War Memorial Restoration Project Update March 2024

At the Parish Council meeting on 5th March 2024, the Parish Council accepted a grant offer from FCC Communities to cover the costs of the War Memorial Restoration subject to additional funds being raised by CFoR.



In addition to the £3,000 already paid to the Parish Council for the Project from our restoration campaign in 2023, a further contribution of £1,407.35 was made to the Parish Council due to a generous donation from

Albert White at the A1 Truckstop and a payment from the Co-op Local Community Fund who has nominated CFoR as its Local Cause for 2024.

Donations are still being accepted to cover other additional costs including the maintenance of the War Memorial gardens.

CFoR Co-Founders Captain David Heath-French RAMC and Debi Heath-French were delighted that all the hard work and support for the Project has been achieved and that our beloved War Memorial will be restored.

"This would not have been possible without the input of ex-Parish Councillor Terry Neale and the partnership forged between CFoR and the Parish Council. We must also acknowledge the work of the CFoR Committee and members, particularly Jackie Taylor, Caroline Hainsworth and Hattie McShane-Smith, and all the generous individual donations, volunteers, local businesses and residents and visitors who gave so much support."

CFoR's aspiration is for the War Memorial to be restored by 6th June 2024, the 80th Anniversary of D-Day. The Armistice Parade will be on Sunday 10th November 2024

Public Forum:

Chairperson Cllr C Hainsworth welcomed everyone to the meeting and stated as there were no persons present for the public session to move straight to the business of the meeting.

CHAIR'S REMARKS:

Chairperson Cllr C Hainsworth had no remarks other than to mention that the next meeting will be after the clocks have moved forward.

Lincolnshire County Council and South Kesteven District Councillors Report.

SKDC Cllrs D Bellamy and B Green sent their apologies and sent the report below on issues raised at the previous meeting and ongoing issues which was read out by the

A151/ A1 Flyover Embankment Litter:

The Council at their last meeting set aside a budget of 60K to start cleaning the A1 verge. To do all the A1 in our area would be considerably more but they hope this will be an ongoing process and money set aside annually. They asked that the A151 flyover area is covered in this cleanup as the litter there is directly connected to vehicles coming on and off the A1 to the nearby facilities.

Local Plan Review:

LCC Cllr C Vernon Report:

Cllr C Vernon arrived at 7.45pm in time to give their report:

- 1. The consultation on Devolution has closed.
- 2. Lincolnshire Council Tax has increased by 4.99%.
- 3. Refuse bins are not a County responsibility, but they are aware that SKDC are working to resolve the recent confusion regarding the recycling bins.
- Highways issues Colsterworth They contacted the Highways Manager again on 5th March 2024 and await a reply.
- Flooding on the Woolsthorpe slip road to the A1 is being investigated.

Updates for Council administration

Resolved to renew the Lincolnshire Association of Local Councils Membership subscription of £474.40 excl vat. Resolved to renew the Lincolnshire Association of Local Councils (LALC) annual training scheme membership at £180 incl vat.

The following policies were renewed: -

CAD Financial Regulations. Procurement thresholds updated.

Marking the death of a Senior National Figure Protocol: No changes.

Neighbourhood Plan Review Update:

This is work in progress.

Finance: Accounts for payment were approved by Council. **Highways & Footpaths Working Group Report** circulated.

The Clerk confirmed that the Vehicle Activated signs (Minute ref February 2023.154) had been delivered and the PC was awaiting installation of the supporting posts by LCC Highways

Environment & Amenities Working Group Report:

War Memorial Project update (S Grant – Clerk) Update to Cllrs circulated.

Resolved to accept the revised FCC Environment Grant offer of up to £29,026.48.

A short discussion took place and Vice Chairperson E O'Neil invited Caroline Hainsworth, a representative of Colsterworth Festival of Remembrance, to speak giving an update on CFoR fund raising activities to date. Allotments:

The Clerk thanked Cllr J Clark for being present at the allotment inspection on Saturday morning 3rd March 2024. It was noted that in general the allotments were fair to good considering the recent wet and stormy weather. Those not so good will be contacted. The Clerk will offer any vacant allotments to those on the waiting list.

