesteven Prosperity Fund of up to £1,200 for a **NATURE TRAIL TREE CONDITION ASSESSMENT.**

The tree Condition Assessment took place on 6th December 2023 by East Midlands Tree Surveys Limited. The objectives of the Condition Assessment are to:-

To make an assessment of the trees' condition and identify any faults.

• To provide management recommendations based on the data gathered.

A specialist tree condition assessment was arranged as a duty of care for the Parish Council on the Scout Camp area which is in a woodland setting. Also, the remaining trees surveyed are along the southern side of the old railway line path that runs adjacent to gardens to the south. Colsterworth Nature Trail on which stretches some two miles from Skillington Road, Woolsthorpe by Colsterworth eastwards to Bridge End (B6403), Colsterworth.

The purpose was to identify and prioritise those trees which require felling and allow healthy trees to remain.

Recommendations have been made for the removal of any trees at risk and control measures for the existing trees. To assess the trees' condition and identify any faults. To provide management recommendations based on the data gathered. The benefit of the Tree Condition Assessment is so that the Nature Trail can continue to be as safe environment for people to enjoy and encourage wildlife habitats and wildflower meadows.



If they put an incorrect item in the silver bin for their next recycling collection, SKDC's street scene crews will place helpful advisory tags on any that contain the wrong items, explaining which items are in the wrong bin to help people get used to the change.

From Monday February 5th, the Council will no longer empty any recycling bins with incorrect items in them. You can refer to the "Right Thing Right Bin" leaflet to ensure rejected

bins are kept to a minimum. Anyone who remains unsure can request a home visit from SKDC staff for assistance on this.
