Public Forum:

Cllr C Hainsworth (Chair) welcomed everyone to the meeting and invited the one member of the public present to speak. As a resident of Gunby they thanked all the Cllrs and the Clerk for the quality and quantity of the Parish Councils response to the Planning Application \$24/0568. Erection of an anaerobic digestion (AD) facility.

Clir R Chatterton followed on by saying as a new Clir they had seen how hard the Clirs and Clerk work in the background for all the villages in Colsterworth and District.

CHAIR'S REMARKS:

Chairperson Cllr C Hainsworth reminded everyone there was to be a General Election on 4th July 2024.

Lincolnshire County Council and South Kesteven District Councillors Report.

SKDC Cllr B Green Reported: -

- St Mary's Church North Witham Their communications with the Diocese of Lincoln identified that there exists a St. Mary's Trust Fund of around £6,000. Insurance is in place for the Church but expires in September 2024. They will arrange a meeting to try and constitute a Parochial Council.
- 2. Kerb side Battery Collection – SKDC are hoping for this to start in September 2024.
- SKDC Hardship Fund SKDC are urging people to 3. shop in Grantham to support the local businesses during the refurbishment of the Market Place.

SKDC Cllr D Bellamy Report: - Cllr D Bellamy held their comments for agenda item 2024.36.2,3 & 4.

- 2. Update from SKDC on the silver paper and card recycling bin which have proved an issue for some so for a limited period, to help residents, SKDC will leave a helpful yellow tag/sticker on the bin where people have mistakenly placed items which aren't accepted
- 3. LCC ROW have inspected Colsterworth Public Footpath No. 19 and found the surface to be acceptable.
- 4. Minutes from Colsterworth and District Youth Group AGM received and filed for the PC's records.
- 5. The Nature Trail Risk Assessment was carried out om 20/05/2024 with the Lead Ranger and volunteers.
- 6. The battery for the defibrillator on the outside wall of the Little Legs and the White Lion has been replaced and is again live with the ambulance service.
- 7. Notification received from LCC Parish Agreement scheme following their review of the Parish Grass cutting agreement. The result of which is an uplift to the agreed rate. The rate for 2024-25 will now be £0.058 per square meter for three cuts based on a total area of 35473m2. An increase from £3,724.67 to £6,172.30. Total increase of £2,447.63.

The Clerk met with Mo Taylor and Kev Russell of KWR Saturday 11th May, Kev Russell generously agreed to carry out the work to fell 4 trees at no cost to the Parish Council with a full Risk Assessment.

Council received details of correspondence received relating to speeding vehicles, lack of police presence, fly tipping, litter, damaged grass verges following the A1 closure and potholes. Complaint received from a resident regarding the grass cutting around the war memorial. They do not believe the grass is cut often enough to keep the area tidy and the blowers used by the contractor blows the cut grass into the flower beds and over the memorial.

They appreciate it is a contractor issue but asked if the can contractor use a box to collect the mowed grass around the memorial area only.

NATURAL HISTORY BULLETIN

In spite of cool, rainy days the end of May and the first two weeks of June found the main floral interest moving from woodland to grassland. The distinctive feature of our parishes is limestone grassland - especially where quarrying and road works have left bare ground to colonise.

This year it has spread well. Its name comes from its 'Yellow' Flowers and brown seeds developed in inflated pouches which 'rattle' when the plant is shaken.

Bee Orchids, which are found in short turf can appear unexpectedly in gardens or verges where houses and roads have been built on old, unimproved grassland. Like other orchids they're fine, dust-like seeds depend on the underground fungal

> 'mycelia' (thread-like growths) for enough food to germinate and grow. Bee Orchids live the first years of their lives as fine leaves only until enough food store produces flowers.

Suddenly they appear as if from nowhere. Two new sites were discovered

in May, one associated with the disturbance of roadworks.

Here delicate, small plants can survive because

they do not have to compete with more vigorous plants. Yellow Rattle is special because it can slow down the process of succession. It is a hemiparasite that is partially dependent on taking nutrition from the roots of other plants (in this case grasses). In this way it suppresses their growth. On the RNR (Roadside Nature Reserve at Woolsthorpe) it is recorded as far back as 2006. Its success noted, seed was sown in the Nature Trail meadow.

In a garden a search for extra floral nectaries, ants were discovered feeding on Hedge Mustard grown as an alternative food for Orange Tip Butterflies. The ants, rewarded by the nectar protect the plant, the eggs, and the emerging caterpillars on the seed pods. The illustration shows a selection of flowers from local grasslands - each with a story to tell

Fewer butterflies in the cool sunless weather but a day recording them on one of the two reserves in Twyford Wood had at least found the two 'target' species and a selection of other species regularly recorded at these very valuable sites. The caterpillars of the Brown Tailed Moth hung in protective cobweb-like netting on Woolsthorpe hedges. Mint moths reported from several gardens. A set of photos of a Garden Tiger Moth sent in. One taken mid-morning and one in the afternoon on same leaf - it's magpie markings on its forewings almost hiding its red under-wings. A third photo taken in the evening "to see if it was still there" found it was and a second one was mating with it.

A cuckoo has been heard in Twyford Wood for several consecutive Sundays by an early morning walker, but none reported to the south of Woolsthorpe as in previous years. Swifts are back, returning by 6th May. Numbers of swallows and house martins are lower and reports of nesting abandoned. Garden birds are also having limited success in producing fledglings. Jackdaws, on the other hand, seem to have thrived. As a chimney at one house was being swept the new family of jackdaws, reared in a neighbour's chimney, came and "attacked" the bristles of the brush as it appeared on the roof. Apparently, this is a regular problem for the sweep who attempts to scare them off!

To Look for in July: Butterflies. Will Meadow Browns, Gatekeepers, and Ringlets fare better? Any Painted Ladies? Birds rearing second broods. Evidence of small mammals and the predators which depend on them? Any insect swarms?