Agreed to monitor the hedge along the access track on the Stamford Road allotments and establish boundary responsibilities in line with the lease agreement between the PC and Lincoln Diocese.

Nature Trail:

The volunteers continue to clear ivy from the base of the trees behind Woolsthorpe play area. The volunteers have been busy making safe fallen trees after the recent storms. Clerks Report & day to day business:

- LCC Highways confirmed that action is scheduled for the blocked drain outside number 2, Ramsey Court, Colsterworth.
- War Memorial Project. All additional information forwarded to FCC Communities for the Grant offer.
- Report of tree roots lifting the church path at St Nicholas Church, Gunby. Report made to FMS Ref 493467. 21/02/2024 Highways reported that they are not responsible for the footpath. Enquiries made with Lincoln Diocese.
- The faulty defibrillator battery for the defibrillator outside the Village Hall purchased in January 2024 has been replaced by the supplier at no cost to the Parish Council. Report Ref 491108. Action is scheduled.
- Updates from LCC ROW Reports: -Colsterworth Public Footpath No 16 - Some weld mesh will be added to the gate to deter the horses from chewing. Colsterworth Public Footpath No 17 - The step on this path will be replaced.
- The Colsterworth PTFA have advised that the old 6. shed has been taken down and the new one is expected to be installed in March 2024 to be used to store pre-loved uniforms. £500 Grant awarded by the Parish Council Agenda item 2023.108.

A mild winter's day with a gentle breeze and a welcome burst of sunshine. The perfect sort of day for the February meeting of Colsterworth WI. The first Open Meeting of the year. It was gratifying to see how many people had taken advantage of the invitation to listen to our speaker and enjoy an afternoon of WI hospitality. As they looked around the room, the tea hostesses cast an anxious glance at the laden table. Would there be enough? Of course there was, there always is. Enough and more besides. Satisfied, they set out more cups and saucers

At 2pm the bell rang, we were off. Our President, Vanessa, warmly welcomed our visitors, then introduced the speaker Mr Andrew Brown, whose subject was 'The History of the High Sheriff of Rutland'. Andrew briefly gave some details about himself. He farms in Caldicott on the Rutland/Northants border, he is a serving JP, an independent councillor and the present Chair of Rutland County Council. He has served as High Sheriff of Rutland twice. The office of High Sheriff is a direct appointment of the Sovereign. It is the oldest Royal appointment in the country.

Andrew was an entertaining and engaging speaker with that rare knack of telling a story about himself without appearing to be front and centre of the tale. Like the time he was assembling the uniform necessary for the Office. A uniform which is based on 18th century Court dress. His trip into Boots in Oakham to buy black tights was tortuous. As were his travails in his bathtub as he attempted to shave his legs prior to donning said black tights, so when he wore them he didn't look like something out of a horror movie. One of his duties involved entertaining a High Court Judge. When the Judge's office rang to ask if it was necessary to dress for dinner, Andrew and his wife decided they needed to go out and buy some matching crockery! Interspersed with all his wonderful anecdotes (I've left out the one with Prince Philip) he told of the history and development of the role. From

the first written mention in AD 690 through to the more ceremonial role of today.

The High Sheriff originally was the principal administrator of tax collectors and was responsible for delivering them to the Court of the Exchequer in London. Money was counted on a chequerboard table which is from where we get the title of Chancellor of the Exchequer today. Andrew spoke of the honour and the privilege of serving as a modern High Sheriff. During his tenure he visited every school in Rutland, he met with fire, ambulance and police personnel. He supported many charities and attended over 250 functions. We were left with impression of a man who was deeply honoured to have served as High Sheriff and was proud of the part he had played in the ceremony and pageantry of our country. After a vote of thanks by June he sat down to applause and smiles all round.

Time for tea. During the break, members and visitors chatted together, votes were cast for the Flower of the Month competition (our speaker had already judged 'a purple item' competition) and the hostesses Sue, Sandra and Rosemarie were kept busy filling up the tea cups.

Vanessa called us back together for the last part of the meeting, the business of the day. She briefly mentioned various trips and activities on offer. An opportunity to hear Prof. Jonathan van Tam speak in Spalding, a theatre trip, an introduction to croquet and a quiz afternoon amongst others. Details of all these activities are displayed on the noticeboard for members to decide whether they are interested.

The competition winners were announced. The purple item was won by Shirley with a fabulous purple feather arrangement and 2nd was Brenda with a pot of beetroot. Flower of the month was won by Rosemarie with Brenda coming second. As 4pm approached, Vanessa thanked our visitors once more and closed the meeting.

NATURAL HISTORY BULLETIN

A number of members of the Buttercup family flower early and have been regarded a "heralds of Spring". Examples are Aconites, Lesser Celandine, Wood Anemone and Marsh Marigolds or Kingcups. The last named is one of our most ancient native plants, having survived the glaciation of the Ice Ages. As its name suggests it is a plant of wet places. With the drainage of grass fields it is more likely to be seen locally in ponds. In recent years the plant, also called 'May Blobs', has flowered early. This year records sent in the second week in February were the earliest yet. They brought thee brightness of their golden yellow flowers and their shining leaves (b).




Another member of the same family, which is more likely to be recognised as a Buttercup is called Goldilocks. Found in a hedge it indicates the presence of woodland. Instead of always having five yellow petals - it seems to have not quite made up its mind. It may have anything from one to five and they may be of different sizes (a). It is a scarcer plant and it too may be found earlier in March. By the second week in March the hedgerows were brightened up with daffodils alongside snowdrops, which in the shade were not yet over. Catkins of Alder and Hazel were beginning to shrivel but Pussy Willow was at it blossomy best, shedding clouds of pollen when the sun came out. The first blackthorn in flower was on the Nature Trail and on Stamford Road. That on Old Post Lane is always later to flower. Primroses continued to flower after some first appearing in January and by the second week of March some early Cowslips were out.

Brimstone Butterflies were seen in a few gardens on the few sunny days in February but are slower to on the whole this year than in 2003. It is Queen Bumble Bees which have provided interest since the beginning of the year. Of the seven species found in our gardens just the Common Carder still to come with its distinctive ginger thorax. The Buff-tailed Bumblebee is one of the first to emerge and will continue to feed on nectar going backwards and forwards to its underground nest before retiring below having completed pollen stores ready for the next generation. The smaller workers will be about in April and Males and new Queens in May ready for a second generation. In March Mason Bees were out in sunshine, some having emerge, not from crevices in stonework, but from Bee Hotels, provided for them. In several gardens large numbers of them foraging were observed. Honey Bees, now needed more than ever were back in some gardens. Other insect observations were of Seven Spot Ladybirds emerging from shrubs where they had overwintered and Queen wasps seen at windows and, given the chance inside.

Frog spawn back in ponds, some by the first week in February, newer garden ponds first, having been quick to establish populations, but some older ponds finding no spawn laid this year. A video of mating frogs, amongst floating spawn with the croaking sound in time to the inflated pouches of the males.

Siskins seen in several gardens where they have not been seen before. There have been report from various sites in Lincolnshire of large numbers coming in. A flash of bright blue, a brief sighting of a Kingfisher to the North of Colsterworth where the banksides are suitable on the River Witham and the flow of water slower. Greater Spotted Woodpeckers continue to be regular feeders in some gardens. Rooks building nests and Blue Tits exploring sites in gardens, together with the first Spring songs were all signs of spring by mid-March. A useful note sent in on identifying Roe Deer when only a quick glimpse in car headlights is seen. The photo taken shows clearly the white rump not found in Muntjak.



TO LOOK FOR NEXT MONTH Two species we have few records of are toads and lizards so any sightings most welcome. Migrant birds include the Warblers difficult to identify these little brown jobs except by the song. The first to arrive is the Chiffchaff, named by its call. Like the Blackcap it can overwinter with us. The true sound of spring is the Willow Warbler with its sweet descending notes, with an almost melancholy sound. For many this epitomises Spring.
